INTERIOR DESIGNING OF TEXTILE MUSEUM OF BENGKULU AS THE EFFORT OF TEXTILE PRESERVATION IN BENGKULU

Indonesia is well-known by the richness of its different cultures among provinces, including Province of Bengkulu.
