Artificial intelligence (AI)

Artificial intelligence (AI) is a digital attempt to achieve human level intelligence using different computations of machines. It is a set of advanced technologies that allow machines to sense, understand, act, and learn from humans.

AI is no longer just an ultramodern notion; it's here right now—such as software that senses what we need, recommendation systems that recommend in real-time, and bots that respond to changes in their environment. In this century, companies are already using AI to innovate and grow fast.

Nowadays, AI and deep learning are the latest technologies that are doing much more. They are supporting humans in complex and creative problem-solving by analyzing

vast amounts of data and identifying trends that were previously impossible to detect. For more than 250 years, technological innovations have driven economic growth.

Among earlier innovations, the most critical ones are general-purpose technologies like steam engines, electricity, and internal combustion engines used in cars, trucks, airplanes, and even lawnmowers.

As technology moved fast, we now have more power in our hands than we had in our homes in the 1990s. The essential general-purpose technology of the current era is Artificial intelligence, particularly **machine learning (ML)** and **deep learning (DL)**, that is, the ability of a machine to keep improving its performance without the intervention of humans. In the past few years, ML and DL have become more efficient and widely available. We are now able to build such systems that learn how to perform tasks on their own.

Importance of AI

There are two reasons why AI is important, which are as follows:

- Firstly, we humans know much more than we can express. Also, it is indescribable how we precisely compute things, right from recognizing a small object like a needle to predicting the changes that will occur in the future. Before AI, we couldn't automate many tasks.
- Secondly, AI systems are often tremendous learners. They can achieve staggering performance in a wide range of activities including fraud detection, recommendation systems, retail analytics, computer vision, cybersecurity, and medical diagnosis. Brilliant digital learners are being deployed across the economy and their impact is going to be very intensive.

Similar to other technologies, AI has generated a lot of unrealistic capabilities. In the area of business, it has a significant impact on the extent of earlier general-purpose technologies. Although it is already in use in many companies around the world, the most fruitful opportunities have not yet been mined.

Artificial Neural Networks (ANNs) are complex models that can be used for a different type of computation inspired by the human brain. Nowadays, ANNs are used in many fields including voice recognition, image recognition, robotics, etc. resulting in much advancement in these fields. The significant effects of AI will be extended in the coming decade, as manufacturing, retail, transportation, entertainment, finance, healthcare, law, education, advertising, insurance, and virtually every other industry

transform their core processes and business models to take advantage of DL.

Capabilities of AI

Today's AI is super impressive; AI can perform various tasks that can never be possible without machine learning and deep learning. The goal of AI is to create an expert system, for example, systems that show intelligent behavior, learn, demonstrate, explain, and advise its users. Moreover, AI is meant to implement human intelligence in machines so that machines can understand, think, learn, and behave like humans. Today's AI has been able to achieve success in many areas like robotics, computer vision, and natural language processing, expert system, games, and speech recognition. Here are some examples of machines that can be successfully made using the technology of AI:

- **Chatterbot:** A chatterbot is a computer program that conducts a conversation via auditory or textual methods. Such programs are designed to engage in small talk to pass the Turing Test by fooling the conversational partner into thinking that the program is a human. Some chatterbots use sophisticated natural language processing systems, but many scan for keywords in the input and reply according to the matched keywords or the most similar wording pattern from a textual database.
- **Robotics:** Robots learn new things themselves by observing their surroundings, so they learn more things from humans and use them in a better way. It involves mechanical (usually computer-controlled devices) to perform tasks that require extreme precision or tasks that are tedious or hazardous for humans. Also, they can learn from their mistakes, and they can adapt to new environments.
- **Healthcare:** AI plays a significant role in the field of healthcare. AI-based Healthcare systems can help doctors predict the onset of a disease in a patient by comparing the medical data of the patient with historical data. Such machines can also prescribe the most appropriate medication and laboratory tests for the patient.
- **Gaming:** AI plays a vital role in games such as chess, poker, tic-tac-toe, and others, where the machine can think of the considerable number of possible turns based on heuristic evaluation.
- **Vision systems:** These systems understand, interpret, and grasp visual input on the computer. A restaurant takes photographs that are used to figure out the

particular type of food on the plates. Physicians use a clinical expert system to diagnose diseases by analyzing the MRI/Scans images. Police use software that can recognize the face of criminals with a portrait made by a forensic artist.

- **Speech recognition:** AI-based intelligent systems are capable of hearing and understanding the language in terms of sentences and their meanings. It can handle different accents, slang words, noise in the background, change in human sound due to cold, and much more.
- **Handwriting recognition:** AI-based handwriting recognition software can read the text written on paper by a pen or on-screen by a stylus. It can recognize the shapes of the letters and convert them into editable text.
- **Banking:** AI helps in the banking industry with chatbots, **anti-money laundering (AML)** tools, pattern detection, recommendation engines, fraud detection, and algorithmic trading.

So far we've discussed what is AI, its importance, and its capabilities. Now let's look at the different subparts of AI starting with deep learning.

Deep learning (DL)

Deep learning (DL) is a subset of ML and ML is a subset of AI, as shown in the following image. If we say, a car is an artificially intelligent system, then we can say that the fuel used in the car is machine learning:

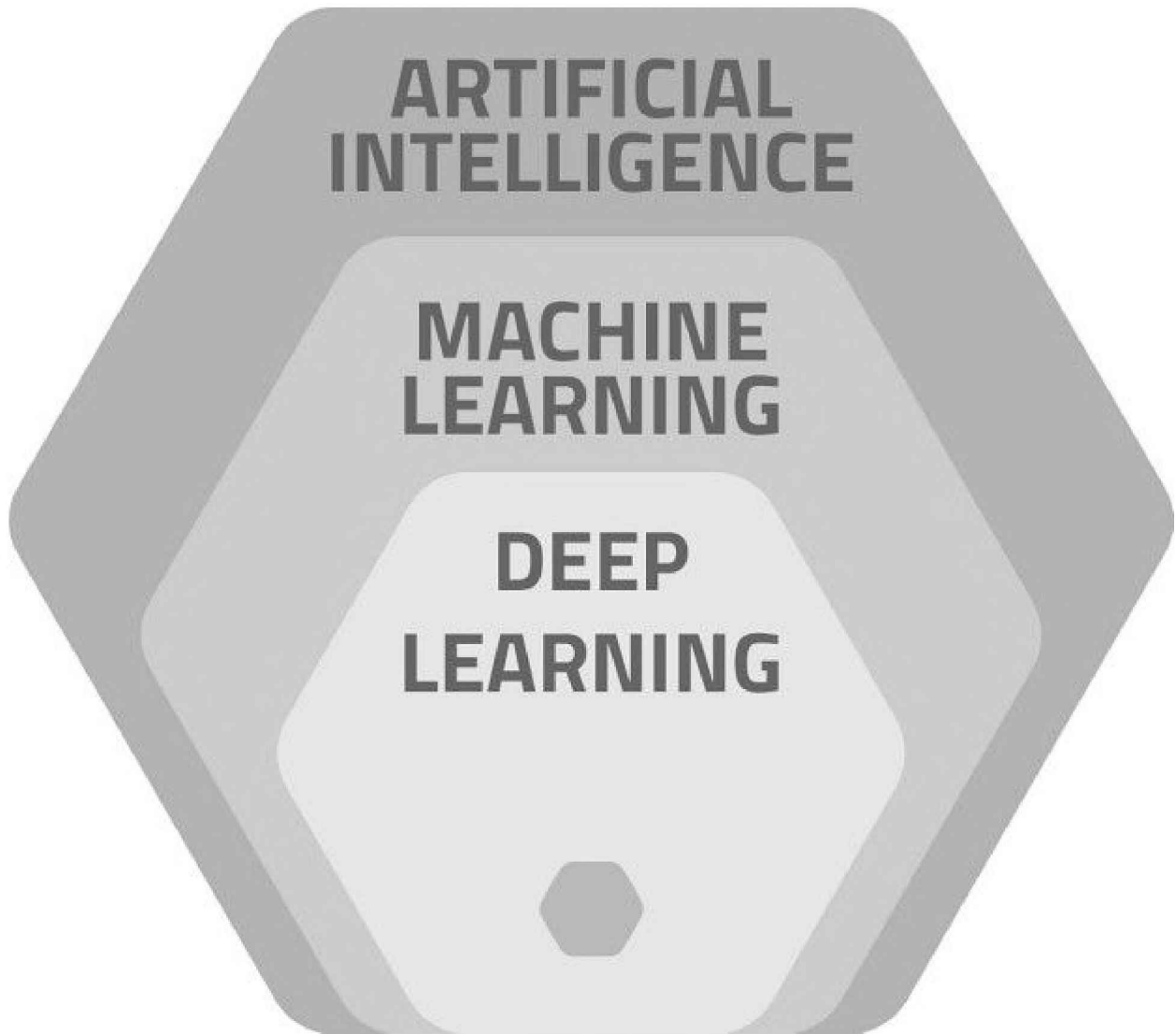


Figure 1.1: Representation of the relationship between AI, ML, and DL

DL is based on neural networks, a conceptual model of the brain. The word *deep* comes from DL algorithms that are trained/run on deep neural networks. The central concept of deep learning is the automatic extraction of representation from data. As our data often appears in the form of discrete information which needs to be joined together for it to make sense, DL and ML use this information and extract features from it to build a broad architecture. This deep architecture explains the data from lower to higher-level functions. It works in a hierarchical order. Data comes from many sources like Twitter, patient MRI/scans, social media, and sensor data in various forms:

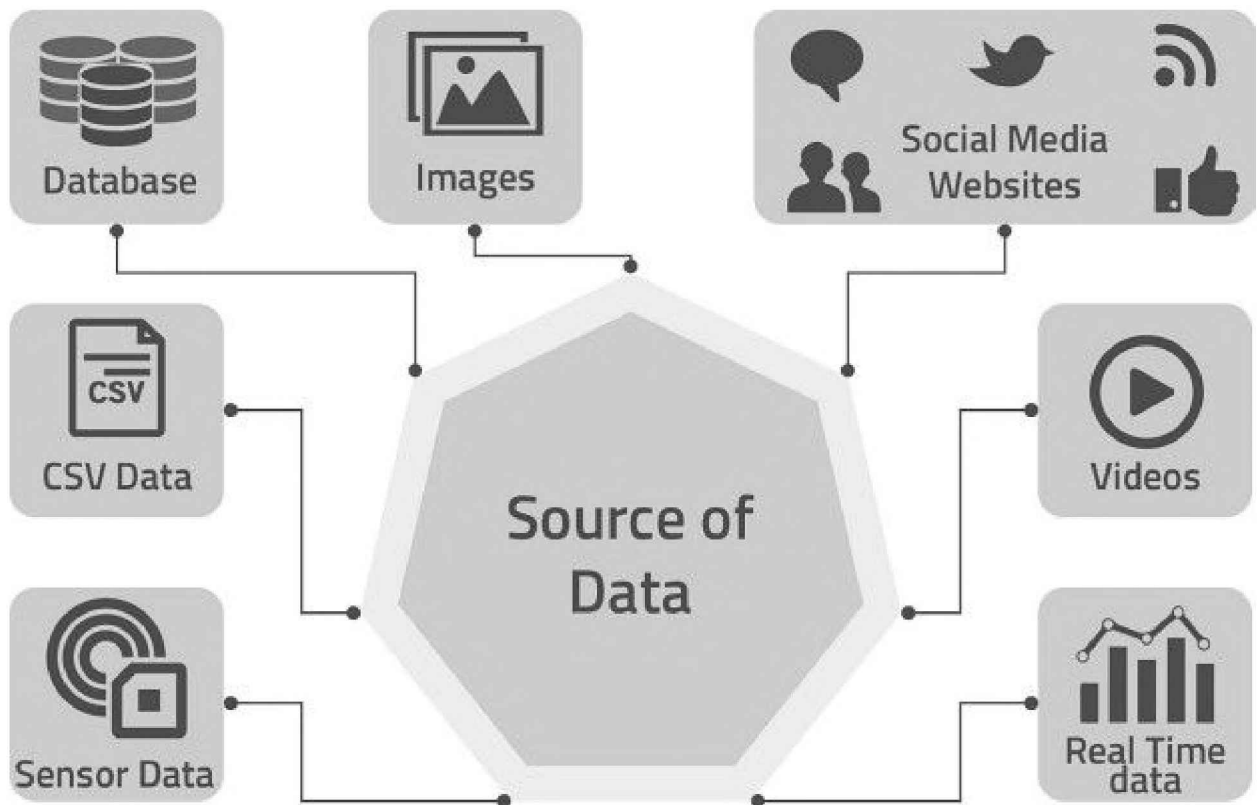


Figure 1.2: Different sources of data

Data from these data sources generate 500+ terabytes every day. Thus, there is a need for new ways that can analyze the data. To do this, modern conceptual architecture is required that can work with the massive amounts of data. In other words, it is necessary to recognize how organizations function when they are working with these large datasets. This is where DL comes from. DL algorithms are used to build a model that can extract the data from these data sources and manage it for future predictions, as well as for various other purposes.

When data gets complex, we need to look for an architecture that can handle this kind of data. With time data is turning vast and unstructured, thus an architecture is required that can manage this data correctly. DL solves all these problems. It focuses on working with complex environments.

Machine learning versus deep learning

Machine learning (ML) is a subset of artificial intelligence. DL is the subset of ML. Let us dive deep into machine learning and deep learning so that we can have a better

comparison of them.

Current scenario on machine learning

ML uses various algorithms to parse data, learn from it, and then make a determination or prediction of the problem identified. So, rather than doing hand-coding with a specific set of instructions to accomplish a particular task, the machine is trained using large amounts of data and algorithms that give it the ability to learn how to perform the task.

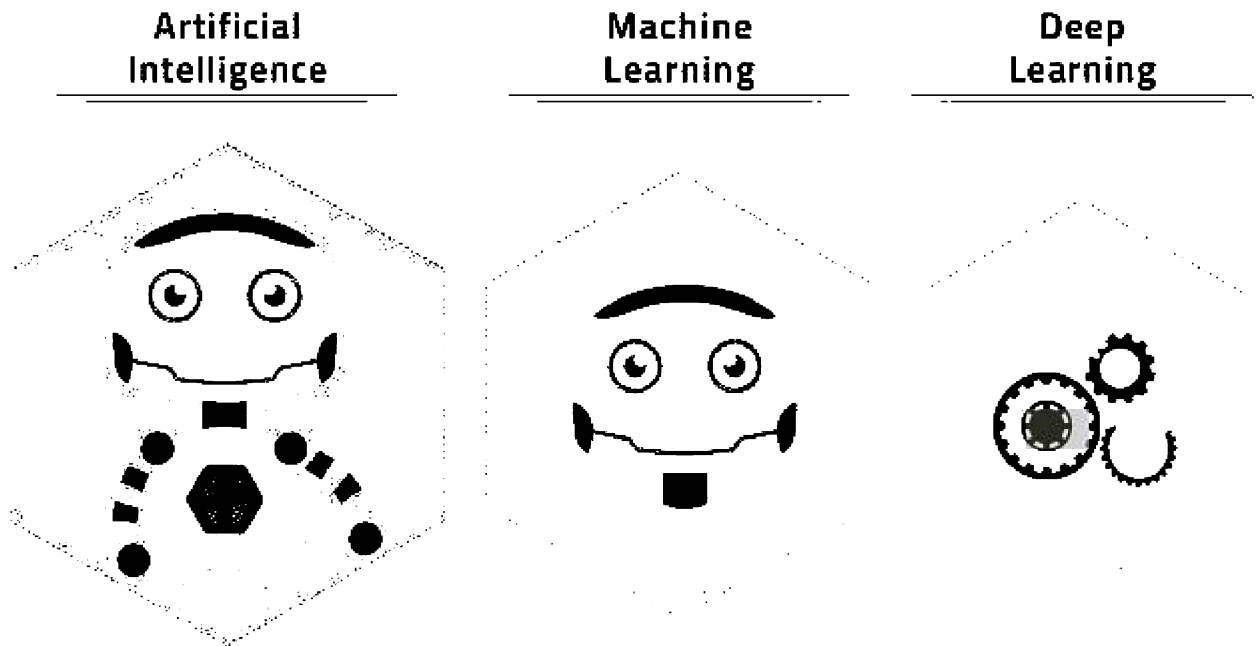


Figure 1.3: Pictorial representation of AI, ML, and DL

First of all, the machine needs to train with a vast amount of data. There are several machine learning algorithms that can do this such as the Bayesian Network, Decision Tree, and Clustering. Generally, there are three types of machine learning: supervised, unsupervised, and semi-supervised learning.

Supervised ML is used when a labeled set of features is provided. For example, if the value of x is known, then on the basis of it predict the amount of y . Unsupervised ML differs from supervised ML. In unsupervised ML, you only have to input data x and no corresponding output variables. The goal of unsupervised learning is to model the structure of the data to learn more about the data. Semi-supervised learning fits in between supervised and unsupervised learning. Semi-supervised knowledge is

used where there is a large amount of input data x and only some of the data is labeled y . An example of semi-supervised learning is when some of the images are labeled (for example, dog, cat, and person), however, the majority are unlabeled.

Machine learning uses cross-validation to select the complexity of the model. In other words, ML finds the complexity using a small part of the data, and then it tests the model on other parts of the data. Let's explore the different types of learning and their different subtypes in the next figure:

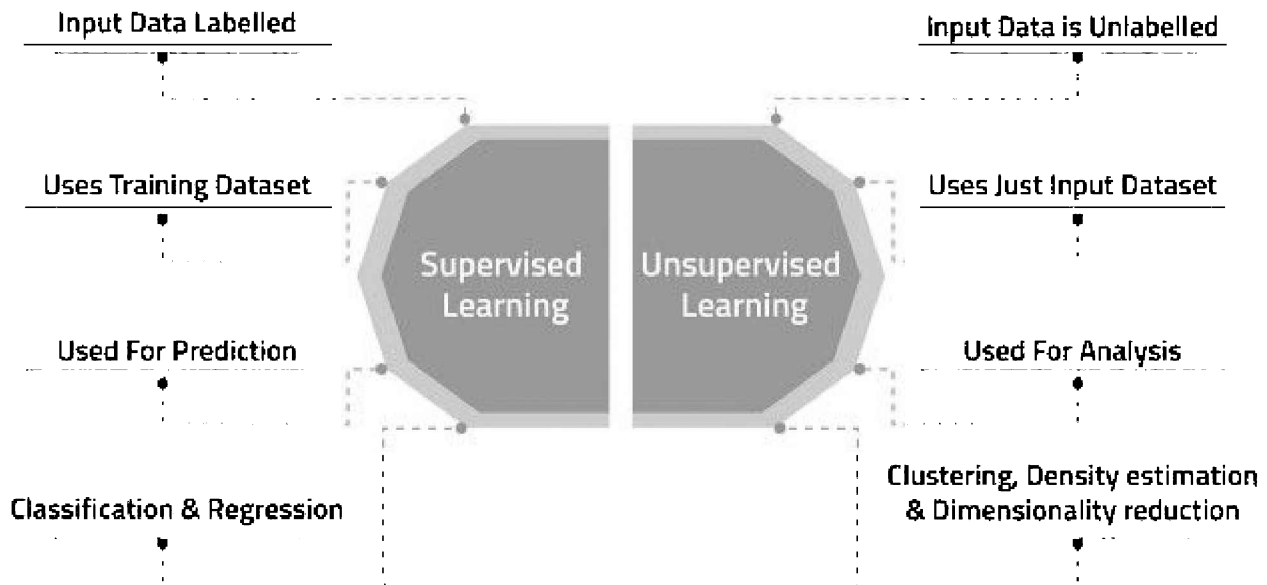


Figure 1.4: Supervised and unsupervised learning with major steps

The current scenario in deep learning

Deep learning is everywhere. It is used to determine which online advertisements to display in real-time; to identify and tag pictures of humans, food as well as animals in photos; to translate voice to text, translate text into different languages; and drive autonomous vehicles.

Deep learning is found in various places. Credit card companies use deep learning models for fraud detection in banks and also to detect whether a credit card can be provided to a particular person or not based on their historical records. Banks use transaction details of customers to detect anomalies in the financial behavior of customers and check whether loans or other facilities should be approved. Hospitals and doctors use it for detection, diagnosis, and treatment of diseases using real-time as well as historical data.

The range of applications is limitless. Other options include text analysis, image analysis, image captioning, image classification, X-ray analysis, stock market analysis, weather forecasting, object detection, finance predictions, and many more.

Deep learning is already used to improve performance, automate processes, detect patterns, and solve problems. DL is continuously improving the performance of machines with automation, pattern recognition in complex structures like proteins and gene expression, and so on.

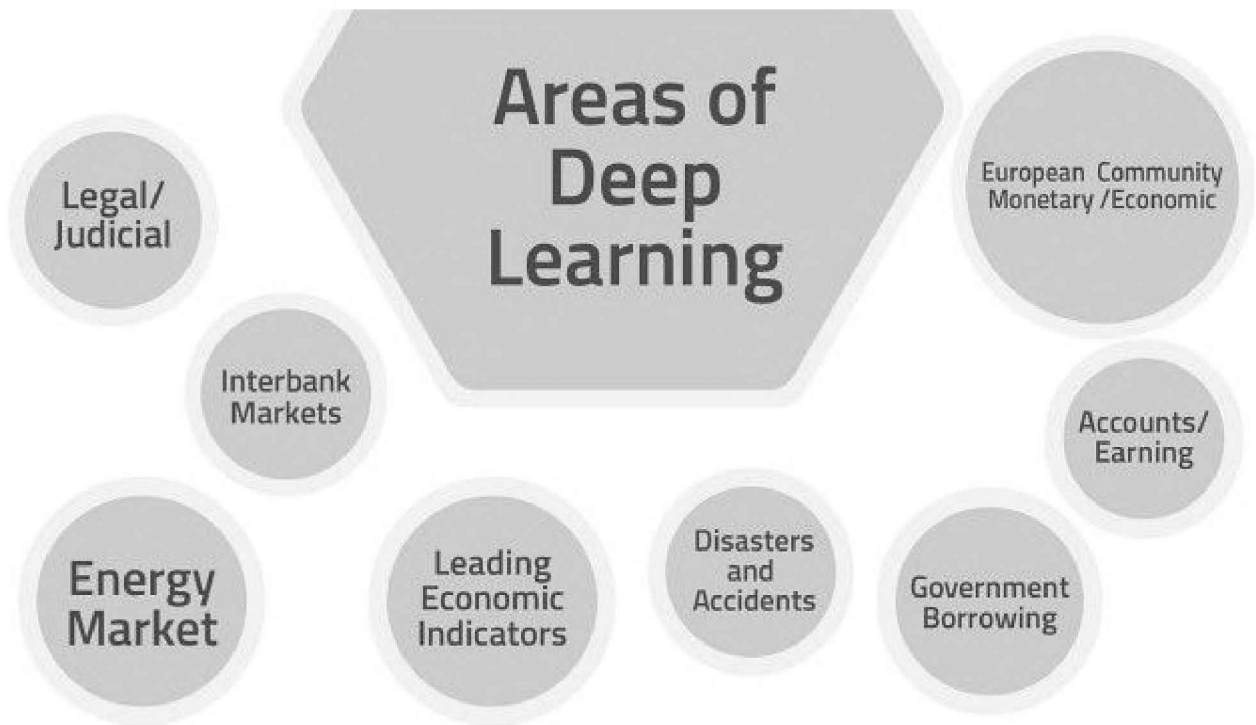


Figure 1.5: Different areas of DL

The following three factors have leveled up the potential for deep learning.

The exponential explosion of available data

A few years ago, there was a time when it was just impossible to analyze petabytes of data. The emergence of Hadoop made it possible to run analytical queries on a vast amount of historical data. We know that Big Data is a buzzword from the last few years, and modern data pipelines are always receiving data at a high ingestion rate. So this constant flow of data at high velocity is termed as Fast Data. Fast data is not just about the volume of data like data warehouses in which information is measured in GigaBytes, TeraBytes, or PetaBytes. Instead, along with measuring the amount of data

it also considers the speed of data such as MB per second, GB per hour, and TB per day. So, Volume and Velocity both are considered while talking about Fast Data.

Nowadays, many organizations are trying to collect loads of data regarding their products, services, or their organizational activities such as tracking employee behavior using various methods like log tracking and taking screenshots at regular intervals. Data engineering allows us to convert this data into basic formats, and data analysts turn it into useful results that can help companies to improve customer experience, as well as support them in monitoring and boosting the productivity of employees.

But for cases like fraud detection, log analytics, or real-time analytics, this is not the way to process the data. Imagine, there is a data warehouse like MongoDB which has petabytes of data stored in it. To do the analytics for all the above tasks there is a need to analyze historical data and predict the future.

For such cases, we first need to analyze historical data and predict the faults. It not only requires pre-processing, but it also requires a number of sequential steps that would be taken into account to make effective business decisions for the organization in real-time. It is applicable in anomaly detection, phishing, intelligence, surveillance systems, and many other areas.

Traditionally, high ingestion rate data streaming is managed by storing and processing it; later, this data is taken for further analysis to predict the results and give impacting inferences. But organizations are looking for platforms where they can look into business insights in real-time and act upon them in real-time.

The rise of the Graphics Processing Unit (GPU)

During the '90s, application performance and database throughput were directly proportional to the number of CPUs and available RAM. As these factors are essential to achieving the desired performance of enterprise applications, a new processor was introduced, for example, **Graphics Processing Unit (GPU)**.

With the rise of deep learning, GPU now powers many intelligent use cases like autonomous cars, tumor diagnosis, computer vision, recommender systems, speech recognition, etc. Deep learning works on mathematical and statistical computations. **Artificial Neural Networks (ANNs)**, **Convolutional Neural Networks (CNNs)**, and **Recurrent Neural Networks (RNNs)** are the modern implementations of deep learning. Every type of neural network such as classification, clustering, and prediction is used with use cases. For example, **Natural Language Processing (NLP)** uses RNNs,

while image recognition and face recognition use CNNs.

For instance, a simple image consists of a large matrix of numbers. During the training phase of deep learning, the matrices of these numbers are used as input to the neural network. By training the neural network with thousands of images of a face of a person, the model can quickly recognize a person in a picture. This training process is a correlation of multiple pixels (numbers) to find patterns of faces. The relationship works by multiplying billions of matrices with each other to generate the right result. To increase the training speed, all these operations need to be done in parallel.

CPUs are designed to handle calculations in a sequential order, which means each operation has to perform at its priority and also has to wait for the previous activities to complete. So, to implement the processes in parallel, there is a need to build a processing system that can run processes in parallel. Hence, graphical processing systems were introduced that can handle many operations at a time and perform parallel computation in much less time.

The invention of advanced algorithms

The applications of deep learning in the modern world are vast. Various application fields include speech recognition, learning based on historical data, face recognition, autonomous cars, medical sciences, stock predictions, insurance, and many others.

With the invention of advanced algorithms and computer vision concepts, it became effortless to make a real-time model that helps in facial recognition and speech recognition. Also, deep learning is used to improve NLP tools to understand the meaning of a complete sentence and not just individual words, for example, summarization of text, and identifying sentiments of the person through tweets.

Deep learning and Big Data

In the time of the **Internet of Things (IoT)**s and mobility, with a massive volume of data becoming available at a fast velocity, there must be a need for an efficient analytics system. Also, the variety of data is coming from different types of sources in different formats such as sensors, logs, and structured data from an RDBMS.

In the past years, the generation of data has increased as more applications are being built, and they are generating more data at a faster rate.

Earlier, storage of data was costly, and there was an absence of technology which could efficiently process the data. Now, the storage costs have become cheaper, and the

availability of technology to transform Big Data has become real.

Technology-oriented companies such as Google, Yahoo, Microsoft, and Amazon have collected and maintained data that is measured in Exabyte. Also, social media companies such as Facebook, YouTube, and Twitter have millions of users who continuously generate large amounts of data. So, there is a need to analyze this data and produce meaningful results according to the business requirements that can be helpful for decision making.

In addition to analyzing the vast amount of data, there are other challenges such as collection and framing of data, handling unlabeled data, noisy and poor quality data, unsupervised, and uncategorized data. So, here the concept of DL algorithms plays a significant role. These algorithms can automate the system to ingest a massive amount of unlabeled data and automatically extract complex representations.

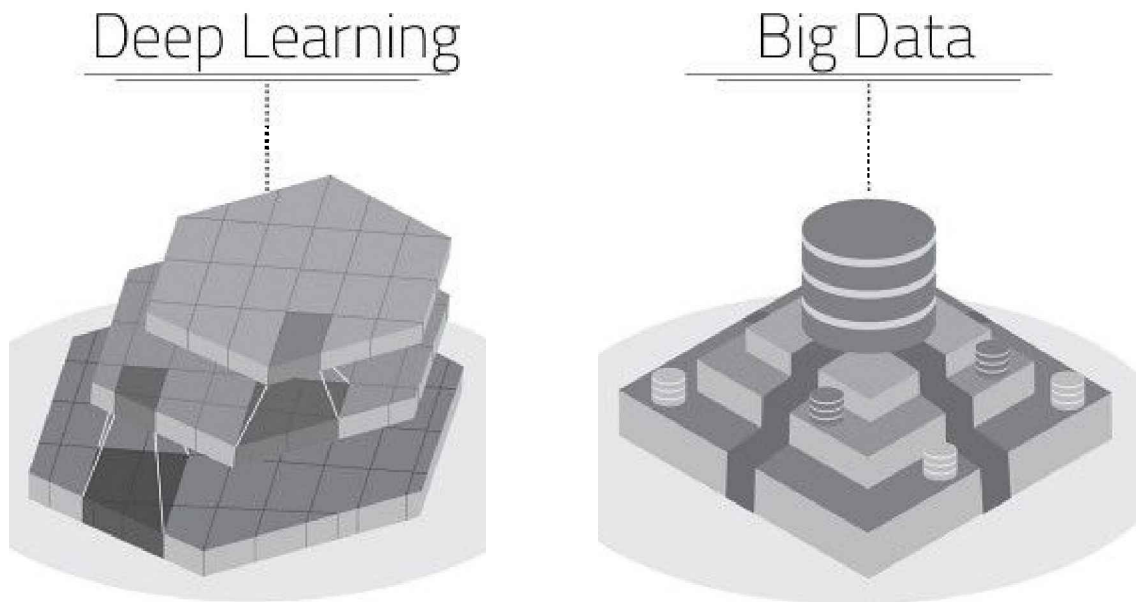


Figure 1.6: Architecture representation of deep learning and Big Data

Deep learning algorithms are architectures of consecutive layers. Each layer works hierarchically, for example, pixels in an image are fed to the first layer, and the output of each layer is provided as input to its next segment.

For instance, in a face detection model, by providing some images of faces as input to the DL algorithm, at the first layer the model can train itself by learning the edges in different orientations. In the second layer, the model uses these edges to learn about more complex features like different parts of a face such as lips, nose, and eyes. In the

third layer, the model uses these features to learn even more complex features like different shapes of faces. In the end, the final representations can be used as useful information in applications of face recognition.

Introduction to Artificial Neural Networks (ANNs)

Artificial Neural Network (ANN), computational models based on the essential working of the human brain, changed the whole game of pursuing technology. With the emergence of ANN, now tasks like voice recognition, robotics, and image recognition do not seem to be out of reach. The most significant advantage of ANN is the capability of mapping biological methods in technical ways. It can be understood as a sizeable interconnected web of artificial neurons that can perform specific tasks. These tasks can be specific such as classification, clustering, and pattern recognition.

The single neuron of humans

In a neural network, the basic unit which performs any computation is a neuron. It receives input from other neurons or some external source and computes an output accordingly. Each information has weight (w) associated with it, which is assigned by its relative value to other data. The node applies a function f to the weighted sum of its inputs.

The output from the neuron can be defined as:

$$\text{Output } (O) = f(w_1.X_1 + w_2.X_2 + b_1)$$

Where b_1 is a bias and f is non-linear function and is described as the Activation Function.

The primary purpose of the activation function is to introduce non-linearity into the output of a neuron. Bias is used to provide every node with a trainable consistent value. The typical nerve cell of the human brain is as shown in the following diagram:

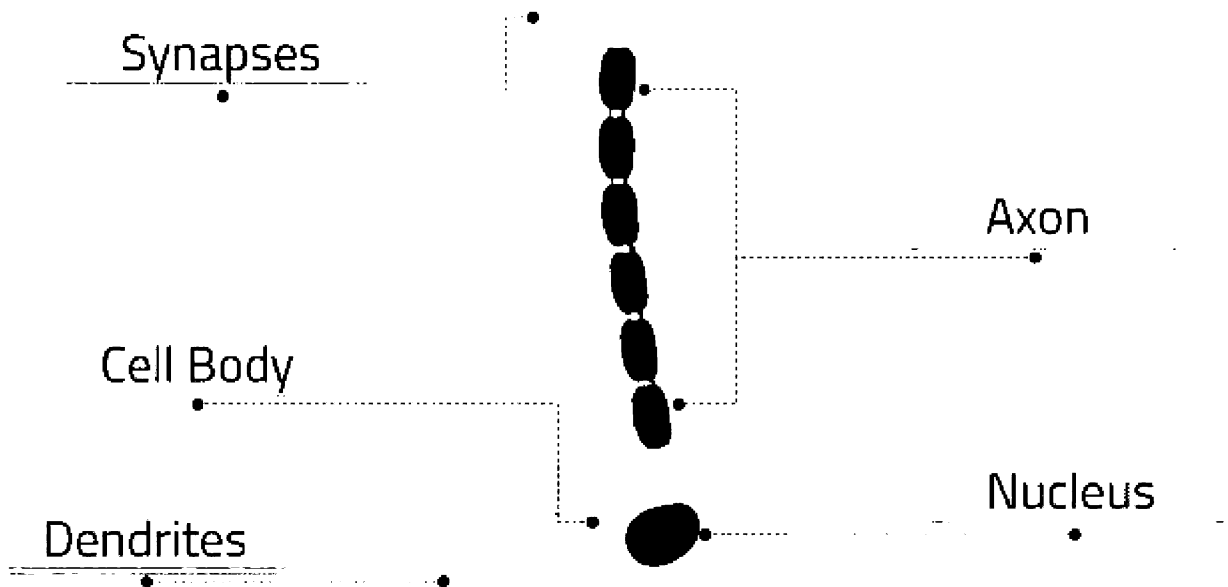


Figure 1.7: Human neuron and its different parts

A human neuron consists of four parts:

- **Synapses:** It can be considered as an internal connection between two neurons. In simple words, you can define it as the quantity of signal transmitted, which is calculated using the weights of the connections.
- **Axon:** It can be understood as the firing mechanism of the signal. When the sum calculated surpasses a specific threshold, the neuron fires the signal, which then travels down to the other neurons.
- **Soma (cell body):** It aggregates all the incoming signals to produce the input.
- **Dendrite:** It performs the task of receiving signals from other neurons.

The following table presents some of the significant differences between ANN and BNN:

There are two main similarities between neural networks and the human brain:

- Similar to the human brain, neural networks also gain knowledge using learning.
- The connection strengths are used to store the knowledge of the neuron network, and these are known as synaptic weights.

The comparative similarities between BNN and ANN are as follows:

- In ANN, the weighted inputs based on synaptic interconnection can be considered as equivalent to dendrites in the BNN.
- The neuron unit of ANN can be compared to the cell body of BNN, which is composed of summation and threshold unit.
- In the case of ANN, the output unit can be compared to Axon of BNN.

From the above facts, it is clear that ANN is modeled using the principles of BNN:

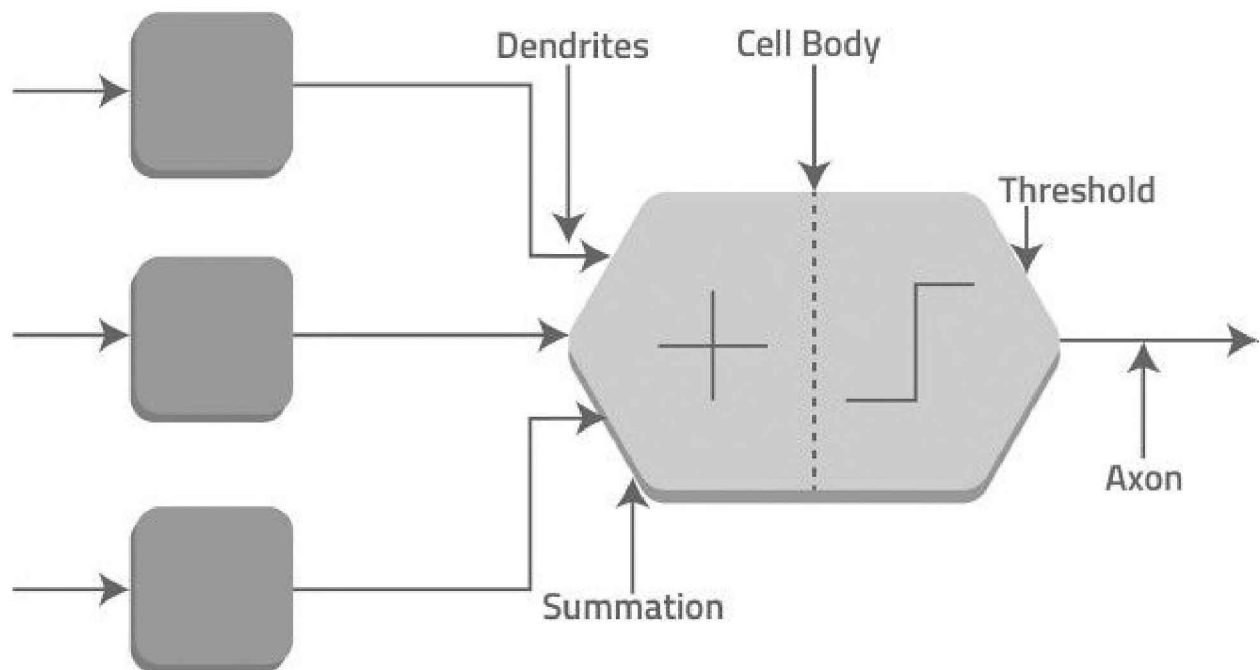


Figure 1.9: Artificial neuron with its different parts

Detailed working for ANN

ANNs are weighted directed graphs that consist of nodes, which are artificial neurons. The connection is established between neuron inputs and neuron outputs using directed edges with which weights are also attached. Let's have an overview of the weighted ANN graph and its layers:

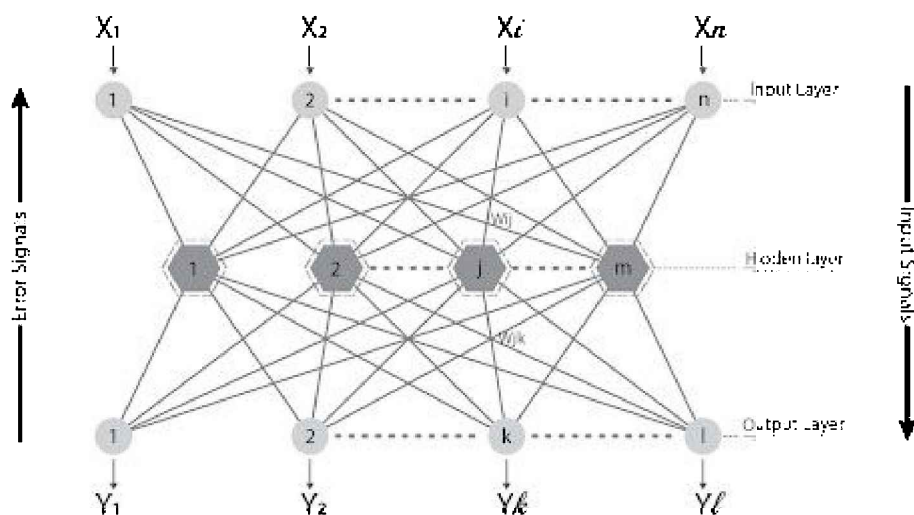


Figure 1.10: Weighted graph of ANN with neurons and its layers.

ANN has the following computational subparts:

- **Weights:** Weights can be understood as the information or knowledge which can be used by the neural networks to provide a solution to a specific problem. Technically, these are the strength of the interconnection between neurons which are situated inside a neural network. The corresponding weights are multiplied with each input respectively
- **Bias:** Bias consists of the information and weights, which is always taken as 1. Technically, inside the computing unit, all weighted data are aggregated. If there is a case when the weighted sum is zero, the bias is used to make the output non-zero by some addition of constant value or for scaling up the system response.
- **Activation Function:** This function is used to get the required output. The output sum from the above is passed through function, and to put up a limit at the arrival of the desired value a threshold value is set up. There are many types of activation, such as linear functions (which is further divided into binary and sigmoid) and nonlinear functions (for example, hyperbolic sigmoidal functions). Some of the activation functions are explained here:
 - **Sigmoidal hyperbolic:** This function has an S-shaped curve. Here the hyperbolic function is used to approximate output from net input. The function is defined as $f(x) = 1/(1 + e^{-\sigma x})$ where σ - steepness parameter.
 - **Binary:** The output has only two values, for example, 0 and 1. For this, the threshold value is set. If the net weighted input is greater than 1, the output is assumed 1 otherwise 0.

ANN architecture

In the architecture of ANN, the neural network consists of many smaller units known as artificial neurons which are arranged in the following series of layers:

- **Output layer:** The prime function of this layer is to respond to the information according to the learning of a particular task. These responses come from the units described above.
- **Input layer:** The function of this layer is to import input as data into the network. On this data, the system starts learning, recognizing, and performing different types of processes.
- **Hidden layer:** This layer lies between the input and the output layers. The

function of this layer is to change the information into a format that can be used by the output progressively.

In most of the neural networks, the input layer is fully connected to the hidden layer, and the hidden layer is fully connected to the output layer:

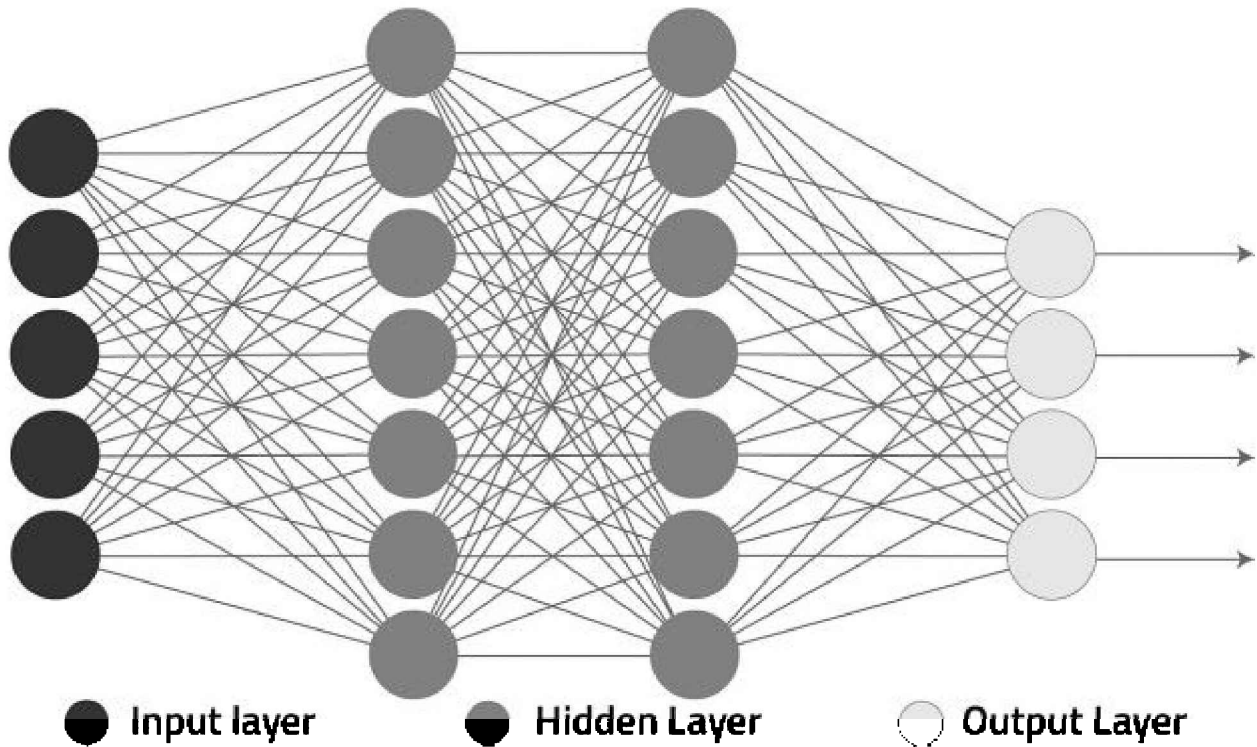


Figure 1.11: Representation of the different layers of ANN

Types of neural networks in AI

There are several types of ANN. Based on the human brain neurons and network functions, an ANN executes tasks similarly. The different types of ANNs are as follows:

Neural network architecture types

Artificial Neural Network is the network that clones the functions of the human nervous system artificially. There are different types of artificial neural networks. These networks are developed using complicated mathematical functions and calculations which use a set of parameters to yield the output.

Here's a brief introduction of different kinds of neural networks:

- **Perceptron model in a neural network:** This type of system is considered to be the simplest type of neural network. It consists of one output unit and two input units with no hidden layers, thus it is also known as single-layer perceptrons.
- **Multilayer perceptron neural network:** The difference between the perceptron model and this model is that it has more than one hidden layer of neurons. For this reason, it is also known as deep feedforward neural network.
- **Radial basis function neural network:** These networks share most of the similarities with the feed-forward neural network. The significant difference is the use of radial basis function, which is used as the activation function of these neurons.
- **RNN:** This type of neural network consists of a self-connection between the neurons of the hidden layer. This functionality provides them a temporary memory. As a result, activation of the following value is forwarded from the lower layer as well as its previous activation value to the hidden layer neuron.

- **Long Short-Term Memory Neural Network (LSTM):** This is a subtype of a recurrent neural network. In it, the memory cell is embedded in the hidden layer neuron.
- **Hopfield network:** In this type of neural network, each neuron is connected with each of the other neurons, thus it is considered to be the fully connected network. A value of neurons to the desired pattern is fixed to train the system with input patterns. After that, the computation of weights takes place.
- **Boltzmann machine neural network:** This network shares the similarity with the Hopfield network; the significant difference is that some neurons are input whereas others are hidden in nature. In it, the initialization of the weights is a random process in which learning takes place using the backpropagation algorithm.
- **Modular Neural Network:** It is the combination of a structural type network that consists of different types of networks such as RNN, multilayer perceptron, Hopfield network, and other types of networks which are combined to form a single module.
- **Physical neural network:** This type of neural network ANN is adjusted electrically using resistance material to functionalize the synapse instead of any software simulations.

As mentioned earlier, there are so many similarities between the functioning of the human nervous system and artificial neural networks. There are different types of networks based on mathematical functions and set of parameters which are required to export the output. Some of the different kinds of neural networks are:

- **Neural network perceptron model:** These types of models have two input units and one output unit. In these networks, hidden layers are absent, thus they are also known as single-layer perceptrons.
- **Neural network based on radial basis function:** They share similarities with feed-forward neural networks except they have radial basis function, which is used as the activation function of these neurons.
- **Multilayer neural networks:** They are made of more than one layer of hidden neurons and also known as deep feedforward neural networks.
- **RNNs:** The advantage of these types of neural networks is that they have a unique ability to possess memory. These networks have this ability because of the interconnections between the neurons of the hidden layers. For this reason,

they have to receive activation from the previous activation as well as from the lower activation function.

- **Long Short-Term Memory Neural Network:** This is a particular type of Recurrent Neural Network. In this network, a memory cell is situated under hidden neural networks.
- **Hopfield network:** These types of neural networks are considered to be fully connected, which implies that each neuron is fully connected to every other neuron. For training the system, the value of neurons is fixed according to a specific pattern on which neurons of input layers are trained. After that, weights are calculated. It is different from other neural networks
- **Boltzmann machine neural network:** These networks share similarities with the Hopfield network but have a very slight difference; some neurons are input, while others are considered to be hidden in nature. The backpropagation algorithm is used to provide learning and weights are initialized randomly.
- **Modular neural network:** These types of systems can be considered as a mixture of different kinds of neural networks such as Hopfield, RNNs, and other types of neural networks. These networks are moduled into a single network to perform different independent tasks.
- **Physical neural network:** These types of neural networks consist of electrically adjustable resistance material and used to emulate the synapse function in the place of any software simulations presented in neural networks.

The next figure talks about the different architecture of the neurons:

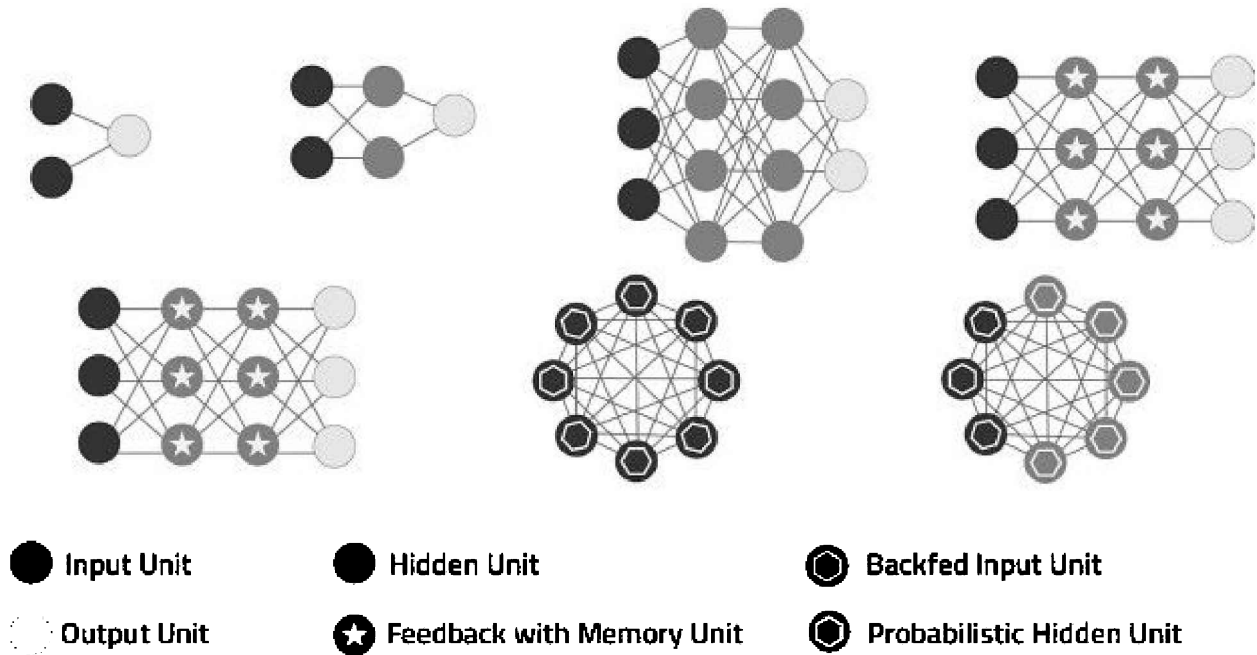


Figure 1.12: Different architecture types of neurons

Algorithmic problem-solving approach

In the previous sections, the basic concepts of deep learning, artificial intelligence, and their various applications were discussed. In this section, we will discuss an algorithmic approach to solve problems in a deep learning system with the deep learning algorithm. The following diagram shows a typical workflow for using deep learning in predictive modeling, which we will discuss in the following subsections:

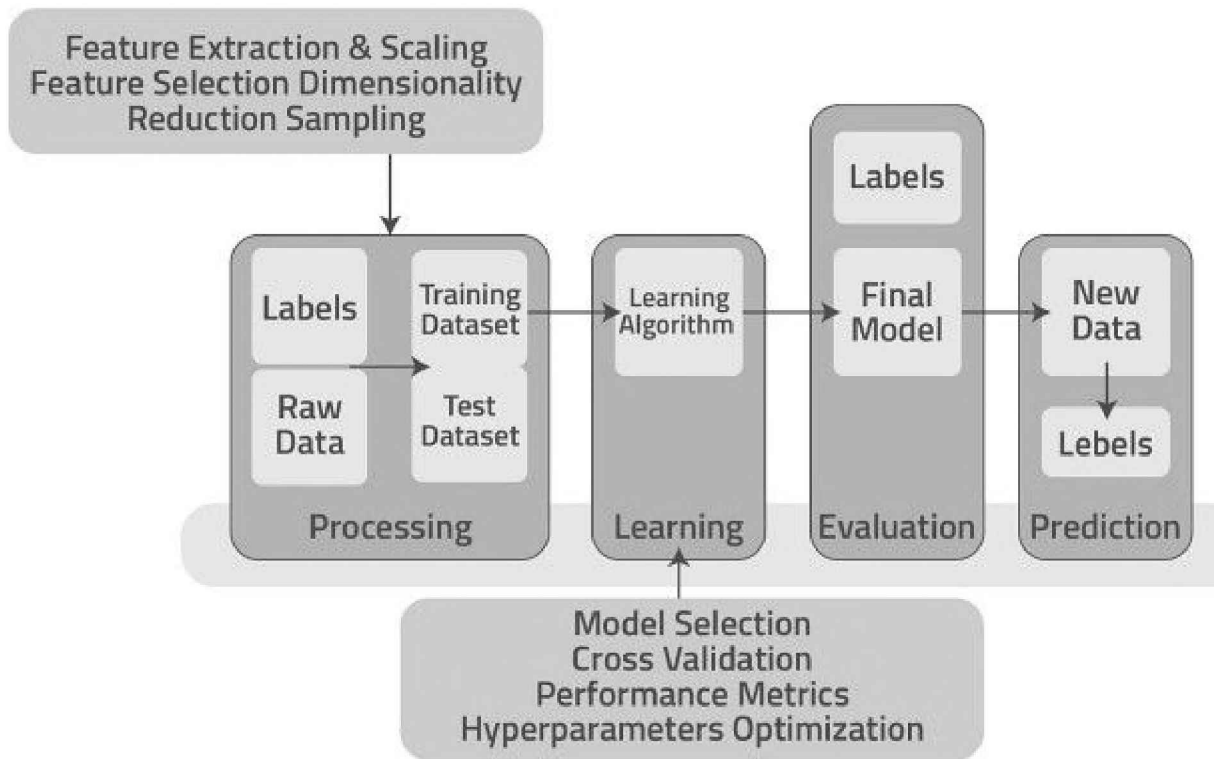


Figure 1.13: Flow of the approach used for solving the problem with different steps

Preprocessing

Raw data comes in various forms from multiple sources like IoT devices, social media, and health-care data. Most of the data is considered unstructured data. To get useful results from this unstructured data, there is a need to convert this data in such a form that can be used to make future predictions. At first, it must undergo Pre-processing that makes the data ready for further applications.

Let's take an example of the crack detection system in which there is a need to detect whether a plate is hot or not and also check if there is any crack in the dish. In the image dataset, the raw data consists of various images of plates and the requirement is to extract meaningful features.

Useful features can be the filename of the image, height, and width of an image, the name of the object, X and Y-coordinates of the purpose, the ID of the object, and so on (cracked areas).

Dimensionality reduction

While dealing with real-world problems and actual data, note that sometimes data is high dimensional with a million records. This high dimensionality of data can be reduced using one of the techniques, for example, **Principal Component Analysis (PCA)**.

Scaling

Normalization is a scaling technique. It is also known as a mapping technique or a pre-processing stage. By using this, one can find the new range from an existing range. It can be beneficial for prediction or forecasting purposes. There are many ways to predict or forecast, but all can differ from each other. So, to keep the significant variation of prediction or forecasting, the normalization technique is required to make them closer.

Feature selection

The success of all the DL algorithms depends on how data is presented or whether the required features are extracted from the dataset. The following figure shows the various steps of feature extraction:

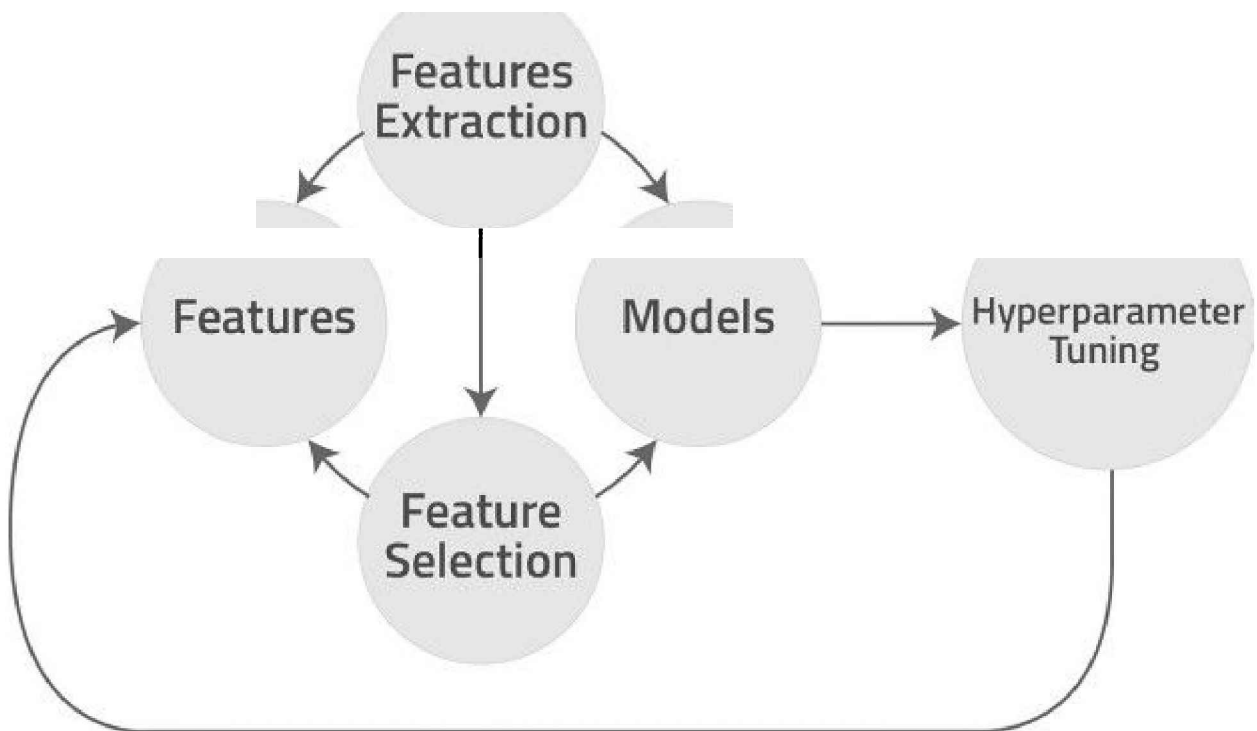


Figure 1.14: Different steps of Feature Extraction

Things to keep in mind while selecting features are as follows:

- Find covariance among the features and decide one out of likely related functions for the prediction.
- **Hyper-parameter features:** These features are created using a combination of two or more elements (the model performs operations to verify the received features; this process is repeated in a loop until the model gets satisfactory results).
- **Training and selecting a deep learning model:** As many deep learning models work based on availability, requirements, and form of data, to make an accurate prediction:
 - There is a need to choose such a model that fits the data.
 - It generalizes well to unseen data.

Now, the question that may come to your mind is how to find the most suitable and best-fitting model on available data and real-time data as well?

Model selection

The selection of an appropriate model for the problem is very significant to predict good results. Things to keep in mind while choosing any algorithms are as follows:

- **Accuracy:** To achieve better results from the model it is necessary to determine the extent of approximation of results of the obtained model. With this approach, the processing time increases. This approach also allows implementing the model by avoiding overfitting.
- **Training time:** The number of hours to train the model also plays a vital role in determining the selection of the model. It is directly related to the accuracy of the obtained model. On the other hand, some of the algorithms are dependent on the number of data points.
- **Linearity:** It is one of the assumptions which are followed while implementing the machine learning model. It states that a straight line can separate the classes.
- **Number of parameters:** It is the backbone of the model. The number of parameters affects the working of the model. Therefore, a large number of

parameters for the model will require more time and trial to achieve an excellent combination of the model. The main advantage of having an optimized number of parameters is that it shows that the algorithm is very much flexible in a problematic point of view. It is also observed that with the use of an increased number of parameters, the requirement of time for training the model grows exponentially.

- **Number of features:** It is also considered in the decision of model selection. In some aspects, the number of features may be more extensive in number as compared to the number of data points. This can be observed in the case of textual datasets.

There are various algorithms that can be used for a particular type of task which are explained with the help of the following figures and some points after that. The following diagram representing the same:

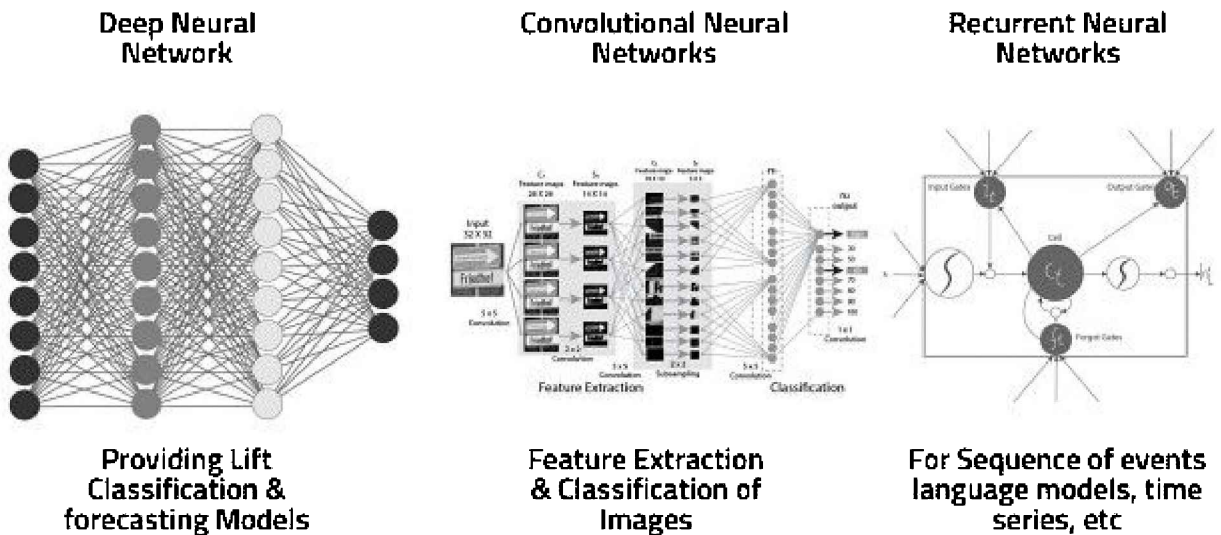


Figure 1.15: Different types of Networks with their different layers

- **Deep neural networks:** The deep neural network is helpful in classification and forecasting models.
- **Convolutional neural networks:** Convolutional neural network is used in feature extraction and image classification.

- **Recurrent neural network:** Recurrent neural network is helpful for a sequence of events and time series.

Cross-validation

It is a statistical method used to evaluate and compare learning algorithms by dividing the data into two segments: one used to learn or train a model, and the other set is used to validate the model.

For example, let's say someone wants to find a statistical model that predicts the price level of houses based on the previous day's prices. If one can achieve an accurate prediction based on that data, then it is easy to say that the model and feature selected for that task can generate actual results.

Using cross-validation, the user can estimate the test error of the particular learning method, and secondly, they can select the optimal flexibility of the chosen learning method to minimize the errors associated with bias and variance.

Performance metrics

Metrics are used to measure and compare the performance of algorithms. Various metrics such as confusion matrix and the area under the ROC curve can be used to check the accuracy of predicted results.

Hyperparameter optimization

Hyperparameter is used to detect the approximate time required to train and test a model.

Evaluation of model and predicting patterns

After the selection of a model that fits well on the training dataset, the next step is to apply that model on the test dataset to predict patterns. If it generates satisfying results, the selected model can be used to predict new data.

For example, let's take the example of hot plates in which the objective is to detect whether the plate is hot or not and detect cracks in a plate. The dataset contains images of plates, and the task is to identify the area on a plate where there may be a crack:



Figure 1.16: Real image of hot plate with crack

Various steps of collecting data are as follows.

Collection of data

1. The data is present in the form of **.jpg** images. Therefore, to detect the object from the image, there is a need to annotate the images, i.e. labeling the required object in the image so that the machine could learn which object has to be recognized.
2. Various tools are available to interpret images such as **Labellmg** and **Labelme**. To annotate in the form of the exact polygonal image we will use the Labelme tool, as the Labellmg tool is used to interpret the objects in the form of a rectangular box. For annotation, firstly open Labelme Annotation tool and log in the account. Then create the collection where the images are uploaded (maximum 20 images are uploaded at a time). Draw a polygonal boundary around the required object on the image. After drawing the boundary, name the label and save both **.jpg** and annotation files. Therefore, with the use of Labelme tool, images are interpreted and saved in the form of XML files.
3. After that, in order to fetch the points of the required detected object from images, the mask is generated using OpenCV to find contour function:

4. It is observed that the number of images is not sufficient for the implementation of object detection. Therefore, the number of images is increased with the use of data augmentation method. Many operations are available using the **Augmentor** Python library. Augmentor is a Python library to perform the augmentation and artificially generate image data for machine learning and deep learning tasks. With the use of Augmentor Python library, the pipeline is developed by specifying operations. Execute the pipeline and save all the results in the specified path of the directory.
5. The few functions are as follows:

Preprocessing of data

1. From the above-obtained XML files, points are fetched using for loop and the received result is stored in the form of the CSV file.
2. After that, it is observed that object detection API does not work on polygonal points; it only works on the rectangular bounding box. Therefore, there is a need to convert polygonal points into the rectangular bounding box. It is performed using planar library and bounding box function. Here's an example:

3. Then, we observe that the information regarding image height and image width is missing, however, it is necessary for implementing an object detection module. Therefore, the PIL library is used to fetch it. The example is given as follows:

Preparation of data

1. After the preprocessing of data, it is split into train and test dataset in the ratio of 80% and 20%.
2. After that, both train and test dataset are converted into **Tf.record** file. **Tf.record** file is the format of the Tensorflow framework which it uses as input for training the model. **Tf.record** creates the bounding from points fetched on the image.

Training of data

First, install the object detection API of Tensorflow.

1. Make the directory named as **data** where models are downloaded:

What is data science?

The term data science is commonly used in modern times, but what is the real meaning of data science? What are the main requirements to practice data science, and what are its main uses in the different fields of business? These are some questions that will be answered in this section.

Data science can be understood as a combination of various tools, algorithms, and machine learning techniques that emphasize on discovering patterns that are hidden

in the layers of raw data.

It is an area of study that relies on the combination of expertise in domain, programming, math, and statistics; this combination is used to export substantial information from the data. Let us discuss some primary uses of data science.

Usage of data science:

- Data science can be used to develop high-precision risk assessment models for businesses; these models can be used to make the business robust.

Challenges faced by businesses

Uncertainty

A small business faces a wide variety of challenges. Besides handling issues of employees, sustaining the quality of product or service, and keeping the wealth flows positive, administrators get stretched in multiple directions. The most delicate part of business management is that it's difficult to know in advance what comes up next. Therefore, uncertainty is one of the most critical issues faced by small enterprises. The types of risks faced by small businesses are as follows:

The overall development process of the model is divided into six phases that are shown in the following diagram:

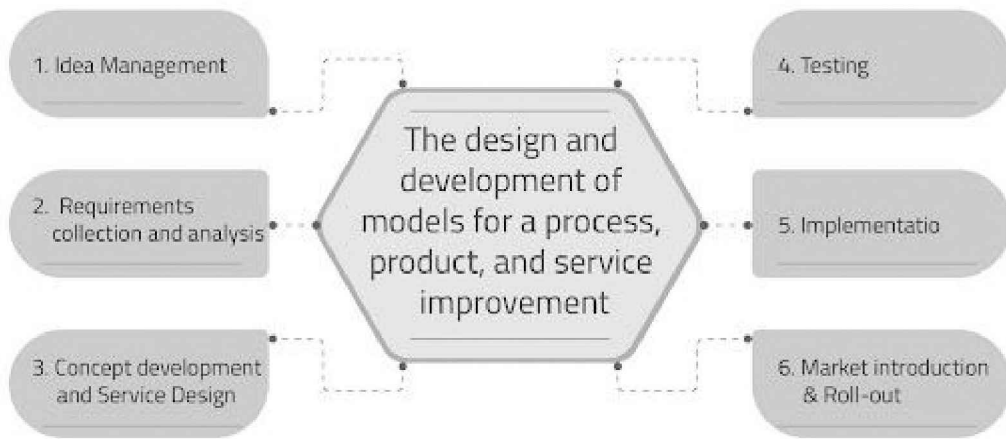


Figure 2.2: Overall development process of models is divided into six phases

Information that is new or seems unlikely and plans that appear irrelevant may be either excluded or not get retained in memory because of their weak associations with the problem.

Artificial intelligence models give structure and shape to information and make it easy to remember, comprehend, and build on our ideas. They can also highlight gaps in collected details, help to predict the consequences of our planned actions, and stimulate the senses. AI models give ideas for better solutions to people.

Many problem-solving tasks can be developed in a state space. A state space consists of various states of the domain and a set of operators that can change from one state to another.

The rules can be described as nodes in a connected graph and the operators as edges. Individual nodes are represented as destination nodes, and a problem is said to be solved when a path is found from the initial state to a destination state. State spaces can get various search methods that control the search efficiency appropriately.

To solve a problem, the strategy that should be followed is described with the following steps:

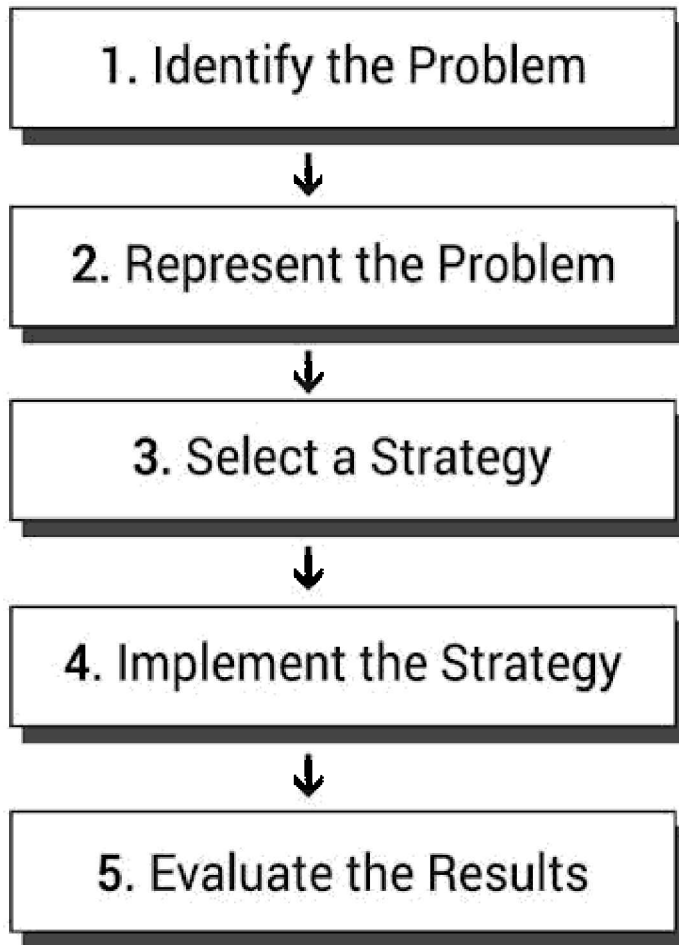


Figure 3.1: Steps to solve a problem

The following steps can be followed to resolve a problem:

1. **Identify the problem:** Identifying a problem is the most challenging task of problem-solving because of the obstacles that need to be overcome. When looking back, a challenge and a solution may seem obvious, but that does not mean they were apparent at the beginning. To identify the problem, the following obstacles should be overcome:
 - **A detailed search for a problem:** To identify any problem, one has to go into the depths of the problem. A detailed search of the problem is required to overcome the challenges.
 - **Relevant background knowledge:** To identify a problem, one must be familiar with the topic of research.

- **Take time to reflect on the problem:** Expert problem-solvers spend significantly more time thinking about the problem compared to amateurs and do not give up when the going gets tough. They do not view problem-solving as a time-limited activity.
 - **Think divergently:** Divergent thinking means to think at a broader level and look at problems in new ways. Try to avoid solutions that may not seem to match the challenge.
2. **Represent the problem:** Some problems have a limited number of possible solutions while continuing problems can usually be solved in a large number of ways. The most effective solution for analyzing a problem involves the identification and collection of relevant information and representing it in a meaningful way. A detailed analysis of the problem helps to identify all the possible causes and confirm the real reason.
 3. **Select a strategy:** Several possible strategies may be used to solve a problem such as algorithms, heuristics, trial and error, and so on.
 - **Algorithms:** An algorithm is defined as a set of step-by-step procedures that provide the correct answer to a particular problem. The use of an algorithm helps to solve a problem or make a decision that yields the best possible solution. Algorithms are used in such a situation where accuracy is critical or where similar types of problems need to be solved frequently. In such cases, computer programs are designed to speed up this process. Data needs to be placed in the system so that the algorithm can be executed to come up with the correct solution. Such step-by-step approaches of algorithms can be useful in situations where each decision must follow the same process and where accuracy is critical. Because the process follows a prescribed procedure, one can be sure that they will reach the correct answer every time.
 - **Heuristics:** A heuristic is a mental shortcut method that allows people to make judgments and solve problems quickly. Our past experiences typically form these mental shortcuts and enable us to act quickly. However, heuristics are more of a rule of thumb; they don't always guarantee a correct solution. For instance, a physician, while deciding to treat a patient, could use an algorithm approach. But this would be a very time-consuming task, and patients need treatment immediately. In this case, the doctor would rely on their expertise and past experiences to

promptly choose the right treatment method. Another instance, suppose a customer purchases three items at a store at these prices— \$9.95, \$29.98, and \$39.97. Now, if one is to calculate the total amount of money spent. The fastest way to do this is to round off the prices. Thus, the first item costs about \$10, the second about \$30, and the third about \$40; therefore, the customer spent about \$80 on shopping. Rounding off is an excellent heuristic for quickly arriving at approximate answers to mathematical problems. Problem-solving algorithms and heuristics are specific to the particular type of problem domain. But there are several general problem-solving heuristics that are helpful in a variety of contexts:

- **Identify the subgoals:** By breaking a large and complex task into two or more specific subtasks, it can be easier to complete.
 - **Jot down points:** Draw a diagram; list a problem's components; or jot down important points, potential solutions, and approaches.
 - **Draw an analogy:** Determine an analogous situation and derive potential solutions from the analogy.
 - **Brainstorm:** Generate a variety of different possible approaches or solutions. Once a list of approaches or solutions has been created, evaluate them for their potential relevance and usefulness.
 - **Incubate the situation:** Suppose a problem remains unresolved for a few hours or days. In this case, we must allow some time for a broader search for productive approaches.
- **Trial and error:** A technique called trial and error can solve some complex problems. Trial and error are typically good for issues where a user has multiple chances to get the correct solution. However, this is not a proper technique for problems that don't give you numerous opportunities to find a solution.

For instance, trial and error is not useful in situations such as defusing a bomb, or while operating on a patient. In these situations, a small failure can lead to a disaster. Trial and error is used best when it is applied to cases that give the user a sufficient amount of time and safety to come up with a solution. The trial and error method is not considered the best method of finding a solution, nor is it a method for detecting all possible solutions. It is just a problem-solving technique that is used merely to find

a solution. One of the advantages of this technique is that it does not require the user to have a lot of knowledge. However, it may require a significant amount of patience. Trial and error is typically used to discover new drugs, and it also plays an essential role in many scientific methods.

- **Implementing the strategy:** Taking a decision and making a decision are two different things. After carefully planning the project, the next step is to start the project implementation i.e. the fourth phase of the project management. The implementation phase involves putting the project plan into action. A process needs to be followed to accelerate the ability to learn and implement an algorithm manually from scratch. The more the algorithms you apply, the faster and more efficiently will you achieve results.
4. **Accuracy:** During this phase, the automated system/application and IT solution move towards the production status. The process of implementation depends on the characteristics of the project and the IT solution. If necessary, data needs to be converted and trained for use. The operations and maintenance of the system are also done during this phase. From a security perspective, the system must be certified in the production environment during the implementation phase. The following steps need to be considered during implementation:
- **Select the programming language:** Select the programming language that the user wants to use for the implementation. This decision will be implemented using APIs and standard libraries during deployment.
 - **Select algorithm:** The algorithm that you want to implement from scratch needs to be selected. Try to be as specific as possible, meaning always choose a particular description or implementation that you want to implement, along with a class and type of algorithm.
 - **Select the problem:** Select a problem or a set of questions you can use to test and validate the implementation of the algorithm.
 - **Research about the algorithm:** Locate books, websites, libraries, and more to read and learn about the algorithm. There is a need to have one keystone description of the algorithm. This becomes useful because the multiple perspectives will help you to start the algorithm description faster and overcome roadblocks arising from ambiguities or assumptions.
5. **Evaluate the results:** Although essential, the follow-up phase is often neglected.

During this phase, everything is arranged for successful completion of the project. Examples of activities in the follow-up phase include providing instructions and training for users, maintaining the result, and evaluating the project. The central question in this phase is when and where the project ends. The limits of the project should be considered at the beginning of a project so that it can be closed in the follow-up phase once it has reached those boundaries. Suppose, the project eventually produces excellent results. The team delivers a piece of software that works well in the testing phase, but when it is installed on the computers at a destination place, the prototype begins to have problems, and it sometimes gets unstable. For this reason, programmers should be able to repair the software.

Design and development knowledge representation

So far, we have discussed general problem-solving methodologies; now let's look at knowledge representation and reasoning, which are essential aspects of any artificial intelligence system and any computer system in general. In this section, we will discuss the classical methods of knowledge representation and reasoning in AI:

- **Knowledge representation and reasoning:** Artificial intelligence is a system that deals with the study of understanding, designing, and knowledge representation to computers. In any intelligent system, the description of knowledge is assumed to be an essential technique to encode that knowledge. The primary objective of an AI system is to design programs that can provide information to computers that can be helpful for interaction with humans and which can solve problems in various fields that require human intelligence.
- **The AI cycle:** In general, all AI systems have the following five components:

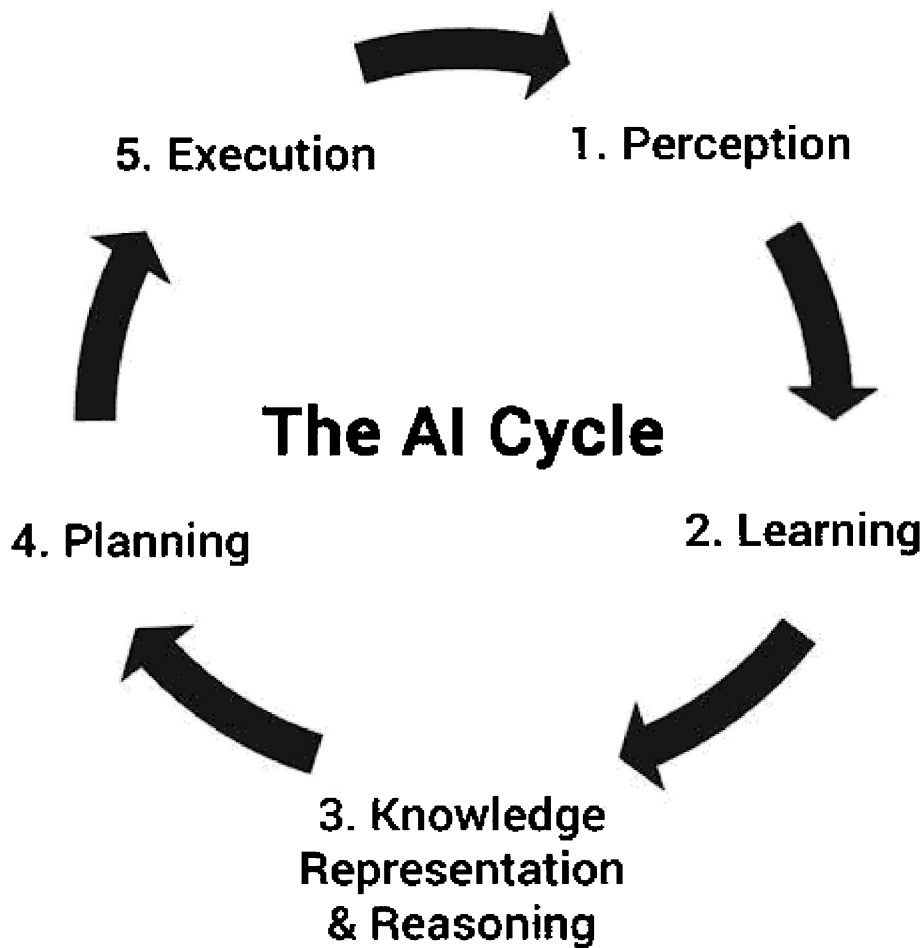


Figure 3.2: The AI cycle

The AI cycle shows the relationship between these components. The perception component of the AI system allows the system to collect information from the environment. With human perception, this may be audio, visual, or any other form of sensory information. The system must internally form a meaningful and useful representation of this collected information. This knowledge representation can be static, or it may collaborate with a learning component that is adaptive and predict trends from the perceived data.

Knowledge representation (KR) and reasoning are coupled with each other. Any description of knowledge is not meaningful on its own; it must be useful and helpful in achieving specific tasks. The same information can be represented in many different ways depending on how users want to use that information.

For example, in mathematics, if we're going to solve problems about statistics, we

would most likely use regression models; but we can use other models too. Both can generate the same results, but the former model may be more suitable in scenarios where the user wants to perform reasoning on the information. So, it is essential at this point to understand how knowledge representation and reasoning are interdependent components; as an AI system developer, one has to consider this relationship when dealing with any solution.

In other words, we can say that knowledge is information about a particular domain that can be used to solve problems. Solving many problems requires knowledge in detail, and this knowledge must be represented in some manner. While designing an algorithm to solve problems, we must define the rules that show how the instructions will be represented. A representation specifies the form of knowledge. In general, there is a need to consider a set of rules that represent knowledge about relationships in the world and learn to solve the problem using the content of the rules.

Types of knowledge

Knowledge is a practical or theoretical understanding of a domain. In general, knowledge is more than just data; it consists of facts, beliefs, heuristics, ideas, rules, associations, abstractions, and relationships. The types of knowledge are explained below:

- **Procedural knowledge:** Procedural knowledge is a representation in which the control information that is necessary to use the knowledge is enclosed in the knowledge itself, such as computer programs.

For example, consider the following:

Woman (Engineer)

Woman (Software Engineer)

Company (XenonStack)

$\forall x: \text{Woman}(x) \rightarrow \text{Company}(x)$

The knowledge base justifies any of the following answers:

Y=Engineer

Y=Software Engineer

Y=XenonStack

We get more than one value that satisfies the predicate. If only one value is needed then the answer will depend on the order in which the assertions are observed during the search for a response.

- **Declarative knowledge:** This is a statement in which knowledge is specified but the method of using that knowledge is not given, for example, people's names, colors, and so on. These are facts that can stand alone and are not dependent on any other knowledge. So to use declarative representation, there is a need to have such a program that explains what to do with the knowledge and how to use that knowledge. Declarative learning refers to acquiring information that one can declare. For example, the population density of a particular place is a declarative piece of information.
- **Meta-knowledge:** Every domain such as computers, mathematics, science, or engineering is constituted as a knowledge object. The field that generates knowledge is particularly important for learning. The experience of a domain is called *meta-knowledge*. In other words, we can say that meta-knowledge is knowledge about knowledge, for example, the knowledge that blood pressure, pulse rate, or hemoglobin level is more important to diagnose a medical condition than eye color or height, and so on.
- **Heuristic knowledge:** Heuristic knowledge depends on the rule of thumb. It generates information based on a rule of thumb, which is helpful in guiding the reasoning process. In this type, knowledge is represented on essential strategies to solve problems through the experience of past problems by an expert. However, it is also known as shallow knowledge.
- **Structural knowledge:** Structural knowledge is the information that is based on a description of structures and their relationships such as rules, sets, concepts, and relationships. It provides the information necessary to develop the knowledge structures and the overall model of the problem. For example, think of the way various parts of an airplane fit together to make the airplane, or knowledge of structures with regards to concepts, subconcepts, and objects.

Representation

Multiple approaches and schemes come to mind when we begin to think about representation:

- **Pictures and symbols:** Pictures and symbols are the earliest way humans represented knowledge when sophisticated linguistic systems had not yet evolved. Every type of representation has its advantages. Various types of knowledge can be best described using pictures; for example, we can easily represent the relationship between employees in a company using an image.

Also, we can use a series of images to store procedural knowledge. As we can see, pictures are suitable for recognition of tasks and representation of structural information. However, pictorial representations are not useful in transmitting information to computers because computers cannot interpret pictures directly without complex reasoning.

- **Graphs and networks:** Graphs and networks help to find relationships between objects/entities to be incorporated; for example, we can use a graph to show employee relationships.
- **Numbers:** Numbers are an essential part of knowledge representation used by humans. One can easily translate numbers into computer representations.
- **Knowledge representation:** This is an area of AI that aims at the representation of knowledge by using symbols to facilitate inference from those knowledge elements, creating new features of knowledge. Knowledge progression shows how data is moved through many phases, as shown here:

Knowledge Progression

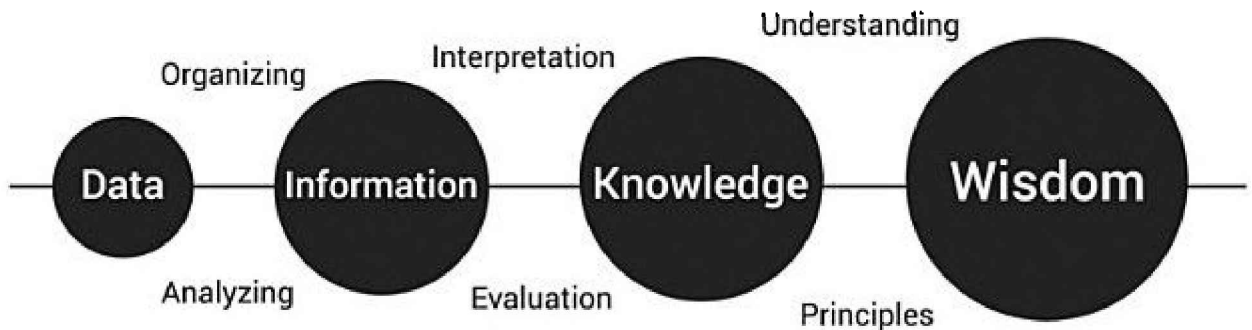


Figure 3.3: Representation of knowledge progression

The different phases of knowledge progression are explained below:

- Data is the collection of disconnected facts, for example, it is raining.
- Information appears when relationships between facts are established and understood, such as who, what, where, and when. For example, when the temperature dropped to 16 degrees, it started raining.
- Knowledge appears when relationships between patterns are identified and

understood, such as how. For example, if the humidity increases and the temperature drops, the atmosphere is unlikely to hold on to moisture, thereby increasing the possibility of rains.

- **Wisdom is the peak of understanding.** It uncovers the principles of relationships that describe patterns such as why. For example, it encloses the understanding of all the interactions that happen between rain, air currents, evaporation, temperature gradients, changes, and raining.

Knowledge engineering

Knowledge engineering is the process of designing an **expert system (ES)**. It consists of three stages:

- **Knowledge acquisition:** The process of collection, elicitation, analysis, modeling, and validation of knowledge from experts through interviews and observations by human experts.
- **Knowledge representation:** Selecting the most applicable structures to represent knowledge such as lists, sets, object-attribute, value triplets, scripts, decision trees, and so on.
- **Knowledge validation:** Testing that the knowledge of the ES is correct and complete.

Expert system designers can use different elements to represent different kinds of knowledge. Knowledge representation elements could be primitives like rules, frames, semantic networks and concept maps, ontology, and logic expressions. These primitives may combine into more complex knowledge elements.

Whatever elements they use, experts must structure the knowledge so that the system can efficiently process it and humans can easily identify the results.

Representation techniques

For permitting the development of large and technical knowledge bases, representation of languages should have a single focus that facilitates knowledge evolution in exploration and validation. In this section, we will discuss various knowledge representation techniques. Let us understand the various representations of knowledge one by one.

Knowledge representation using predicate logic

Predicate logic is a programming language with rules for syntax and semantics. The syntax consists of well-formed formulas that include logical symbols, predicate and function symbols, term, method, and sentence. Semantics means the meaning of a name or equation, that is, a set of elements. The meaning of a phrase is a truth value. The function that maps a formula into a set of components is called an *interpretation*. An interpretation maps an intentional description into an extensional description.

First-order logic extends propositional logic in two directions:

- It provides an inner structure for sentences that are viewed as relations between objects or individuals.
- It provides a means to express and reason with generalizations.

In predicate logic, there are three additional notations:

- **Terms:** First-order logic is used to represent objects or individuals. Terms can be a constant for a specific object, such as A, B, C, John, Blue, Green, and so on; variable for an unspecified object, such as x, y, z, and so on.; and functions for a specific object related in a certain way to other objects, such as Mother Of, Size Of, or color.
- **Predicates:** Predicates define a relation that binds two elements to have a value of true or false. A predicate can take arguments, known as terms.
 - A predicate with one argument expresses a property of an object, for example, a company (Xenon).
 - A predicate with two or more arguments indicates a relation between the objects for example likes (John, Navdeep).
 - A predicate with void arguments is simple proposition logic.
- **Universal Quantifier:** A Universal Quantifier is used to identify the scope of a variable in a logical expression. For example, *Universal Quantifier of $\forall x (Q(x))$* means for all x, Q of x is true. For example, $\forall x (\text{intelligent}(x))$ if the universe is of people then this means that everyone is intelligent.
- **Existential Quantifier:** The statement Existential Quantifier of $\forall x (Q(x))$, means there exists at least one x for which Q of x is true. For example, $\forall x (\text{Intelligent}(x))$, if the universe is of people then this means there is at least one intelligent person.

Knowledge representation using semantic net

The semantic network is an alternative to predicate logic in the form of knowledge representation. The knowledge can be stored in the form of a graph, with nodes representing objects and arcs representing relationships between those objects. The semantic network is also known as *associative network*.

The semantic representation consists of 4 parts:

- **Lexical:** Lexical element represents symbols that are allowed in the description of vocabulary, like, nodes denote objects; links denote the relation between objects, and link-labels denote particular relations.
- **Structural:** It describes constraints on how the symbols can be arranged, for example, the way by which different nodes are connected to each other by links.
- **Procedural:** It specifies the access procedures, such as to create, modify, and answer questions. The types of procedures are constructor procedure, reader procedure, writer procedure, and erasure procedure.
- **Semantic:** It builds the way of associating the meaning. For example, nodes and links denote application specific entities.

Let's discuss the concept of semantic networks in AI by using the stored entities of the network objects and their relationships:

- They need to represent English sentences.
- Edges will be annotated with descriptors or relations.

Here is a semantic network widely used to represent sentences, for example:

- A canary can sing/fly.
- A canary is a bird/animal.
- A canary is a canary.
- A canary TEMP has skin.

The following diagram illustrates the semantic network:

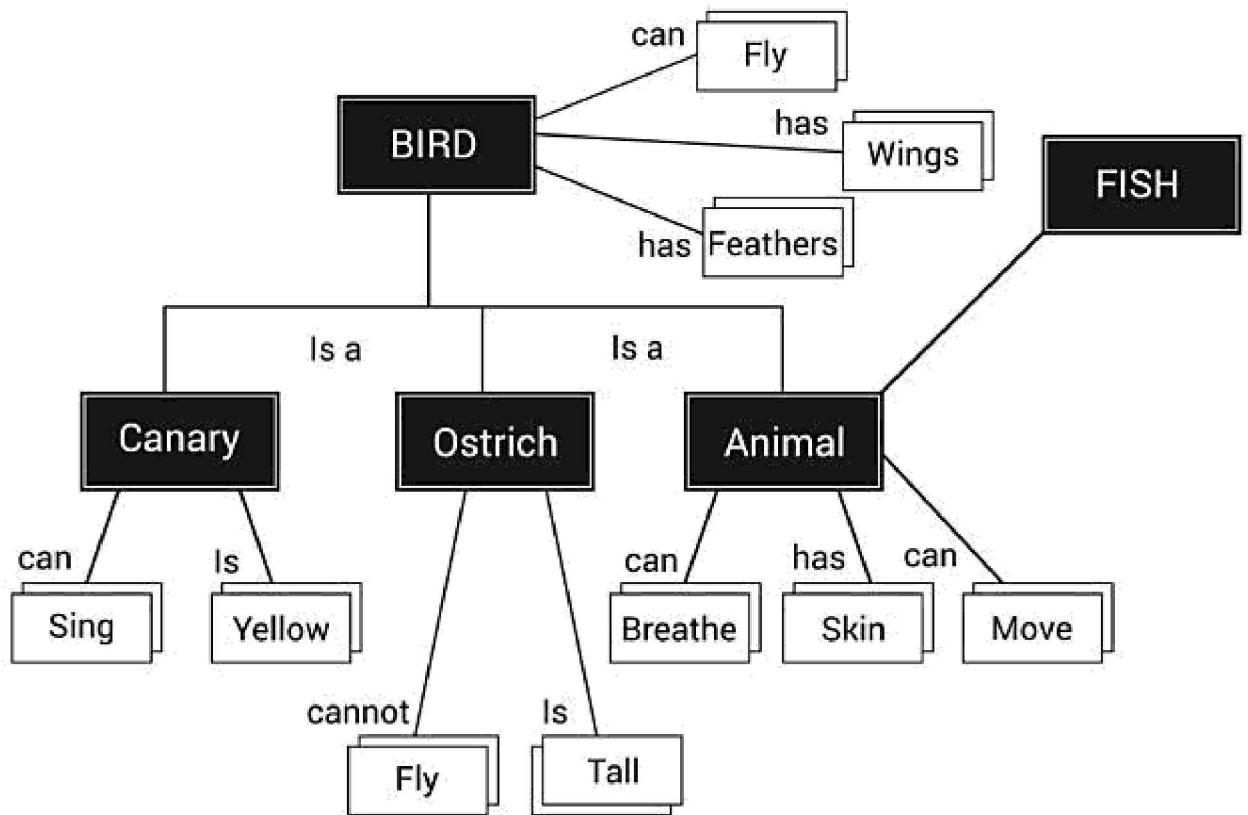


Figure 3.4: Example of semantic networks

Semantic network has the following properties as shown in *Figure 3.4*:

- **Is a:** It is a class/subclass.
- **Instance:** The first object is a class instance.
- **Has:** It contains or has a physical property.
- **Can:** It has the ability to do something.
- made of, color, texture, and so on

Knowledge representation using frames

A frame is a node with the structure that facilitates the differentiation of the relationships between objects and properties of objects. Sometimes it is also called as slot-and-filler representation. Frames are the application of object-oriented programming for expert systems.

Frames overcome the constraints of the semantic network that differentiates the

relationships and properties of objects. Each frame represents a class or an instance. The concept of a structure is represented by a collection of slots. Each slot describes an appropriate attribute or operation of the frame. Slots are also used to store values. A slot may contain a default value or a pointer to another frame, a set of rules or procedures by which the slot value is obtained.

A script is a precedent that consists of tightly coupled expecting-suggesting first action and state change frames. It is a structured representation describing a sequence of events in a particular context.

Knowledge representation using scripts

Scripts are useful in the prediction of unobserved events. As compared to scripts, a frame has relatively more knowledge about a particular object, location, activity, situation or another element. A frame can describe the object in great detail. The script, on the other hand, is a knowledge representation of the schemas that describe a sequence of events instead of defining an object.

Scripts are used for the following purposes:

- Interpret, understand, and reason about scenes.
- Understand and reason about events.
- Reason about actions.
- Plan actions to complete tasks.

A script is composed of scenes, props, actors, events, and acts. In each scene, one or more actors can perform actions. The actors act along with the props. The script represents a tree or network of states, driven by events.

As with frames, scripts drive interpretation by suggesting the system what to look for and where to look at. A script can predict events.

Let us take an example of a hotel script in which we define various features like scene, actors, props, acts:

- **Scene:** A hotel with an entrance, reception, tables, and chairs.
- **Actors:** The diners, chefs, and servers.
- **Props:** The table setting, menu, tables, and chairs.
- **Acts:** Entry, seating on the chair, ordering a meal, serving, eating, requesting the bill, paying, and leaving.

Knowledge representation issues

There are various issues to be considered regarding knowledge representation. Some of them are grain size - resolution detail, scope, modularity, understandability, explicit vs. implicit knowledge, and procedural vs. declarative knowledge. Let us understand some issues and their aspects.

Mathematical formulations of representing knowledge

Mathematical modeling is the task of translating problems from an application area into mathematical formulations whose theoretical and numerical analysis can provide answers, insights, and guidance to the new application. It is essential in many applications as it gives direction to solve a problem, enables a detailed understanding of the system model, helps in better design or control of a system, and allows the efficient use of modern computing capabilities.

Mathematical modeling is the activity concerning the study of the simulation of physical development by computational processes. The simulation aims to predict the behavior of an artifact within its environment. The following sections describe the applications and future impacts of AI technology on several mathematical modeling activities. The various mathematical modeling activities include generation of a model, interpretation of accurate results, development, and control of the numerical algorithms.

Here are the various algorithms that are used to extract numerical information from mathematical models:

- **Numerical linear algebra:**
 - Eigenvalue problems
 - Linear systems of equations
 - Techniques for massive, sparse issues
 - Linear programming (linear optimization)
- **Numerical analysis:**
 - Function evaluation
 - Special functions
 - Interpolation
 - Automatic and numerical differentiation

- Techniques for large, sparse problems
- Approximation (least squares, radial basis functions)
- Integration (univariate, multivariate, Fourier transform)
- Optimization = nonlinear programming
- Nonlinear systems of equations
- **Numerical data analysis (numerical statistics):**
 - Classification
 - Prediction
 - Visualization (2D and 3D computational geometry)
 - Parameter estimation (least squares, maximum likelihood)
 - Time series analysis (filtering, time correlations, signal processing, and spectral analysis)
 - Random numbers and Monte Carlo methods
 - Categorical time series (hidden Markov models)
 - Techniques for large, sparse problem
- **Numerical functional analysis:**
 - Ordinary differential equations (initial value problems, boundary value problems, eigenvalue problems, and stability)
 - Partial differential equations (finite differences, finite elements, boundary elements, mesh generation, and adaptive meshes)
 - Techniques for large problems
 - Integral equations (and regularization)
 - Stochastic differential equations
- Non-numerical algorithms:
- Symbolic methods (computer algebra)
- Cryptography

Model representation

By using the above algorithms, we can make a model in such a form that is accessible to the computer. The detailed modeling cycle is shown below:

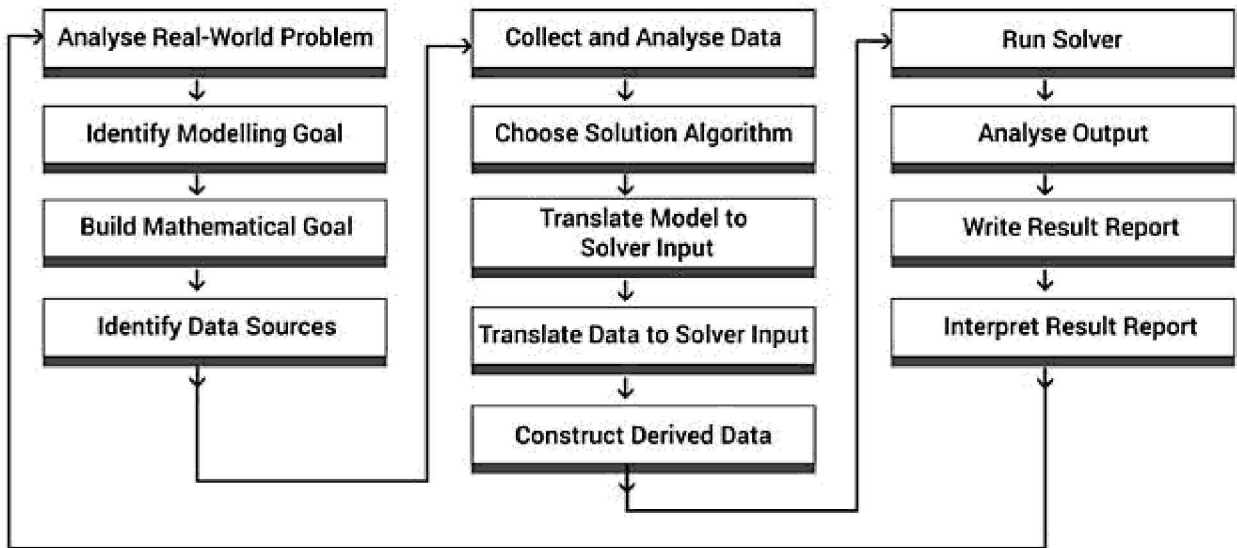


Figure 3.5: Steps of modeling cycle

To solve a problem, there is a need to analyze the real world and identify or say, find a goal. Further, we need to start building a suitable mathematical model according to the problem. Then, we need to collect data from various data sources, build a model, analyze output, and finally, make a detailed report interpreting the results.

Let's consider the problem of prediction of the election system. In this, various steps need to be followed to build a model successfully.

Analyze real-world problem

The goal is to build a 360 degree view of the product, brand, and celebrity through the data available on social media.

- **Identify modeling goal:** Develop a platform using ML, DL, and NLP for social media analytics and represent through data visualization tools like D3.js charts, Canvas.js, and more.
- **Build mathematical goals:** Principal component analysis, entropy, eigen decomposition, combinatorics, Gaussian, Bernoulli, Hessian, Jacobian, Laplacian, distributions, and Manifolds.

- **Identify data sources:** Facebook, Twitter, YouTube, LinkedIn, Instagram, news websites, Snapchat, and Pinterest.
- **Collect and analyze data:** The very first step of analytics is to bring the data into the system, that is, the data ingestion process. While ingesting data, we can have multiple data sources, therefore, we need a universal data ingestion platform where we can connect to various data sources and then process the data further. There is a need for a universal data ingestion platform because it makes it easy to monitor the ingestion process from various data sources. Various types of data analysis can be helpful, such as audience profile analysis, content analysis, competitive benchmarking, sentiment analysis, traffic analysis, community detection, fake news recognition, territory, and area mapping.
- **Choose solution algorithm:** Extra Trees Classifier, Gradient Boosting Classifier, Random Forest Classifier, Logistic Regression, Bernoulli NB, Gaussian NB, Multinomial NB, K Neighbors Classifier, Linear SVC, Nu SVC, SVC, Decision Tree Classifier, Naive Bayes Maximum Entropy Model, Autoencoders.
- **Translate model to solver input:** Train the model by taking historical data.
- **Translate data to solve input:** Pre-processing the data means to convert the data in a meaningful form. Clean and transform the data.
- **Construct derived data:** Extract the meaningful data or say, important features of the data that are helpful to predict the accurate results.
- **Run solver:** Build and run a model.
- **Analyze output:** Save the model and make daily predictions on the data and analyze the data. To do this we can use different types of charts like heatmap, line charts, bar charts, histograms, pie charts, and so on, based on our data and the requirements.
- **Write the result report:** After getting accurate results, the next step is to write a result report of the model in detail as along with the various phases used during model building.
- **Interpret result report:** Last but not the least step is to do a detailed interpretation of the report.

Strategies for searching possible solutions from the problem spaces

The ability to solve complicated scientific problems is considered one of the critical

competencies customers should acquire. There are various approaches to model scientific problem solving, its structure, and its implementation. The strategies which are involved in scientific problem solving are different for different problems.

A successful scientist must master two related skills— knowing where to look and understanding what is seen. The first skill is the experimental design which involves the design of innovative and observational procedures. The second skill is hypothesis formation which involves the formation and evaluation of the theory.

There are two essential characterizations of the process of scientific reasoning. These are concept-formation view and problem-solving view. In the concept-formation view, scientific reasoning consists of forming new concepts by experimental evidence. Whereas in the problem-solving view, scientific reasoning is characterized as a search process.

Solution strategy

Suppose we have a problem in a particular domain, an expert might have different solution strategies. Intuitively, a solution strategy is available which means it can be used to deal with frequently occurring problem situations. For instance, in the domain of travel planning, the task could be of finding a route between two places. Let's take an example of Uber; depending on the available means of transportation, different strategies can be applied, for example, driving by taxi, taking an auto, or taking a shared cab.

In general, a solution strategy forms the basis of the process to find a solution. It might be complicated to hypothesize the solution strategy even if the solution itself contains too little information about the solution process. However, it might be challenging to hypothesize the solution strategy from the solution. The choice of the solution strategy is an important design decision for creating a solution. The general problems are classified into five classes according to an increasing size of the solution space:

- **Class 1 - One solution strategy and one implementation:** Problems of this type can be solved according to a single solution strategy and have only one solution. In some cases, the description of the issues of this class can be specified in such a way that the answer is unique. These kinds of problems are suited to recall elemental knowledge of the domain because the single solution can be used to address a concept that should be learned.
- **Class 2 - One solution strategy, alternative implementation variants:** This

type of problems can be solved according to a single solution strategy which, however, can be implemented in many different ways. Issues at this level are precisely specified so that the space of possible solutions is narrowed down to a single solution strategy.

- **Class 3 - Limited number of alternative solution strategies:** In this class of problems, the customer is free to choose one of the several non-alternative solution strategies and they implement it according to their preferences. This class of problems is more challenging than Class 2 and Class 3 because developers have to make appropriate design decisions, that is, choosing between solution strategies and implementation variants, instead of merely applying a pre-defined solution template.
- **Class 4:** In this class, we have a significant variability of possible solution strategies; however, the correctness of any given specific solution can be verified. In this class, the problem is so complex that it needs to be solved by dividing it into sub-problems that can be solved using different solution strategies. Since the combination of solution strategies results in a new solution strategy for the overall task, the number of these combinations is not known a priori.
- **Class 5:** In this class, we have a great variety of possible solution strategies and the correctness of solutions cannot be verified. Problems of this class require solutions that not only fulfill specific testable functional requirements but also the ones that should be considered useful and acceptable by a large number of stakeholders.

Let's take an example, the Uber taxi service was officially launched in 2010. Six months later, they had approximately 6,000 users and had already provided about 20,000 rides.

Uber works as a location-based startup from day one. To create the model of Uber, manufacturers need to understand the specifics of iOS and Android geolocation features. Let us go through the important features that should be considered:

- **Identifying a device's location:** The Uber app that works on iOS system uses the Core-Location framework to find a user's device. The Core-Location framework provides protocols to configure and schedule the location delivery and send back location events to the server. The Core-Location framework also helps Uber to define geographic locations and monitor a device's movements as it crosses the boundaries. For Android version of the Uber app, geolocation was implemented

using Google's Location APIs that can manage location technology and meet various other development needs when implementing location-based features.

- **Providing driving directions to the driver:** To display point-to-point directions on a map, developers of the Uber app used MapKit for the iOS version. Registering the app as a routing application makes routes available to the Maps application and all other mapping software on a user's device. In Android, routes and directions are made possible by the Google Maps Android API.
- **Integrating Wi-Fi mapping software:** As Google Map is integrated with Uber; it helps Uber find the location for both iPhone and Android versions of their application. But Google Maps is not the only service that Uber uses. To avoid paying Google for access to their solutions, Uber buys mapping technology companies to solve their logistics issues.
- **Push notifications and SMS:** The user can receive these messages as SMS or push notifications. After a client books a ride, Uber sends some notifications such as:
 - when a driver accepts your request
 - when the driver is about to reach its destination
 - when a ride has been canceled due to some reason
- **Payment integration:** Uber prefer to make their system cashless. The user can pay cash, pay via debit or credit card, or use a promo code; these modes of payment remove any human-to-human transactions. When accepting card payments, there are specific requirements that companies must comply with. Uber can also use PayPal's Cardio service for the scanning of credit cards on iOS. In Android, users need to manually enter credit card data to link a card to their Uber account.
- **Transportation with DL and AI at Uber:** Recently, Uber has started using **machine learning (ML)**, **artificial intelligence (AI)**, and advanced technologies to create positive experiences for users. They introduced a Bayesian neural network architecture that can estimate trip growth more accurately. Among other areas, they use ML to enable an efficient ride-sharing marketplace, identify suspicious accounts, and suggest optimal pickup and drop off points.
- **Problem space:** Uber's problem is new and rapidly evolving, especially at the scale and intersection of dimensions:

- **Temporal:** From seconds to years.
- **Spatial:** At both micro levels (riders, cars, and goods) and macro levels (global, regional, and city).
- **Active:** Immediate impact and response to the system.
- **Human:** Involved at every stage, starting from decision making to decision receipt.
- **Scale:** Millions of calculations and thousands of decisions made for riders and drivers every minute.

Designing Uber maps

Maps represent the physical world that is built on data, and Uber's primary mission is too tied to the ability to use this data to refine the mapping technologies. Aspects such as prediction and destination search, ETAs, generation of map tiles, routing, and fare estimates, maps are essential in every element of a logistics network. They can be represented visually by maps that cover more than 95 percent of pixels on the rider.

Uber uses ML to improve their maps. Destination prediction fulfills problems of all destination entries and tests the accuracy of models:

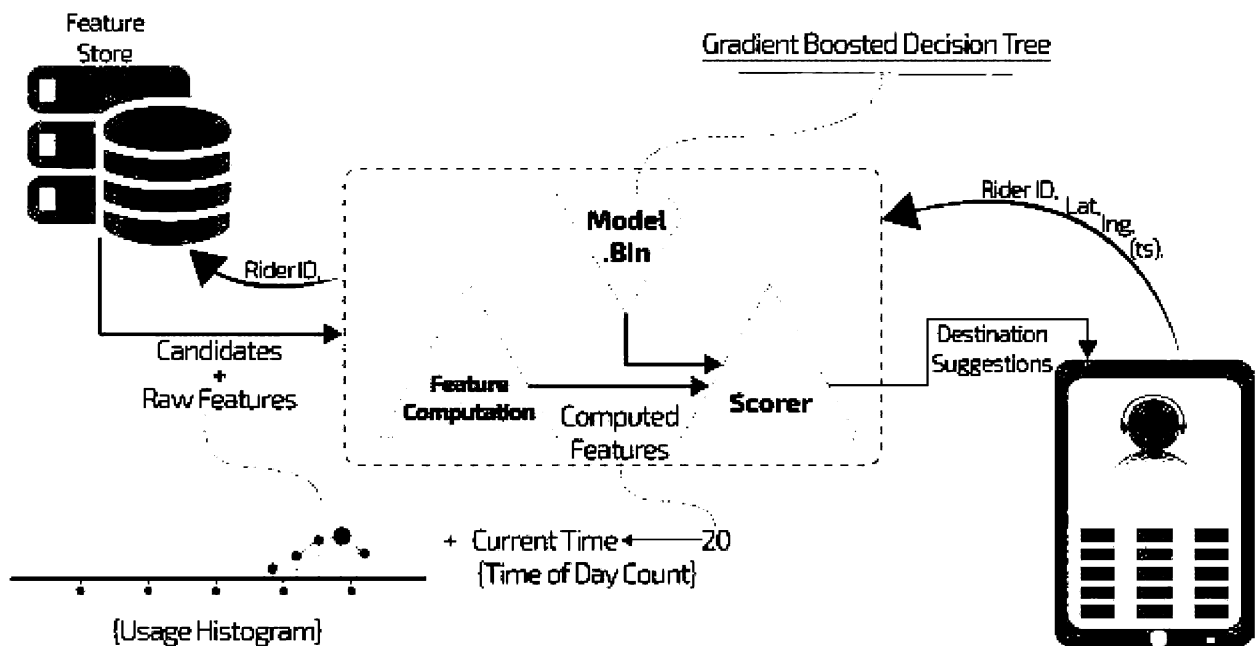


Figure 3.6: Flow of designing Uber maps

The destination prediction process consists of five distinct steps:

1. Rider books taxi to ride.
2. The service retrieves details of the rider from the stored feature and ranks them by providing latitude, longitude and time.
3. The system service returns the first seven destination suggestions along with selected candidates from places where people have previously traveled and searched.
4. By using a combination of information about the physical world along with ML, the service produces a list of places along with the set of features, including a histogram of popular destinations with corresponding request times and the current time.
5. A machine-learned scorer then ranks these suggested places, taking feedback from another model that learned to train how to weight all the components separately.

Uber service architecture

In the marketplace, some models describe the world and the decision engines that act on the models. The following diagram illustrates the architecture of Uber service:

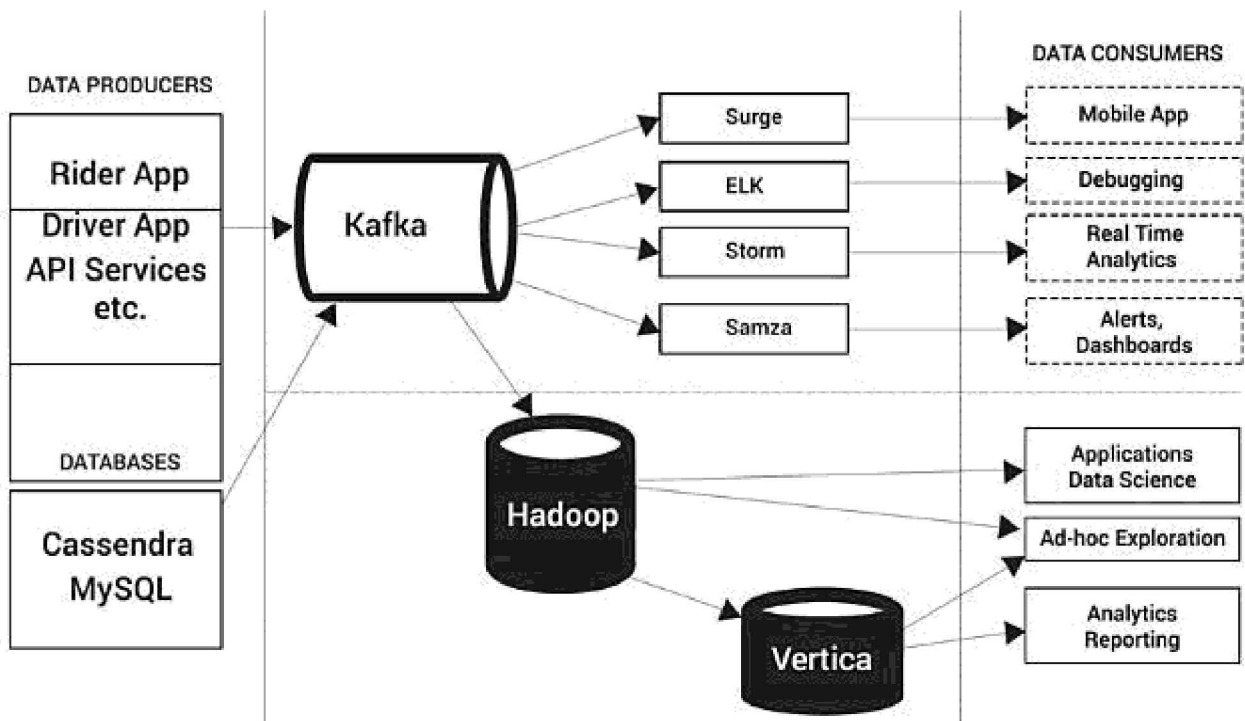


Figure 3.7: Architecture diagram of Uber service

This architecture diagram shows the working of Uber. On the left-hand side, it's mostly where the data comes from, that is, all the applications, services, and databases. They all go into one central piece, which is Kafka. From here, many services pull the data through consumers. Surge pulls data to do some fair calculations.

ELK (Elasticsearch, Logstash, and Kibana) is the logging stack. It is used to provide real-time reporting dashboards used for debugging, reporting, and auditing. Samza and Flink pull data to do real-time data processing. The same data is sent to S3 for cold storage, where it can be kept for archives. The same Kafka has Hadoop as a consumer. Once information is stored in Hadoop, it can be used for batch processing, ad hoc queries, and data exploration. Hadoop's data repository is used to run data science applications.

Conclusion

After this tour around decision making and human reasoning, we can draw some conclusions. The first is that decision theory and AI are only at the beginning of their mutual cross-fertilization. The decision theory is all about making the best decision, either in a particular or uncertain world with the available choices. AI has focused much attention on diagnosis and human knowledge representing and recording. It is only a few years following its first embraced uncertainty and has practically never dealt with decisions. For some reason, the planning process starts after the decision is made since the result of the decision is the goal. It is indeed possible to ignore the preferences and to help a user find the right path from the current state to their goal, but AI cannot carry out that plan without paying attention to uncertainty. So, AI and decision theory appear to be mainly complementary— diagnosis representation and handling of the recorded states for AI, look-ahead, uncertainty, and preferences for decision theory.

CHAPTER 4

Intelligent Computing Strategies by Google

In this chapter, we will learn about the progress of deep learning by Google Inc. This chapter includes the achievements of intelligent services currently provided by the company and recent exploration by DeepMind, a subsidiary of Google that is working hard on achieving new frontiers in DL research. We'll also discuss the business model of the company revolving around the use of deep learning technologies.

The strategies of Google in deep learning exploration

In the last few years, AI and DL were applied to solve hundreds of problems, from computer vision to natural language processing. In all cases, DL defeats previous work. DL is widely used in both, academics to study intelligence and in the industry to build intelligent systems that can assist humans in various tasks.

The goal of this chapter is to share essential applications of deep learning that can be used by Google in the field of text, search, voice, and computer vision.

One of the essential areas of DL application is working with the text— translation, text analysis, chatbots, and a plethora of other tasks.

- **Google Neural Machine Translation (GNMT):** Google's machine translation could make it easier for people to communicate with those speaking a different language,

by translating speech directly into text in a language they can understand. Machine translation of speech works typically by first converting it into text, then translating that text into the desired language. Thus, any error in speech recognition will lead to incorrect transcription and consequently, incorrect translation.

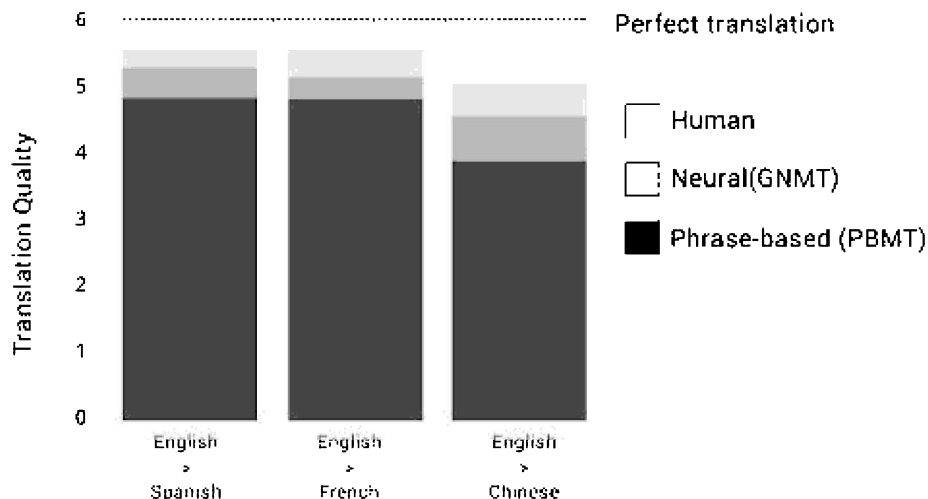


Figure 4.1: Comparison of the translation quality of human, neural-based model, and phrase-based model

The team trained its system on hundreds of hours of English audio with corresponding Spanish, French, and Chinese text. In each case, it uses several layers of neural networks (computer systems loosely modeled on the human brain) to match sentences of spoken French with the written translation.

- **Chatbot:** Google has been moving towards the chatbot space. Google Assistant can suggest movies or restaurants directly within a conversation taking place at Allo. Google further improved with the recent launch of the latest tool named Chatbase. It is an analytical tool that helps companies develop their chatbots that are used in several social media tools like Facebook Messenger. It helps these companies improve their chatbots; it also allows Google to get relevant information about the other field. The idea behind Chatbase cloud service is to offer tools to analyze and optimize chatbots more efficiently. These tools enable bot builders to create features that help increase customer conversions and improve the bot's accuracy, thereby creating a better user experience.
- **Speech processing and generation:** Another relevant field of DL application used by Google is speech processing. It includes the production of speech and music, recognition and synchronization of the lip movements, and so on. Nowadays, **Automatic Speech Recognition (ASR)** is used in daily real-life applications. One of

the primary goals of speech recognition is to allow communication between humans and computers via speech in the ways humans interact with each other.

Google's first attempt at speech recognition driven directory assistance service, which worked from any phone, came in 2007 and was called GOOG-441. It was a speech-enabled business finder that took user's spoken words (city, state, business name, and business address) as input. Based on the relevance between the match and the query, one to eight results were read back to the user using **text-to-speech (TTS)**. The user then had the option to get connected to the service or request an SMS with the business information.

Google's current speech recognition system is speaker-independent and is built using deep neural networks, together with hidden Markov models (DNN-HMM). The strength of Google Speech helps in general-purpose tasks like making search requests on the **World Wide Web (WWW)**. Google uses cloud-computing for speech recognition tasks.

- **Google Maps for Mobile (GMM):** In March 2008, Google introduced multimodal speech applications for GMM. GMM can show the location of a business and other related information directly on a map. The contact information, address, and any additional meta-information about a company (such as ratings) can readily be displayed. Also, due to the multi-modality of the search experience, the total time spent is significantly less. Finally, the cognitive load on the user is reduced. These advantages enable substantial improvement in the quality of interaction and quality of information.
- **Google Search by Voice:** In November 2008, Google launched Voice Search that works on various types of smartphones. Voice Search merely adds the ability to speak to the phone and ask a query instead of typing into the browser. The audio message is sent to Google servers where it is recognized and the result is sent back to the mobile. The data moves over the data channel instead of the voice channel, which provides higher quality audio transmission and better recognition rates. **Google Mobile App (GMA)** for the iPhone included a search by voice feature. GMA search by voice extended the paradigm of multi-modal voice search from searching for businesses on maps to exploring the entire WWW.
- **DeepMind WaveNet:** Google DeepMind is developing WaveNet — an algorithm that can transform the input text into raw audio. It can show outstanding results as compared to previous attempts. It is one of the fully convolutional neural networks where it contains various dilation factors that allow its respective corresponding field to grow exponentially with depth and cover thousands of steps. At the time of

training, input sequences are original waveforms obtained by recording human speakers. After training, the sampling of data is used to generate synthetic utterances. During the sampling process, the value is extracted from the probability distribution computed by the network. After that, the obtained value is fed back into the input and a process of new prediction is done.

- **Lip reading from Google DeepMind:** Google DeepMind is an artificial intelligence analysis within Google. DeepMind is inspired by neuroscience that helps to make progress in many areas such as reasoning, imagination, learning, and memory. Taking vision, for example, human ability plays an essential part in our daily lives; it allows us to plan and to reason about the future, but it is very challenging for computers. Keeping this in mind, imagination augmented agent was introduced which can extract relevant information from an environment to plan what to do in the future.

These are systems that learn automatically. They're not pre-programmed and not even handcrafted features. Google provides a broad set of raw information to the algorithms so that the systems themselves can learn the very best representations and use those for action, classification, or predictions. The reinforcement learning architecture is mostly a design approach to develop systems that begin with an agent. The agent has a policy that governs its interaction with an environment. This environment could be a trading environment, a small physics domain, or it could be a real-world robotics environment. The agent says that it wants to take action in this environment and gets feedback for the situation in the form of observations. Further, it uses these observations to update its policy of behavior or its model of the world.

- **Synchronization of the lip movement with the audio stream:** Lip reading is the impressive ability to recognize words and phrases from visual information alone. Lip-reading is difficult for a novice. Many deaf people can do it, but it is challenging. Human lip reading performance is quite average. Hearing-impaired people achieve an accuracy of only 17±12%. An important goal, therefore, is to automate lip reading. Machine lip reading is difficult because it requires extracting spatiotemporal features from the video. With AI like Google's DeepMind, it is now possible to analyze lip movement in visuals and do a better job than humans. Google made an algorithm with DeepMind, which is able to read lip movement of humans, as shown in the following diagram:

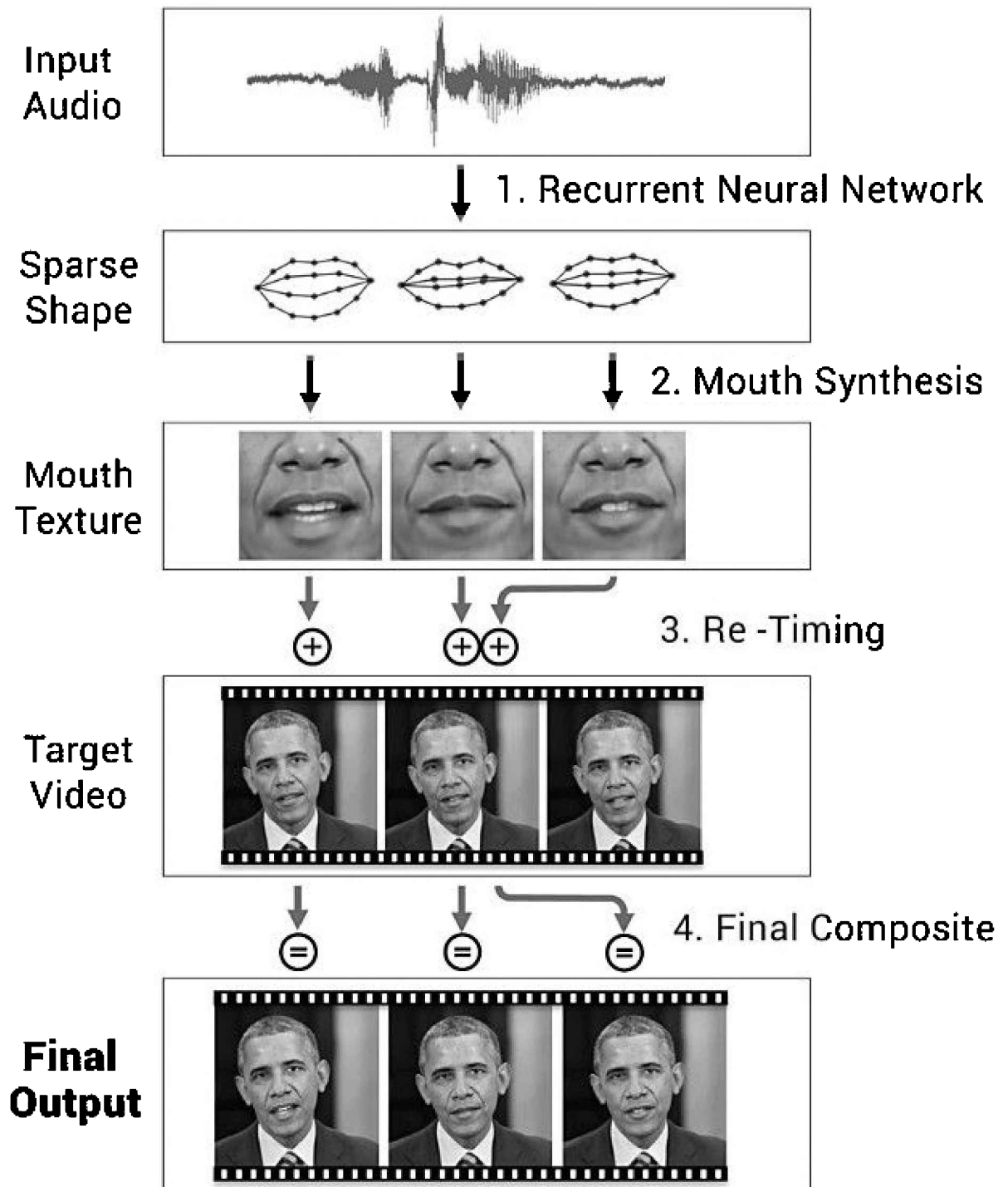


Figure 4.2: Transformation of the data with respect to each step

The neural network system first converts the input in the form of audio (sound) to time-varying mouth shape. Based on this mouth shape, photo-realistic mouth texture is

generated, which is further composited into the mouth region of an existing target video and speech.

Research environment by DeepMind and other services provided to the users

AI research has made considerable progress in a variety of domains ranging from speech recognition, image classification, and genomics to drug discovery. In many cases, there are specialist systems that gain enormous amounts of human expertise and data. Let's get an overview of some of the AI services in various fields.

AlphaGo

AlphaGo was the first program needed to achieve superhuman performance in Go. It utilized two deep neural networks— a policy network that outputs move probabilities, and a value network that outputs a position evaluation. The policy network was initially trained by supervised learning to predict the moves of human experts accurately and then refined by policy-gradient reinforcement learning. The value network was trained to anticipate the winner of games played by the policy network against itself.

Once trained, further networks were combined with a *Monte-Carlo Tree Search*. This was done to provide a look-ahead search using the policy network to narrow down the search to high-probability moves and using the value network to evaluate positions in the tree. A convolutional neural network is used to approximate the policy network; the network structure is roughly something that follows, showing an example of a **Convolutional Neural Network (CNN)**:

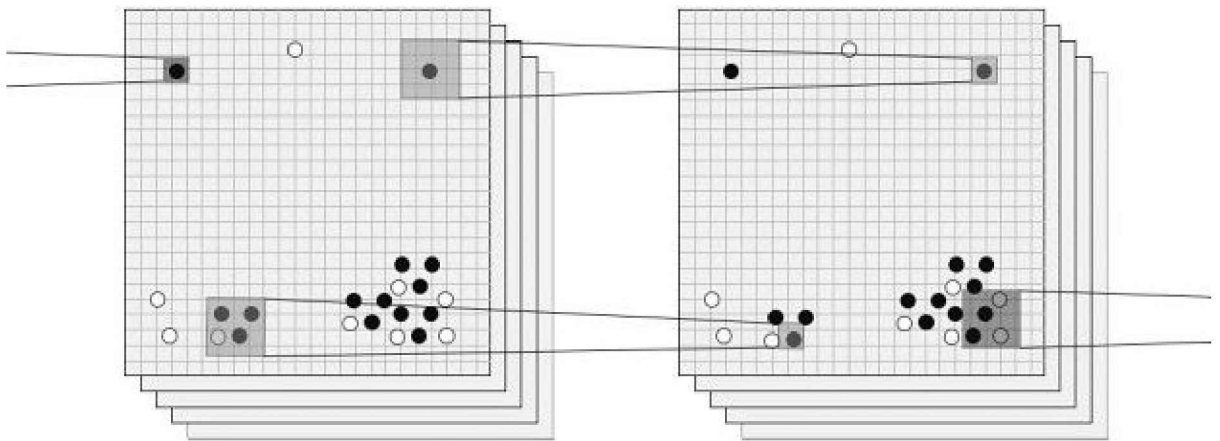
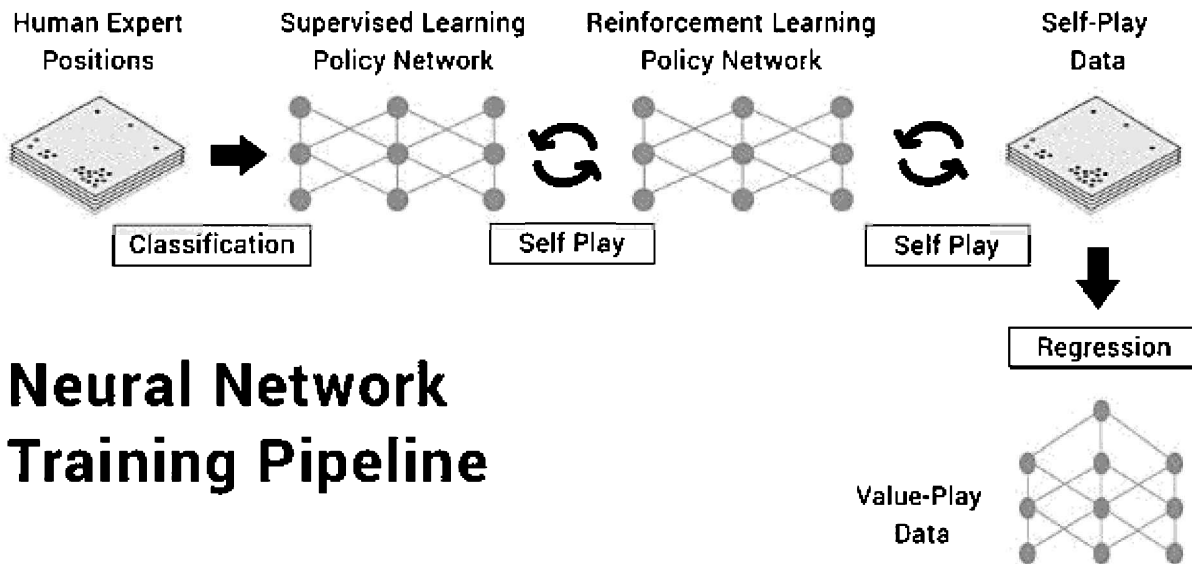


Figure 4.3: Network structure of ANN

The following points give a brief layer wise introduction of the Network:

- **Input:** $19 \times 19 \times 48$ vector representing the state of a particular move.
- **Hidden layers:** various convolutional layers with various window sizes.
- **Output:** A softmax layer of size $19 \times 19 \times 2$. The first 19×19 represent possible moves for the black player, and the other 19×19 output is for the white player.

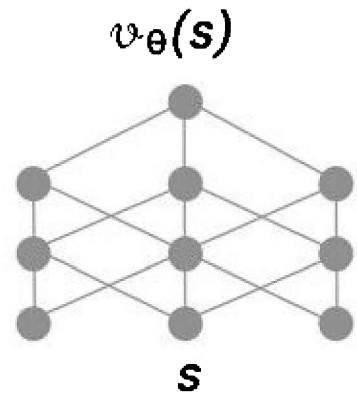
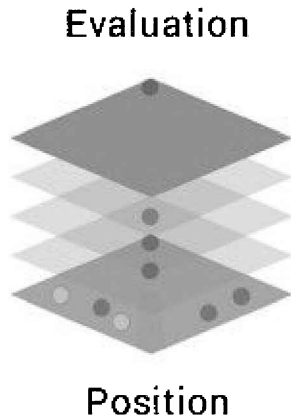


Neural Network Training Pipeline

Figure 4.4: Training pipeline of Neural Network

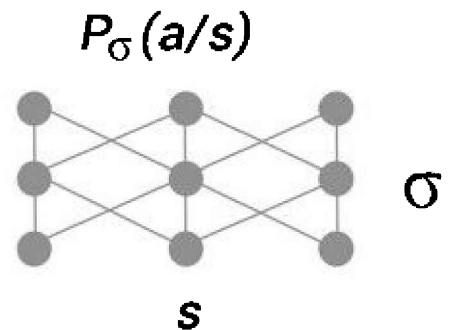
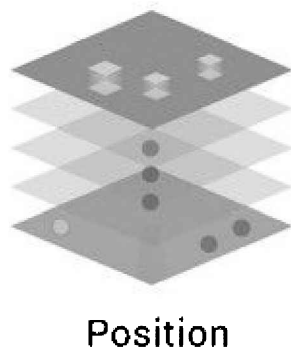
- **Supervised learning of policy networks:** Supervised learning (SL) of policy network is a CNN of 13 layers that was trained on 30 million moves of human experts. The supervised learning policy network achieved 57.0% accuracy. Also, training a rollout policy on a corpus of 8 million movements attained an efficiency of 24.2%.
- **Reinforcement learning of policy networks:** While the SL policy network is excellent in predicting the next most likely moves, RL helps with the prediction of the best possible (winning) moves. The reinforcement learning policy aims to improve the SL policy through self-play. The reinforcement learning policy network had the same architecture. At this stage, AlphaGo played 1.2 million games with randomly selected previous iterations of itself. The goal of this policy was to adjust it towards the real purpose of winning games rather than maximizing predictive accuracy. Reinforcement learning can earn more than 80% of games as compared to SL policy.

The following diagram displays a comparison between value network and policy network:

- **Reinforcement learning of value network:** The value network tries to predict, for a given position, which player has the advantage. Here is just a CNN trained with the least-squares regression method. During self-play, data comes from the board positions and outcomes. Policy and value networks search AlphaGo and use a combination of policy and value networks in the Monte Carlo search tree. The following diagram illustrates the four phases:

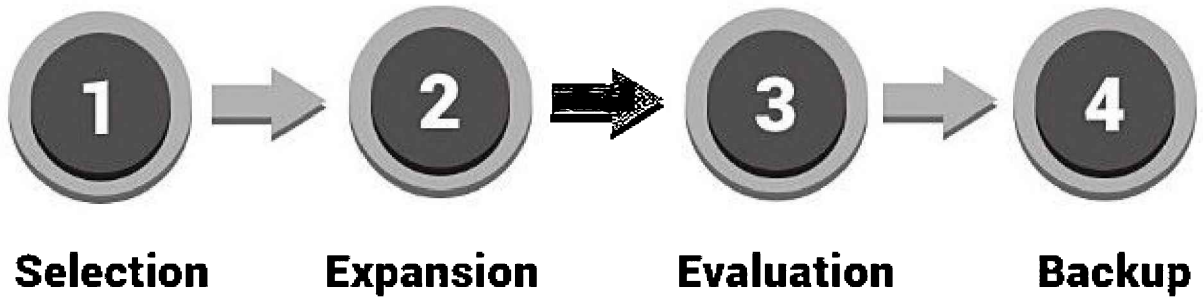


Figure 4.6: Flow of selection, expansion, evaluation, and backup

The game tree is searched in simulations composed of four phases:

- **Selection:** Simulation traverses tree by selecting edges with maximum action value Q .
- **Expansion:** If any node is expanded, it is processed once by the SL policy network to get prior probabilities for each legal action.
- **Evaluation:** Each node is evaluated by the value network and by FRpolicy.
- **Backup:** Values collected during the evaluation step updates action values Q .

When time dedicated to a game agent is over, it chooses the best move based on the highest action value Q .

Autonomous cars

Self-driving cars are also known as driverless cars, autonomous cars, or robotic cars. Autonomous vehicles have already been developed and allowed on the roads. Currently, cars are semi-automated and require human control in some cases.

It is the first driverless electric car built by Google to test the next stage of its self-driving car project. It looks like a Smart car and a Nissan Micra with two seats and enough room space for a small amount of luggage.

Autonomous cars work with the use of various technologies which include GPS, laser light, radar, computer vision, and more. Many companies are investing in Self-driving cars as it may, one day, dominate the market. There are many challenges in the field of research; however, best researchers in the industry are involved in it. There is a legal framework that surrounds the fair-use of self-driving cars. Security concerns have also been raised for self-driving vehicles.

The car can carry two people from one place to another without any interaction with the user. A smartphone notifies the vehicle for pick up at the exact location of the user with

the destination set. There is no manual control or steering wheel. It has merely a start button and an emergency stop button of red color. In front of the passengers, there is a screen that shows the current speed, the weather, and more.

Once the journey is over, the small screen displays a message to remind the user to take their personal belongings. Let's go through the car's hardware specifications:

- **Radar:** Traditional radars are used to detect dangerous objects in the path of the vehicles, which are more than 100 meters away. Systems trigger alerts when they sense something in the car's blind spot. The radar chirps between 10 and 11 GHz over five milliseconds, transmitting the radar signal from a centrally located antenna cone. Two receive cones, separated by 14 inches approximately, receive the reflected radar energy.
- **Optics:** A camera fixed near the rear-view mirror build real-time 3D images of the road ahead that can spot hazards like pedestrians and animals. It is also used to identify traffic signals and road markings.
- **Light Detection and Ranging (LIDAR):** LIDAR is an essential device in the autonomous vehicles that is placed on the roof of the car. It consists of an emitter, receiver, and mirror. The emitter sends a LASER beam that bounces off a mirror that rotates along with a cylindrical cover at ten revolutions per minute. After bouncing off objects, the LASER beam returns to the mirror and is bounced back towards the receiver where it can interpret it as data. The vehicle can then generate a map of its surroundings and use the map to avoid objects.
- **Global Positioning System (GPS):** A GPS keeps the car on its expected route, having an accuracy of 30 centimeters. With GPS that covers the macro location of the vehicle; on-deck cameras can recognize more minor details like red lights, stop signs, and construction zones.
- **Processors:** Processors with seven dual-core, 2.13 GHz, and 2 GB RAM configurations are needed to process the data collected by the car's instruments. Some vehicles can run as many as 17 processors to dispense the computing load.
- **Wheel Speed Sensors:** Wheel speed sensors measure the wheel speed and direction of rotation on the road. These sensors provide input to different automotive systems, which include the anti-lock brake system and electronic stability control.

Working of autonomous car

The autonomous car is mechanized by an electric motor with a range of around a 100-mile. It uses the software as well as a combination of sensors to locate itself in the real-world

with the combination of highly accurate digital maps. In most cars, a GPS is used as the satellite navigation system to get a rough idea about the location of the vehicle, at which point lasers, radar, and cameras take over to monitor the 360-degree view of the world around the car. The following diagram shows the flow between the different parts of an autonomous car:

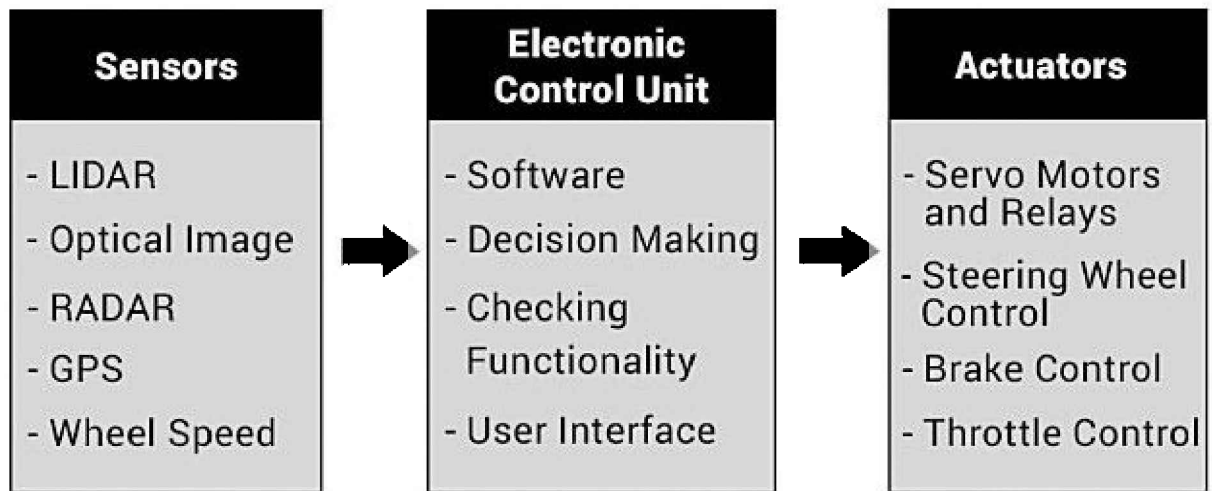


Figure 4.7: Flow between the different parts of an autonomous car

The software can quickly recognize objects, cars, people, road signs, and traffic lights, making the car obey the traffic rules and avoid several unpredictable hazards, including cyclists. For example, the Google autonomous car can successfully identify a cyclist and understand that if the cyclist extends an arm, they are expected to make a maneuver. The vehicle then knows to slow down and give the cyclist enough space to operate safely. It can even detect road works and safely navigate around them.

The software can recognize traffic signs and store them in a standard database using Google Maps and GPS. The GPS software component records the signs and direction of travel from that area. Every car operational in that area and using this software will register the new signs detected and modify the degree of confidence and degree of recognition for other users.

Another software component can recognize the separation lines between lanes. It uses three cameras to calculate precisely and to use probabilities about the position of the car on the road. From the location, the user can propose a new direction in the absence of traffic signs for the next few seconds.

Also, the software uses AI to detect other car fingerprints from Webcam images.

Google Play

Google launched Instant Apps Google Play Protect that provides a way for developers to give users an application in which there is no need to install anything. Users would click on a link on the search results page, and the instant app will load. Today, the companies are extending this program to games.

The features of the application are enabled by default on all Android devices that show that it is meant to be a real-time malware scanner that will scan every installed or about-to-be installed application and give information to the users in case of any suspicious activity.

DeepMind HealthStream application

A stream is a secure mobile phone application that aims to address the problems of patients when they are not able to get the necessary treatment at the right time. Thousands of people end up in hospitals due to preventable diseases like sepsis and acute kidney injury because they don't receive medical aid on time.

Google built streams to help doctors address this problem. The application brings together essential medical information, like patients' blood test results, in one place. If anyone is found sick, streams can send a secure and urgent smartphone alert to the right clinician to provide necessary help to the patient, along with information about their previous conditions so they can make an immediate diagnosis accordingly.

Streams can also allow clinicians to instantly review the vital signs of patients, like blood pressure, heart rate, as well as help to record these observations straight into the application. To make all of this possible, Streams integrates various types of data like lab data, medical data, text data, and test results from a range of existing IT systems used by the hospital.

AI navigation without a map

In today's digitally connected world, users are entirely dependent on Google Maps and other GPS elements that guide them to their destination. If we are familiar with a route or a place, we use our memories and visual cues to reach our destination. But what if there was no GPS and it was an entirely new place?

DeepMind's research team at Google has built an interactive navigation platform that makes use of first-person point-of-view pictures from Google Street View to train its AI model. The team developed a deep neural network artificial agent to continuously learn to navigate different cities using the visual information it gathers from images of Street

View. Once it familiarizes itself with a few cities, it is able to adapt to a new city very quickly. Note that faces, images, and license plates are blurred and are unrecognizable in street-view, thereby ensuring privacy for people.

They built a neural network agent that takes inputs as images observed from the environment and predicts the next action it can make in that environment. They trained an end-to-end model using deep reinforcement learning.

The neural network inside an agent consists of three parts:

- **A convolutional network:** It can process images and extract visual features.
- **A locale-specific recurrent neural network data:** This involves memorizing the environment as well as learning a representation of the current position of the agent and location of the goal.
- **A locale-invariant recurrent network data:** It is designed to be interchangeable and unique to each city where the agent navigates.

Deep Q-Network (DQN)

DeepMind introduced the **Deep Q-Network (DQN)** algorithm in 2013. DeepMind created a system that learns to play video games by selecting actions based on only the screen images and the reward signal.

Supervised learning is not appropriate to interpret the higher dimensional sensor data. It is because the machine may have to learn without a supervisor telling it about the output of the possible input-output function. Therefore, reinforcement learning is introduced to determine the action in the current state to maximize an accumulated future reward. Before training, the program does not know anything about the game. It doesn't see the objective of the game, it has no understanding about its influence on the game, and it cannot even look at the objects in the game. By trial and error method, the system gradually learns to behave to receive a reward. The system uses the same architecture for different games without any game-related hints from the programmers other than the possible actions that are in the game, for example, up, down, left, right, space (fire), and so on.

Q-Learning is a reinforcement learning algorithm used for model-free optimal selection policy for a Markov chain process. But it is a classical approach and has one limitation. The limitation is that the number of possible states has to be reduced from infinity to the discrete states. Therefore, a technique was built with a combination of Q-Learning and deep neural networks. This technique is known as DQN. It can easily handle continuous inputs, so there is no need to have discrete data.

The following improvements are made to transform an ordinary Q-Network into DQN network:

- Moving from a single-layer network to multilayer convolutional neural networks.
- Implementation of experience-replay, which allows the network to train itself with the use of stored memories.
- A second target network is utilized to compute the target Q-values.

Working of DQN

The Bellman equation is used for training the DQN Network. Therefore, gradient descent and alpha as a loss are reduced from the equation. This obtained equation is set as a target to calculate the loss function. The model predicts the **Mean Squared Error (MSR)** between the Q-value.

Next, we need to train the neural network. Two feed-forward passes and one backpropagation pass is used for preparing the model. In the case of the feedforward pass, the state is taken as an input. The 1XN matrix highlighting the quality value of each action plan is obtained as an output.

Firstly, the state is passed to the neural network to determine the estimation of quality for each action. The action with the highest quality is selected using the Q-table and the respective work is performed. The next state is passed on to the neural network after observing it. For the computation of the target value, the most significant Q-value in the output is followed, and modified Bellman equation is used. After that, MSE is calculated between the first forward pass; it targets them and finally propagates it back through the neural network.

The following diagram illustrates the architecture of DQN:

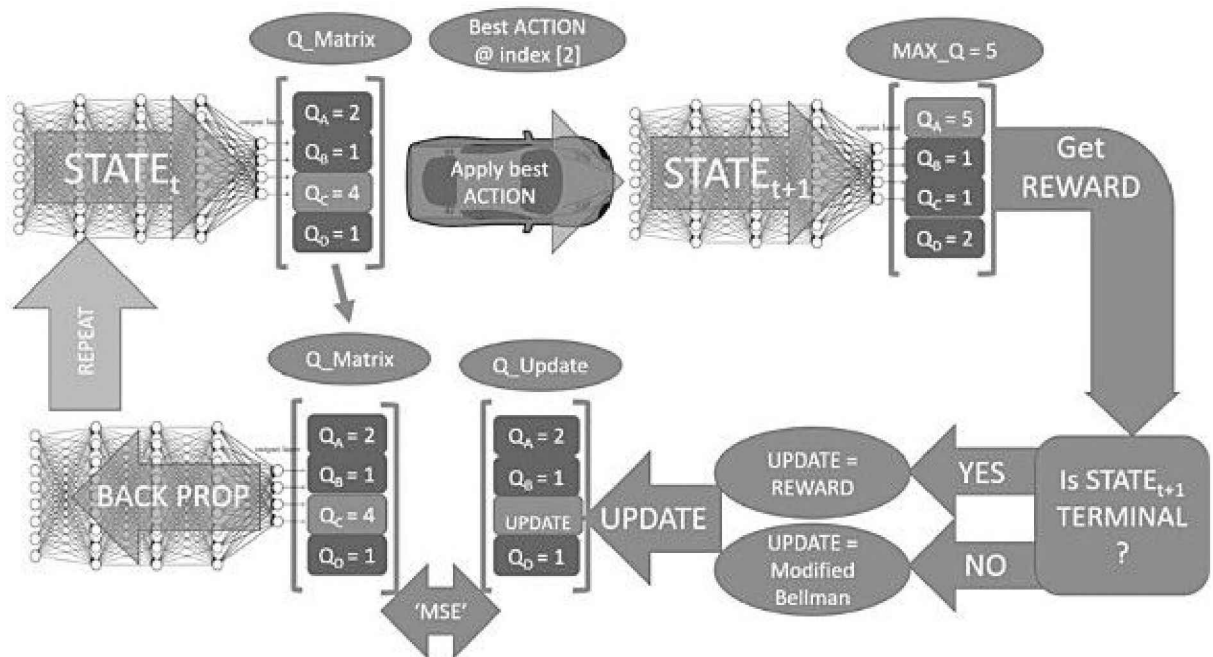


Figure 4.8: Architecture of DQN Network

DQN Network works by four techniques to overcome learning. The four techniques are experience replay, target network, clipping rewards, and skipping frames that are explained as follows:

- **Experience replay:** It is a technique to store previous experiences such as state, transitions, rewards, and actions that are highly important to perform Q-learning and build mini-batches to update the neural network.
- **Target network:** Due to the introduction of TD error computation, the target function keeps on changing with the Deep Neural Network. Therefore, the target network technique is used to fix the parameters of the target function, and after every thousand steps, the function is updated with the latest network.
- **Clipping rewards:** It is one of the DQN techniques used to clip the scores of the respective game so that all positive rewards are set as +1 and all negative rewards as -1.
- **Skipping frames:** For the reduction of the computational cost of ALE and to gather better experiences, the skipping frame technique is highly recommended. This technique of DQN is used to calculate the Q-values after every four frames and use the past four frames as an input for the neural network.

Business models currently adopted by Google

Business models are used to bridge the gap between strategy (the objectives, positioning, and goals of the company) and business processes (understanding and implementation of strategic information).

The business model canvas of Google explains the different aspects of a business model, such as customer segments, value propositions, channels, customer relations, revenue stream, key activities, cost structure, key partners, and key resources.

The Google business model can be better recognized if it is split into the following key areas:

- **Infrastructure**

- **Key activities:** Key activities consist of research and development for the development of new technologies along with the improvement of existing ones. Also, an exceptional amount of time spent in the maintenance and management of IT infrastructures, products, and services. There is also work done on marketing, strategy, and alliances.
- **Key partners:** Key partners for Google consist of distributors, suppliers, original equipment manufacturers, and the Open Handset Alliance.
- **Key resources:** Key resources for Google include data centers, servers, IPs, human support, and other IT infrastructure. Other resources include licenses, patents, and proprietary material.

- **Offering**

- **Value proposition:** Value proposition consists of offers of Google; the company creates value for its customers regarding internet search, advertising, operating systems, platforms, and enterprise.

- **Customers**

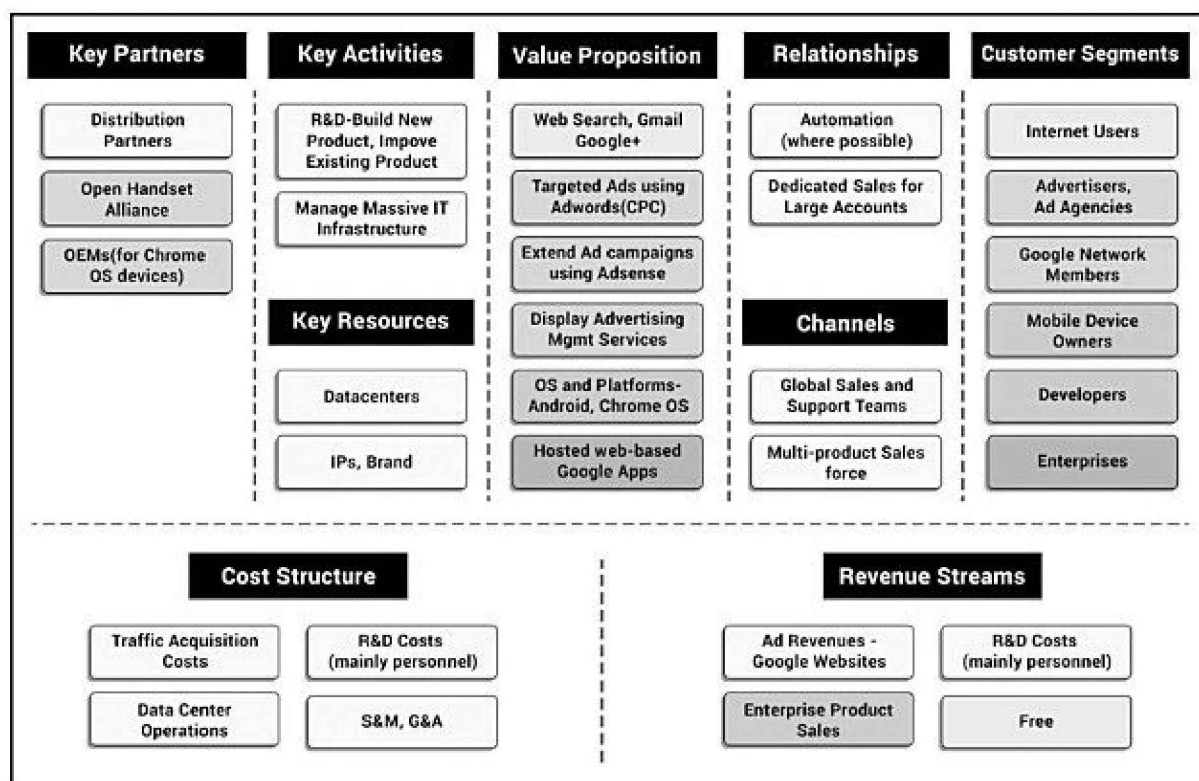


Figure 4.9: Google Business Model Canvas

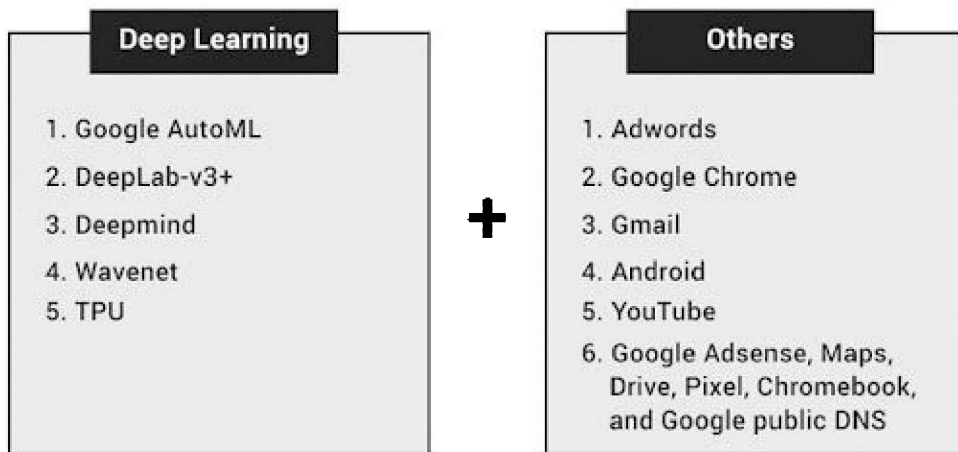


Figure 4.10: Google DL and other products

Google AutoML

AutoML Vision of Google is a new service that helps developers with limited machine learning expertise to build a custom image recognition model. Human-machine learning experts to perform the following tasks:

- Preprocessing and cleaning of the data.
- Selection and construction of appropriate features.
- Selection of an appropriate model family.
- Optimization of model hyperparameters.
- Post processing of machine learning models.
- Analyzing the obtained results.

The original idea of AutoML is to allow anybody to bring their images virtually, upload them, and then Google's systems automatically create a custom machine learning model for them. The whole process, from importing data to tagging and training the model, is done through a drag and drop interface.

With the use of AutoML, the accuracy of the model increases and results in faster turn around time:

- **Increased accuracy:** Cloud AutoML Vision is built on image recognition approaches that include machine learning and neural architecture technologies. This means

AutoML helps to get a more accurate model.

- **Faster turnaround time:** With Cloud AutoML, the developer can create a model in minutes to sense AI-enabled application, or able to build the production-ready model in very less time.
- **Easy to use:** AutoML Vision provides a simple graphical user interface that helps to specify data and turns that data into a high-quality model customized according to the specific needs.

DeepLab-v3+

DeepLab-v3+ is Google's open-source Semantic Image Segmentation model. It is a deep learning model for semantic image segmentation to assign semantic labels (for example, cat, dog, person, and so on) to each pixel in the input image. The following figure is an illustrated view of the flow chart of DeepLab-v3+:

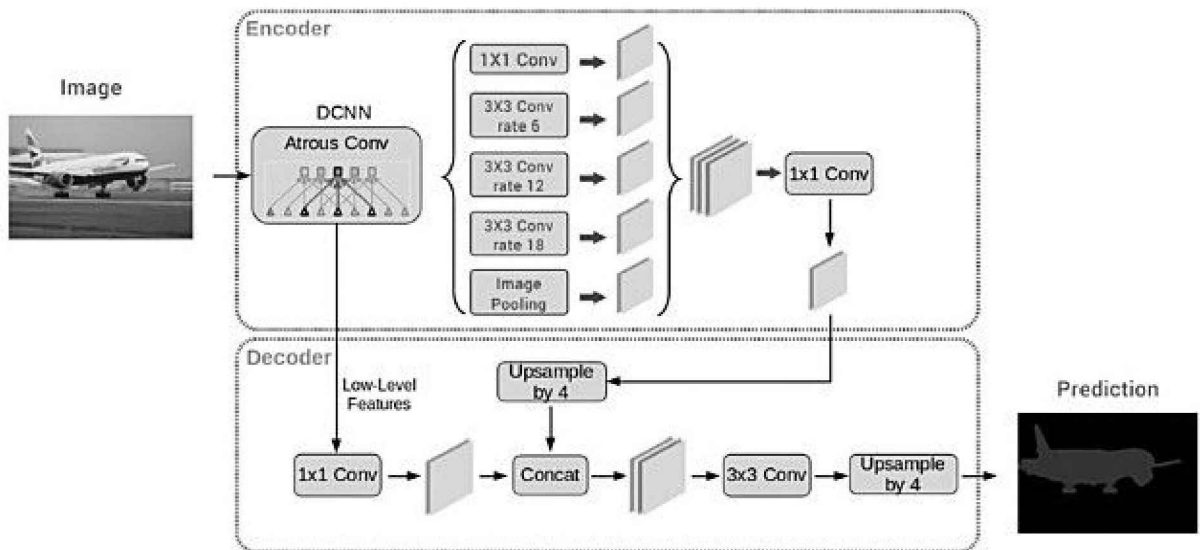


Figure 4.11: Flow chart of DeepLab-v3+

DeepLab-v3+ is implemented in TensorFlow and its models are built on the top of a convolutional neural network backbone architecture, which is intended for server-side deployment for the most accurate results. It is the extension of the DeepLab-v3 model. The DeepLab-v3 model consists of the convolution layer to extract the features by deep learning neural networks at an arbitrary resolution.

An estrous convolutional layer is a tool to control the features computed by deep learning models explicitly and to capture multi-scale information; it adjusts the filter field of view. It also generalizes the standard convolution operation.

For the development of the DeepLab-v3+ model, a simple and active decoder module is added in the DeepLab-v3 model. It is performed to refine the segmentation results along the object boundaries. Depth-wise separable convolution is also applied to both estrous spatial pyramid pooling and decoder modules. It helps to increase the speed and accuracy of the encoder-decoder module for semantic segmentation.

For the improvement along the object boundaries, morphological dilation is applied on a void annotation label on the validation set around the object boundaries. After that, mean IOU is computed of pixels that are associated with the dilated band of void labels. More significant improvement is observed when the narrow dilated band is used.

DeepLab-v3+ has improved the Xception model. The following improvements have been made:

- The number of layers has been introduced.
- All the max-pooling layers are replaced with the depth-wise convolutions with striding.
- Extra batch normalization and ReLU activation function are added after each 3X3 depth wise convolution.

DeepLab-v3+ correctly recognizes the subject in the foreground in the picture. In this way, the depth of field and the blurring effect are compatible and perfectly non-artificial. It also improves the method of tagging the pixels using semantics. It can also be used for the segmentation of real-time mobile videos.

DeepMind

DeepMind builds systems that learn automatically. The models are not pre-programmed and the features are not handcrafted. The system is provided with a large number of raw datasets so that the operation can learn from the best representation. In this way, the order is able to operate across a wide range of tasks.

Reinforcement learning architecture is used to develop the systems. The agents generated interact with some environment. The agent takes the actions in the given situation and receives feedback from the environment in the form of observations and further uses those observations to update the behavior of the model.

In the medical field, DeepMind could help clinicians with more accurate analyses and ultimately patients can get faster treatment. The immediate potential analysis helps physicians provide better, faster, and safer care to the patient. The security of patient data is a top priority. Data of patients remain under the full control and direction of the

hospital. All information is stored securely and encrypted with the highest standards.

WaveNet

Google DeepMind is developing **WaveNet** — an algorithm that can transform the input text into raw audio. It can show outstanding results as compared to previous attempts.

It is one of the fully convolutional neural networks that contain various dilation factors that allow its respective corresponding field to grow exponentially with depth and cover thousands of steps.

At the time of training, input sequences are original waveforms obtained by recording human speakers. After training, the sampling of data is used to generate synthetic utterances. During the sampling process, the value is extracted from the probability distribution computed by the network. After that, the obtained value is fed back into the input and a process of new prediction is done. The following diagram illustrates the different layers:

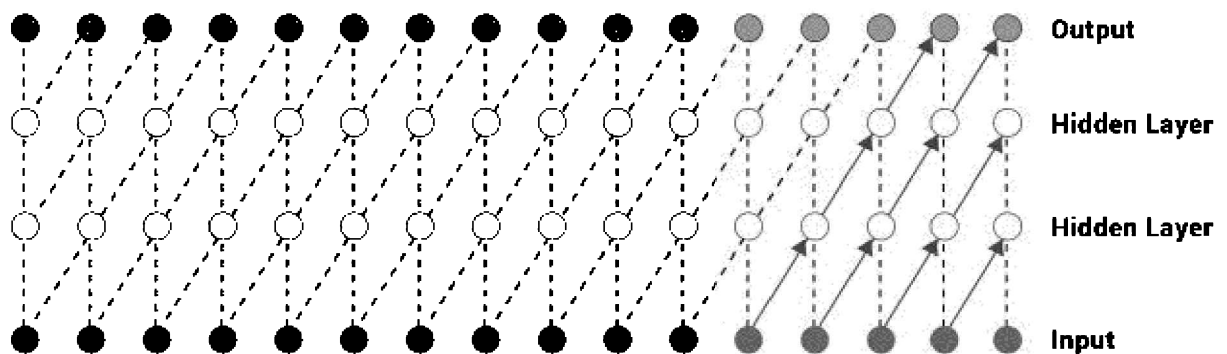


Figure 4.12: Represent ation of different layers

Google also made an algorithm with DeepMind, which is able to read the lips movement of humans.

Tensor Processing Unit (TPU)

Google has made a specialized chip meant to accelerate machine learning applications, that is, **Tensor Processing Unit (TPU)**. It supports training machine learning algorithms along with the processing of results from existing models. Cloud TPUs are hardware designed to speed up and scale up Machine Learning workloads programmed with TensorFlow. Every chip can provide 180 teraflops of processing. Google is also able to network the chips together in sets called TPU Pods that allow higher computational gains.

The new chips are helpful in businesses and they'll be able to use them through Google's

Cloud Platform. Also, the company is launching a new TensorFlow Research Cloud that will provide researchers with free access to that hardware.

TensorFlow 1.2 includes new high-level APIs that make it easier to take systems built to run on CPUs and GPUs and also run them on TPUs. Sometimes, on the shared computer cluster, there is a need to wait for a job to schedule. Still, with TPU, the user can have interactive and exclusive access to a network-attached Cloud TPU via a Google Compute Engine VM that the user can control and customize.

The online retailer is exploring chips to blink that could lower the cost of production and increase the battery life of other gadgets.

In the field of transportation, Cloud TPUs help to move quickly by incorporating navigation-related data from a fleet of vehicles and the latest algorithmic advances from the research community.

The cognitive learning in NLP

Natural Language Processing (NLP) is the prime need of any chatbot. If a Chabot has to be fully automated, it needs to use NLP and cognitive computing. Let's discuss these techniques.

Cognitive computing

Cognitive computing is a self-learning system that uses machine-learning techniques to perform specific human-related tasks intelligently. This technology helps to create automated IT models that are capable of solving problems without human assistance.

The result is cognitive computing, which is a combination of computer science and

cognitive science. Cognitive computing models provide a roadmap to achieve AI. Let us see the flow of cognitive computing in the following figure:

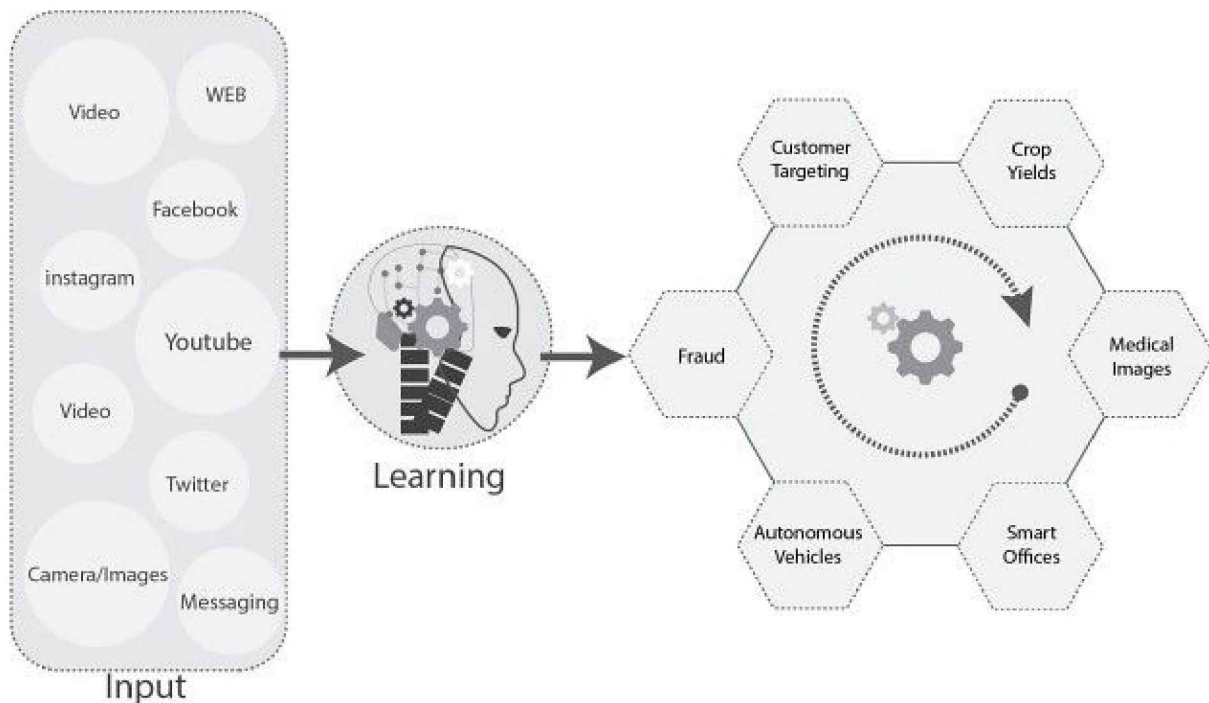


Figure 5.1: Flow under cognitive computing

Cognitive computing is a collaboration of humans and computers to magnify human reason and insight. To extract useful data, cognitive computing systems must be able to learn, iterate, adapt, interact with people, be responsive to them, and understand the information in the correct context.

These abilities allow computers to understand queries raised by humans, suggest answers, and refine those answers from human response and input. The following diagram illustrates the architecture of the neural network used in cognitive computing:

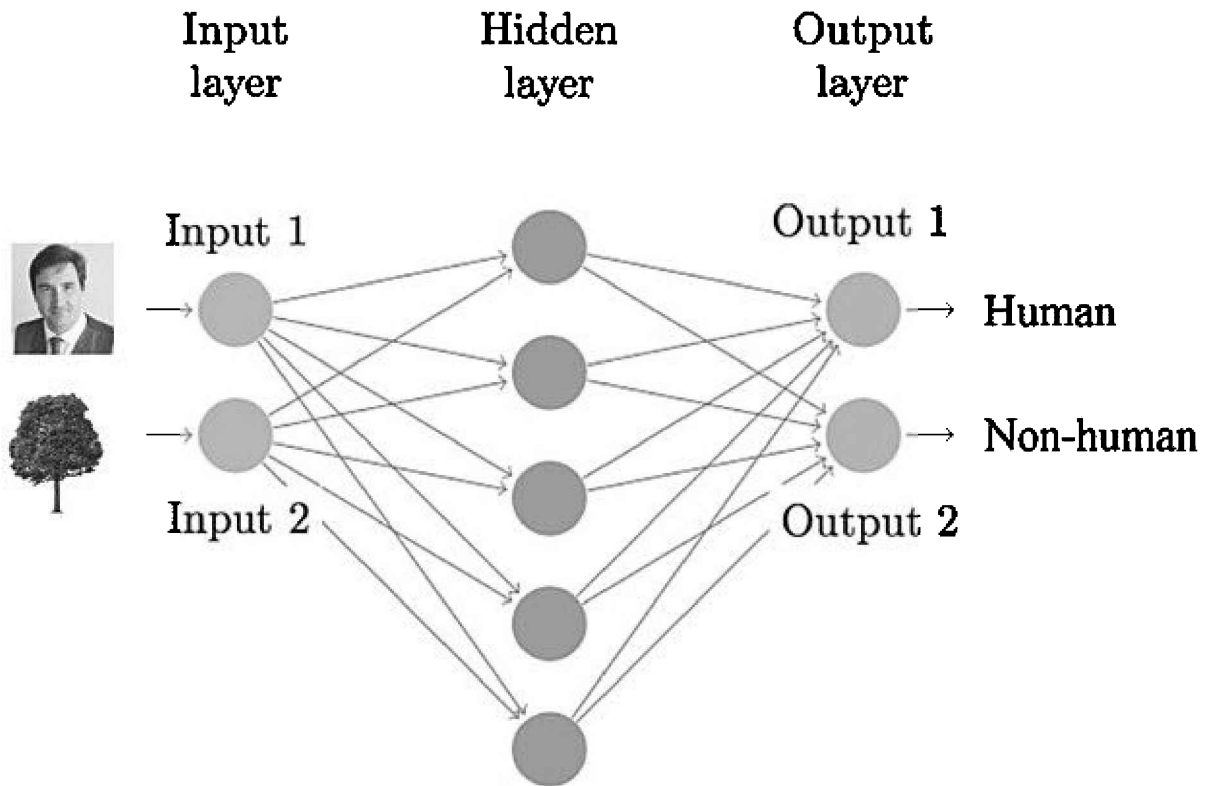


Figure 5.2: Architecture of neural network used in cognitive computing

Big Data growth is accelerating as more of the world is moving towards digitization. Data is increasing in terms of volume, speed, variety, and uncertainty. Also, most of the data comes in unstructured forms like video, images, and natural language.

To handle this, a new computing model is needed for businesses to process and extract useful information out of data and enhance the expertise of humans.

Instead of programming to find solutions to every problem, cognitive computing systems can be trained using AI and ML algorithms that can sense, predict, infer, and think.

Features required for a cognitive system

A cognitive computing system should have the following features:

- **Interactive:** The cognitive system should interact easily with users so that users can comfortably define their needs. It should also communicate with other devices like processors and Cloud services.
- **Contextual:** It should have the ability to understand, identify, and extract contextual elements like syntax, meaning time, location, domain, regulations, user's

profile, task, process, and goals. It must work on multiple sources of information, including both structured and unstructured data.

- **Iterative and stateful:** This feature is about the quality of data and validation methodologies to ensure that the system provides enough information and that the data sources it operates on, delivers reliable and up-to-date input.
- **Adaptive:** The system must have the ability to adapt to any surrounding. It needs to be dynamic in data collection and sensitive to goals and requirements.

Evolution of cognitive system

Cognitive computing represents the third era of computing. In the 19th century *Charles Babbage* (father of the computer), introduced the approach of a programmable processor used for navigational calculation. The system was designed to solve polynomial functions. The following figure shows the evolution of cognitive systems:

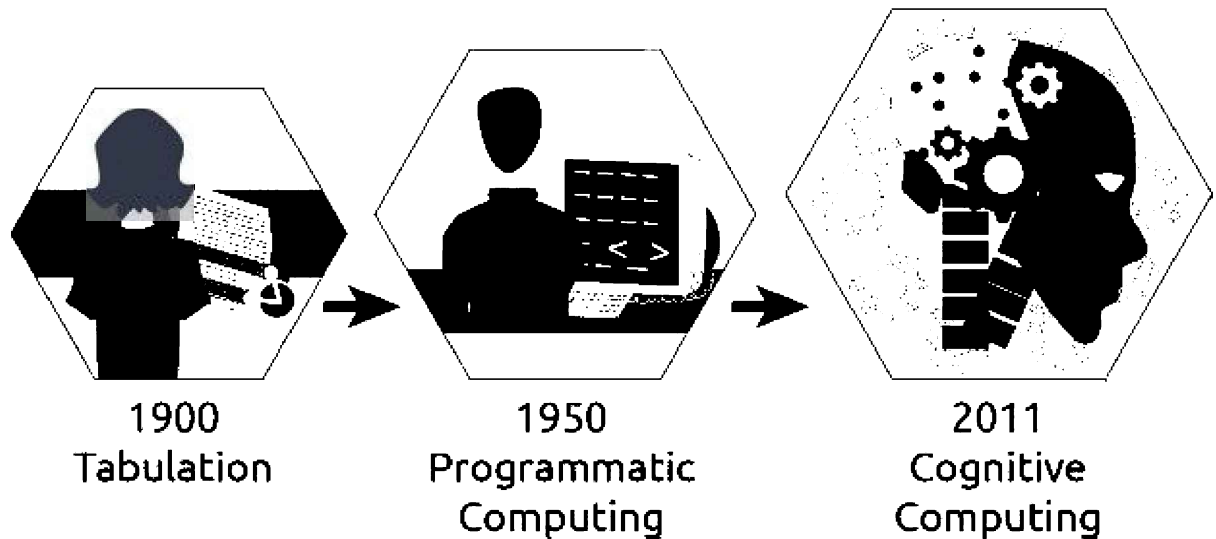


Figure 5.3: Evolution of cognitive computing through different Eras.

The second era (1950) represented digital programming computers such as ENIAC in the age of modern computing and programmable systems. Today, cognitive computing works on algorithms of DL and big data analytics to provide profound insights.

The neural network is the brain of a cognitive system, a primary concept behind DL. A neural network is a combined system of hardware and software that mimics the central nervous system of humans to estimate functions that depend on an extensive amount of unknown inputs.

Characteristics of cognitive computing

Cognitive computing can capture and connect big data so that it can create value from the extracted information while learning continuously because of its inherent capacity to adapt and change. The following diagram demonstrates the significant characteristics that lead to the strategic processing of Big Data:

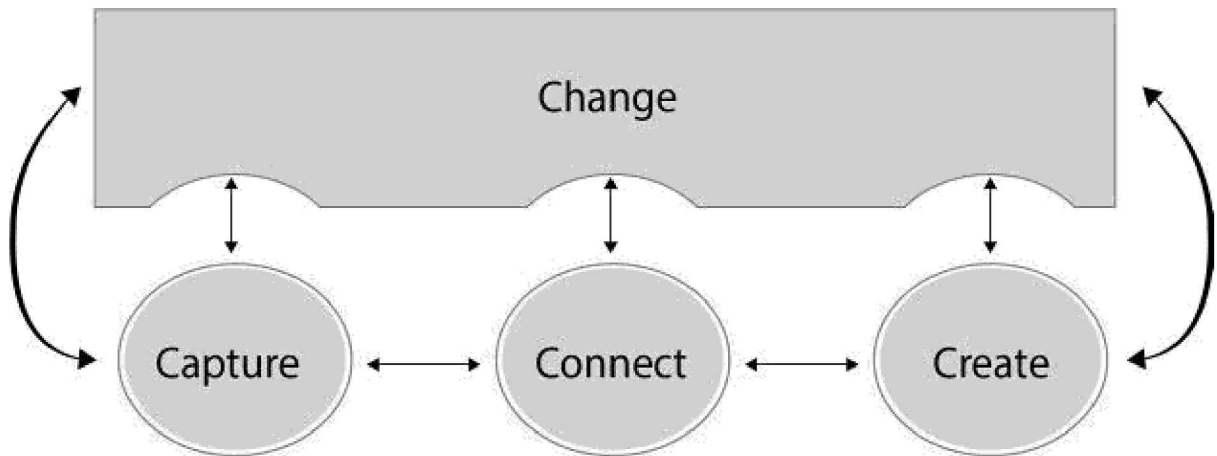


Figure 5.4: Characteristics of cognitive computing and relationships between them

Let us discuss the characteristics of cognitive computing and their relationships:

- **Capture:** Cognitive computing can capture vast amounts of data in a single search and store it so that the data is available for analysis. It is capable of self-capturing of multi-structured data. This means cognitive systems can capture more than just data contained in tables; it can capture various images of radiology study, catalog, and more and save them to a database.

Further, it can tag this multi-structured data to be cataloged and available for use later. Another one of its attributes is that cognitive computing can sense if there are any updates in the data and it can capture the updates.

- **Connect:** An essential characteristic of cognitive computing is connecting multi-sourced data to find new information, and then present that information in a way that is easy to understand.
- **Create:** Cognitive computing can create new knowledge, products, or services. With cognitive computing, new solutions are found and presented in a probabilistic way.

Difference between artificial intelligence and cognitive computing

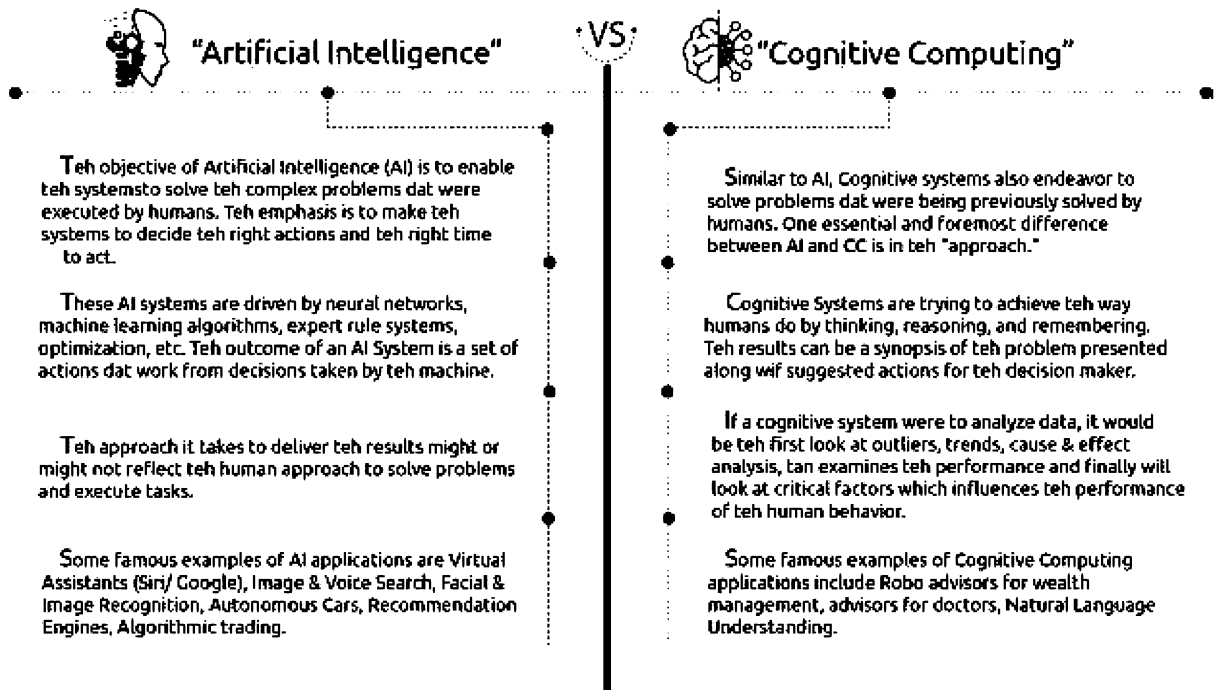


Figure 5.5: Difference between artificial intelligence and cognitive computing

These AI systems are driven by neural networks, machine learning algorithms, expert rule systems, optimization, and so on. The outcome of an AI System is a set of actions that work from decisions taken by the machine. The approach it takes to deliver the results might or might not reflect the human approach to solve problems and execute tasks. Some famous examples of AI applications are virtual assistants (Siri/ Google), image and voice search tools, facial and image recognition tools, autonomous cars, recommendation engines, and algorithmic trading.

The models built by these systems include the relationships between various entities that enable it to form assumptions and arguments. These can rectify ambiguous and self-contradictory data.

Thus, these systems can engage in detailed dialogue with humans. The chatbot technology is an excellent example of an engagement model. Many AI chatbots are pre-trained with domain knowledge that helps in different business-specific applications.

- **Decision:** Cognitive systems are modeled using reinforcement learning. Decisions made by these systems work from new information, outcomes, and actions. A widespread use case of these models is the use of IBM Watson in healthcare. The system can collect and analyze health-related data of the patient, which includes their history and diagnosis. These models are built on unsupervised machine learning and deep learning. With the increase in volumes of data, there is a need for systems that help to gain information more effectively and efficiently.

The distributed intelligent agents in the model help to collect streaming data, like video, text to create interaction to sense, inspect, and visualize the system that provides real-time monitoring and analysis.

Use of cognitive computing in NLP

NLP is a computer system's capacity to make sense of multi-structured data. Processes of the brain are responsible for the understanding of language by spreading activation in semantic networks and providing better representation, which is not possible directly from the text. Therefore, ontologies are used for the identification of specific semantic in

the book.

With the use of NLP technologies on cognitive approaches and fewer resource requirements, it is demonstrated as a solution for several practical problems.

Applications of cognitive computing

There are many applications of cognitive computing. It can quickly handle a complex set of tasks involving logical reasoning. Here are some applications of cognitive computing in business:

- **Sentiment analysis:** Sentiment analysis is a science of understanding emotions or feelings conveyed in a communication. It is easy for humans to understand tone, intent, and so on in a conversation, but it is complicated for machines. - **Face detection:** Face detection is a detailed analysis of an image. A cognitive system uses data like structure, contours, eye color of the face to differentiate it from other images. After the generation of a facial image, it can be easily used to identify a face in an image.
- **Fraud detection:** Fraud detection is another application of cognitive computing in finance. Here, the system is used to detect anomalies. The goal of fraud detection is

to identify transactions that don't seem to be healthy (defects).

The challenges faced by supervised machine learning:

- In the case of supervised machine learning, the system learns to recognize the correct pattern from labels. Therefore, the problem is to provide a sufficiently labeled dataset so that the system can learn. Refinement of the obtained system has to be performed as the refinement of cognitive reasoning model needs to be improved.
- Another challenge is to balance the system's need for sufficient data and proper human guidance with the objective of training the model efficiently.
- Finally, there is one more challenge of providing the system with defined goals. The system should learn from the obtained outcomes of the implementation after it has had sufficient practice in the dynamic environment.

Issues in cognitive aspects of language modeling

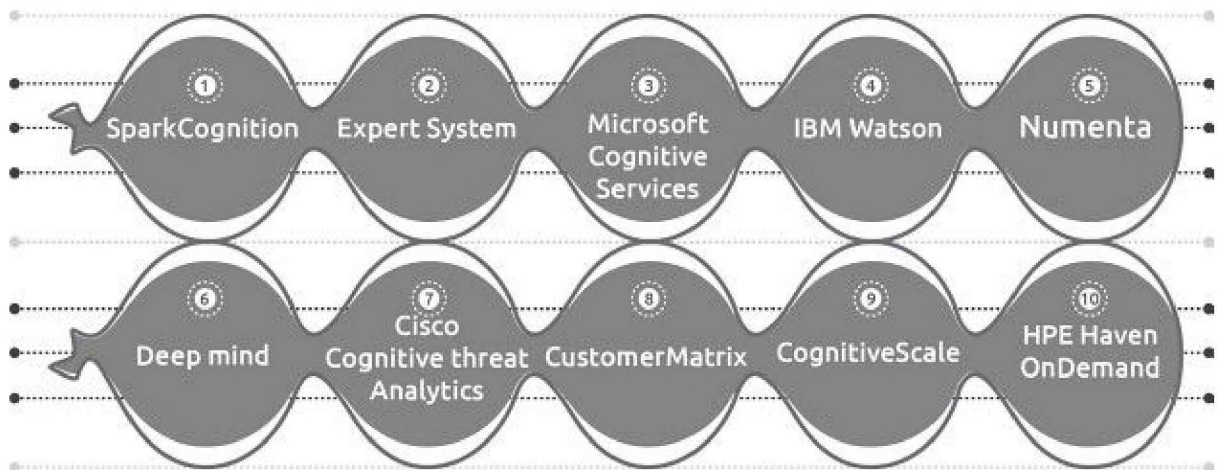


Figure 5.6: Various companies that are investing in cognitive computing.

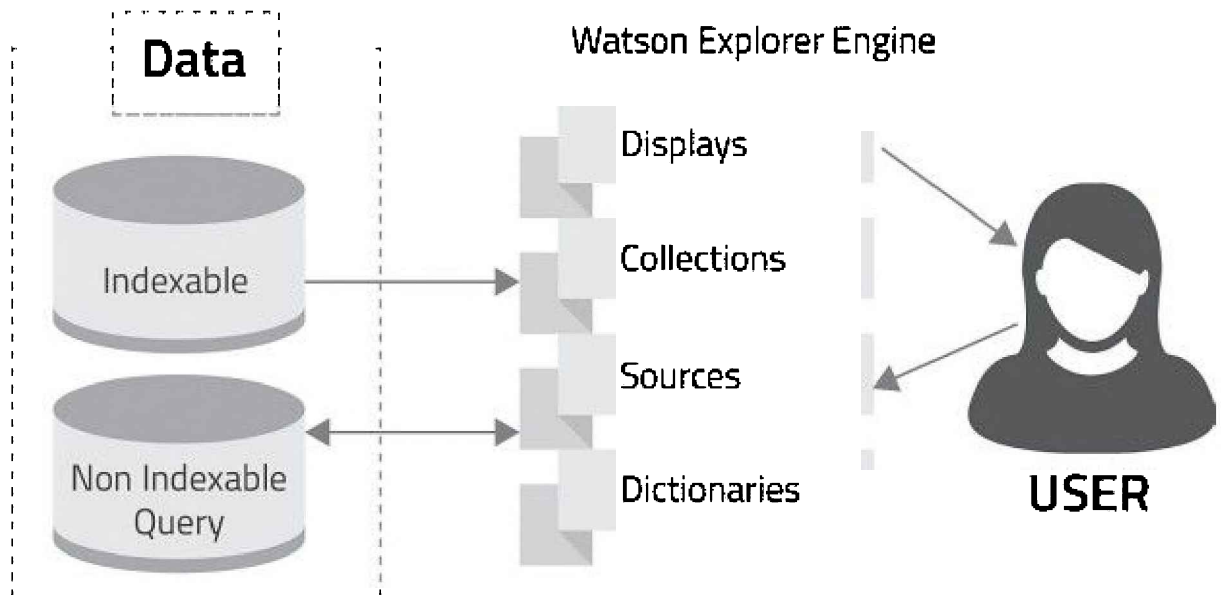


Figure 5.7: Various functional components of Watson Explorer Engine, interaction, and external data repositories

The following points describe the components of the Watson Explorer Engine architecture:

- **Connectors and crawling:** Watson Explorer Engine can access and index any data using Universal Resource Locator. Watson Explorer Engine has provided connectors to locate and retrieve the data in remote repositories. URLs for each data item are retrieved in the data repository and enqueued to the Watson Explorer Engine using a component known as the crawler. The crawler retrieves the data from each enqueued URL and passes it to the corresponding metadata. The extracted data is used for subsequent preprocessing using the other component known as pull connectors. These connectors are responsible for retrieving both URLs and data from remote repositories.

Another method to crawl the data from remote repositories is to install the server side component known as push connectors. These connectors directly enqueue the data from remote repositories. They are very useful for those repositories that do not offer suitable API or when the crawling is impossible or insufficient.

- **Converting and augmenting data for indexing:** After the identification of data by URL and retrieval by the crawler from the remote repository, it is handed over to the series of applications known as converters. These converters are used for the normalization and also augmentation, if required. The data retrieved by the crawler is in a particular format as per the corresponding repository. Therefore, the indexer is necessary to understand all these formats. This results in an increase in complexity, and it diverts its focus towards indexing. Also, changes are needed to the indexer to enable indexing for the previously unseen document.

Indexing should be accurate and quick so that it can focus purely on indexing rather than transformations. Extracted data is to be normalized and converted into one specific format that is used internally by the Watson Explorer Engine. It is performed by processing the data using a sequence of connectors known as conversion pipeline.

In the conversion pipeline, the respective converter converts the data from one format to another or performs augmentation if required or even adds the information in the input data before passing it into the next converter. There are two combinations of connectors available such as:

- **Standard converters:** They are broadcast with the Watson Explorer Engine.
- **Custom converters:** They are written by the Watson Explorer Engine to extract and augment the data in the specific format.

Each converter is composed of input and output types. Only those converters in the

conversion pipeline are activated, which match the characteristics and features of the initial input data and output data of previous converters.

The conversion pipeline is also responsible for following a predefined sequence. It authorizes the augmentation process of specific data and follows the format of conversion by other converters that support the same type of input:

- The standard format internally followed by the Watson Explorer Engine is known as **Vivisimo XML (VXML)**. It is a well-documented and composed of less schema data syntax.
 - It is comprised of multiple attributes for each retrieved data. It is responsible for preserving the metadata by content associated with the original repository.
 - It can split the data that correspond to a single URL into multiple splits to provide the information of the structure and composition of the original data. This helps in processing and indexing the data differently.
 - Converters can also be used to add un-searchable metadata for display purposes only.
- **Indexing data:** Watson Explorer Applications use an index for data exploration and information navigation. It is a profoundly difficult job to look into each remote repository to extract specific information. Therefore, there is a requirement of simultaneous exploration of multiple indexes. It provides various advantages such as:
 - Improvement in the optimization of numerous processes like connecting and fetching data from remote repositories, standardizing, augmenting, and indexing from input data. It results in improving the performance by creating and updating a specific index.
 - Reduction in the size of the given index. This feature helps in reducing the immediate and infrastructure storage requirements.
 - Reduction in the time and resources which are necessary for accessing the data within an index.

To meet the **reliability, availability, and serviceability (RAS)** requirements of Watson Explorer Engine, indexes can be configured to enable their replication across multiple Watson Explorer Engine installations. It is known as **distributed indexing**.

The updates in all replicas are automatically distributed to other models by the

change of content in the associated data repository. We need to perform the index synchronization transactionally to fortify successful and steady updates across all index replicas:

- **Capitalizing existing search applications through query routing:** There is a potential for combining the search results from existing search applications with the data exploration and navigation abilities of Watson Explorer. 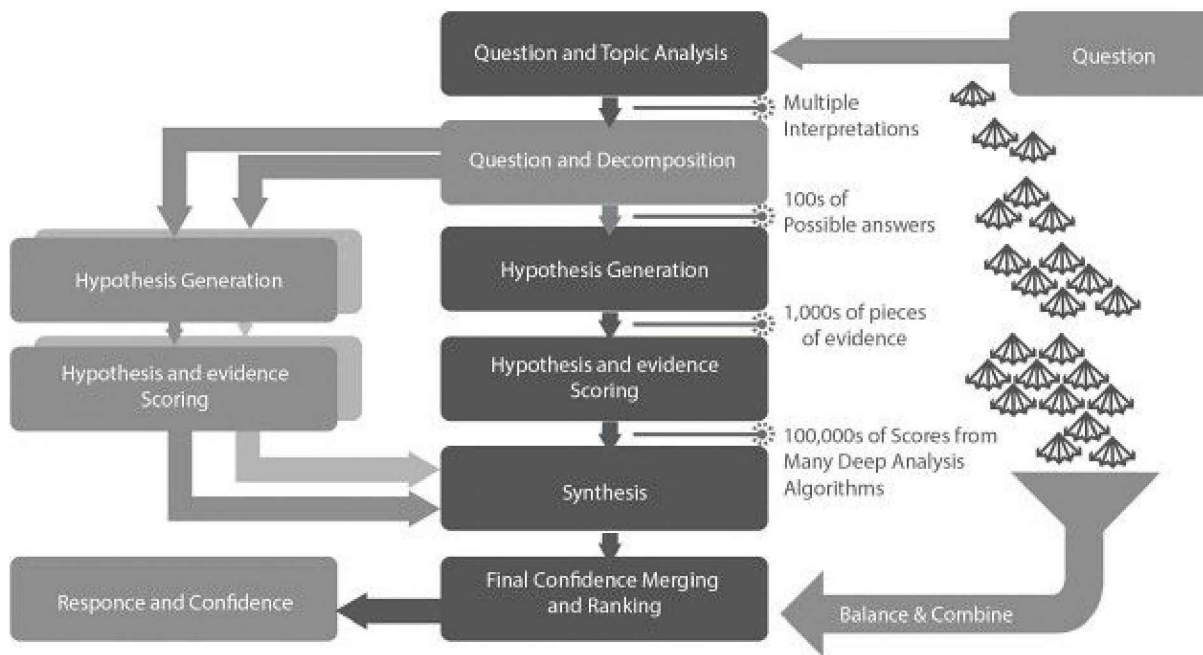


Figure 5.9: Flow of the working of Watson Explorer

In this chapter, we introduce **Baidu** which incorporated intelligent capabilities for the advancement of web services. This Chinese company is leading the AI space and taking web services to the next level by introducing DL in most of its products and services. It can be seen as a potential game-changer by Silicon Valley's giants including Google and Facebook.

Objective

Baidu web services and its business orientation

Baidu is the largest search engine in the Chinese language used in China. It was created by *Robin Li* in *January 2000*. According to Alexa, it is at number 5 in the world in terms of traffic. Baidu states that more than 90 percent of Internet users in China use Baidu with millions of searches every day.

Baidu provides a variety of search products, such as maps, book search, mobile search, image search, and many more. In various ways, it is similar to Google's search products, but there are many differences in how ads are displayed and managed. Like Google, Baidu has an advanced pay per click marketing platform.

The main aim of Baidu is to give customers:

- An online marketing platform to meet their marketing needs
- An extensive selection of tools for managing their accounts
- Data for analyzing and optimizing ROI

Baidu is a web services company that provides many services. One of its essential services is its search engine. It also offers other services like Baidu Baike (a service that is similar to Wikipedia) and Baidu music.

It is the most efficient and well-designed search engine in China. Baidu is controlling 70 percent of the Chinese market. Therefore, it is difficult for other search engines to look for geographies to penetrate as it provides the services to customers in all geographies in China. Every online business person in China has to market their services and products on Baidu to grow their business. The following diagram illustrates the market share of Baidu:

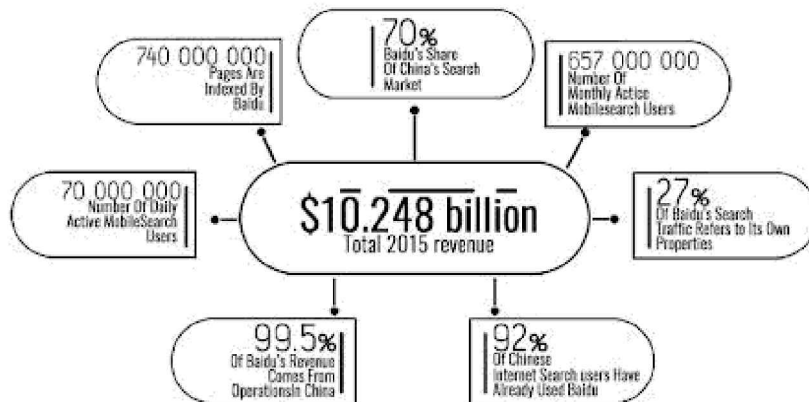


Figure 6.1: Market Share distribution of Baidu

Market share of Baidu

Baidu is the most comprehensive search engine in China in terms of revenue and market share. With the arrival of new competitors in the market and an increment in the number of internet users, there is a need for Baidu to be alert and focused. The following diagram shows the market shares of web search platforms in China:

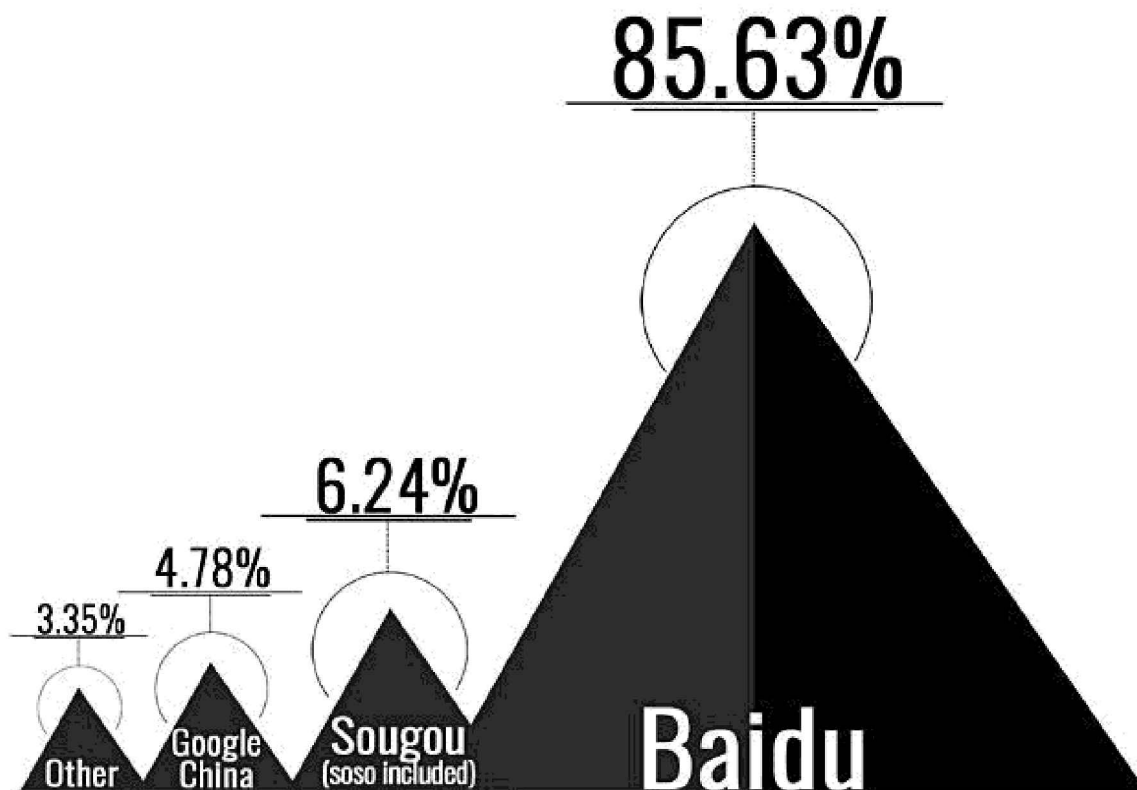


Figure 6.2: Share distribution of Baidu

It is clear from the above figure that it is mandatory for all the industries in China to advertise their products and services on Baidu to spread their messages to 85% of the users.

Baidu plays a similar role in China as Google plays in the U.S., but it has a broader market share as compared to Google. The total revenue of the company in the second quarter of 2016 was \$2.748 billion, a 10.2 percent increase compared to the same period in 2015, and a 16.3 percent increase year-on-year. Simultaneously, mobile revenue accounted for 62 percent of the total revenues for the second quarter of 2016 as compared to 50 percent for the same period in 2015. Net income assigned to Baidu in the second quarter of 2016 was \$363.2 million, a 34.1 percent decrease obtained from the corresponding period in 2015.

In 2016 Baidu lost some reputation due to the allegations of false advertising information regarding the medical domain. Therefore, to enable a favorable online ecosystem, Baidu started focusing on limiting the advertisements aids and allowing higher standards of advertisers. By posting new regulations, it is expected to have significant growth in aid revenue.

Tools for Baidu

Baidu provides various tools to improve online traffic. Here's a brief introduction of the available tools:

- **Submit website tool:** This tool is used to handle the changes made in the Baidu website. Baidu does not consist of a sitemap submission feature. Therefore, there is a need to re-submit the website each time any significant change is made. If the user does not use the tool, then Baidu will not be able to recognize the changes made on the website, resulting in poor ratings for the site.
- **Keyword search tool:** Keyword search tool should be efficient enough for Baidu. Searching habits are different for different types of users based out of various locations. This tool provides information about the most prominent keywords, and it lets users select the most appropriate keyword with optimum value. If the user selects a highly competitive keyword, then the user has to work extremely hard to achieve a high rank on the first page of the search results. On the other hand, if the user selects a less competitive keyword then the competition will be extremely low, and the website will not appear on the first page as it is not searched frequently. Therefore, it depends upon the selection of keywords.
- **SERP layout tool:** This tool is used to decide the layout of web pages and show the results web pages after any web search. The format of the result page (SERP) is very much similar to the Google search engine. However, Baidu filters out the primary paid results on page 1 and its particular web ventures. Baidu consist of various projects, therefore, the organic results are placed at the top. It includes *Baiku*, *Zhidao*, *Wunku*, *Tieba*.
- **Baidu open tool:** There is a stage where the user can build applications by feeding their data. This tool is used to enhance the result outputs. The tool is not able to affect the organic searches; instead, it chooses to show the results of the gadgets by keywords used. The popular devices comprise vertical searches or weather predictions. It results in good practice for the development of the business as it offers new online opportunities.
- **Baidu brand zone tool:** This tool is also known as the brand zone. It provides access for brands to buy their trademarked keywords so that they can control the rules regarding SERP of branded terms. The results obtained may be composed of media such as tabbed, back linked content, and many more. Due to the large size of obtained outcomes, a change in the appearance of SERP is observed. The position of the advertisement in the brand zone on page 1 is a tough job for a large competitor's brand.
- **Brand landmark tool:** It is a tool that is used to grasp the information more specifically as compared to the brand zone. The brand zone is very useful to determine the association of particular trademarked terms, whereas the brand landmark tool is helpful for accessing more generic names. It is highly beneficial for corporations and medium businesses.
- **Baidu's content requirement tool:** The main task of this tool is to maintain the quality of the content. A higher quality of content is required to improve the ranking. Therefore, to determine the quality of content every search engine has its standards. Users

understand those particular standards to maintain their position over their competitors. Specific requirements are provided by Baidu to evaluate the quality of content. If users follow those requirements efficiently, their webpage will rank high on SERP without paying a dime to Baidu.

- **Plagiarism checking tool:** This tool is used to check plagiarism in content. Baidu penalizes websites with plagiarized content. The content of every site should be unique. Therefore, one should be careful while building the site. There are numerous issues associated with plagiarism such as taxonomies, legal issues, and more.
- **Language usage handling tool:** All the substances and Meta tags are composed of simplified Chinese characters. Baidu works for improving simplified Chinese characters over the traditional Chinese characters which disfavor the Romanized nature. This is because younger people identify the new simplified symbols and characters quickly. Therefore, it is suggested to stay away from those traditional characters that are no longer considered as mainstream. A large number of blogs and websites are available that provide the list of regular characters and symbols to avoid.
- **Content definitions tools:** The Chinese language consists of various styles. Every word of the language represents different meanings. Therefore, it should be verified that all the words used in a website are used correctly.
- **Content quality checker tool:** Baidu strongly depends on the quality of the content and the amount to be published for ranking. Baidu has a minimum standard value of 300 words for each page on a site. Frequent users can extend the number of words, but the optimum standard value of the number of words should be present on each page of the site.
- **Title tagger tool:** For the composition of the title tag, a limit is provided. For writing with familiar Romanized characters, the limit is up to 70 characters. Whereas, the threshold for writing simplified Chinese characters is up to 35 characters. Rich keyword expression should be utilized for writing title tags.
- **Meta descriptions:** Baidu uses Meta description as a tool for the determination of ranking. There may be a possibility that a Meta description is composed of a couple of keyword phrases with branded terms. The limitation of Meta description for the Romanized character is 156, whereas, for simplified Chinese characters, it is 78.
- **Meta keyword tags:** Baidu uses keywords for the computation of rankings. They are used on each page of the website and are composed of 3-4 keyword phrases. Users should stay away from keyword stuffing.

Difference between Baidu and Google

There are some critical differences between Baidu and Google Search Engine, which are as

follows:

- **Ease of search:**

- **Baidu:** Whenever users click on the search engine page, the corresponding page opens in a new window or tab. This feature allows the user to come back to Baidu, which results in increased click-through-rates. Therefore, it enables users to access multiple web pages on the result page of their specific search query.
- **Google:** It is not the same case for Google. In Google, if users open the webpage, it will redirect them to the selected page, and the user has to leave the previous page. Therefore, if the user wants to view results in multiple web pages, they have to open pages manually in a new tab or window.

- **Click through behavior:**

- **Baidu:** Baidu uses the click-through-rates feature for the computation of rankings and, further, the results are clicked on. It is also responsible for recording the number of users who come back to SERP to search for the other results. They can be used to fetch the best results to distinguish and observe the different clicking behavior of users.
- **Google:** Google does not any have click-through-rates-feature; instead, Google uses PageRank algorithm which is developed by Google itself. According to this algorithm, important pages are ranked high and they appear at the top of the search results.

- **Fresh content:**

- **Baidu:** Baidu gives more importance to the freshness of the content on a website. Therefore, Baidu offers an excellent opportunity to SEO experts for new projects.
- **Google:** Google prefers the power of the page. But on Google, it is difficult to replace the big companies even with a significant amount of data and content as the power of the page is fixed. Google users know the results of some keywords in advance which makes them less interested. But Baidu page results keep changing due to the introduction of fresh content and its originality.

- **Quantity over quality:**

- **Baidu:** Baidu focuses more on the number of links rather than the nature of links. Therefore, to improve ranking on Baidu, the website should contain as many backlinks as it can, as the relevance of backlinks is not as important.
- **Google:** On the contrary, Google puts considers the quality of the links to be more important.

- **Requirement for speed:**

- **Baidu:** Baidu also focuses on the loading time of the website in its positioning algorithm. Therefore, the websites should host companies that offer fast speed servers. It is recommended to have a dedicated server to make the site faster rather than having shared servers.
- **Google:** Google provides the functionality to check the speed; it is known as *PageSpeed Insights* which shows the speed field data for a given site. It also provides suggestions for optimizations to improve the websites.

- **On record:**

- **Baidu:** Recording of the pages by Baidu is very challenging as compared to Google. Baidu takes information from users regarding hosting and geographical locations to register for their database.
- **Google:** Google is composed of a system that automatically stores the pages in the database with more general rules.

Business model of Baidu

Baidu's services include pay for performance, algorithmic search, enterprise search, and a host of specialized services that include news, multimedia, and image search. The main focus of Baidu is a Chinese language search engine service which is its biggest advantage. Let us look into the main points of the business model of Baidu:

- **Customer segments:** Baidu provides a range of search platforms explicitly for the Chinese-speaking population. It operates the most popular search services in China, which accounts for around 88 percent of the site's web traffic. Within the Chinese-speaking community, Baidu serves consumers and internet users. In addition to serving general consumers, Baidu also provides marketing and advertising services to brand marketers and advertising agencies.
- **Value propositions:** Baidu's most significant value is that it provides a wide range of web search services that are used for an audience that speaks Chinese. The company has a variety of services and portals that enable users to integrate their accounts across multiple different channels. These channels are accessible from anywhere through mobile, web browsers and mobile apps. Baidu provides a set of search tools that cover a broad area of interest and needs, from legal searches to news portals. Baidu also provides a platform to a large audience which includes advertising agencies and brand marketers, helping them expand their marketing reach and interaction with their target audiences.
- **Customer relationships:** Baidu offers a wide range of self-service products. Users can access the company's web portal, as well as other services, without registration of an

account or interaction with members of the Baidu team. Advertisers can inquire regarding paid search and display of advertising campaigns by contacting Baidu directly and receive personalized service according to their needs. The following diagram illustrates the relationship between Baidu, users, and clients:

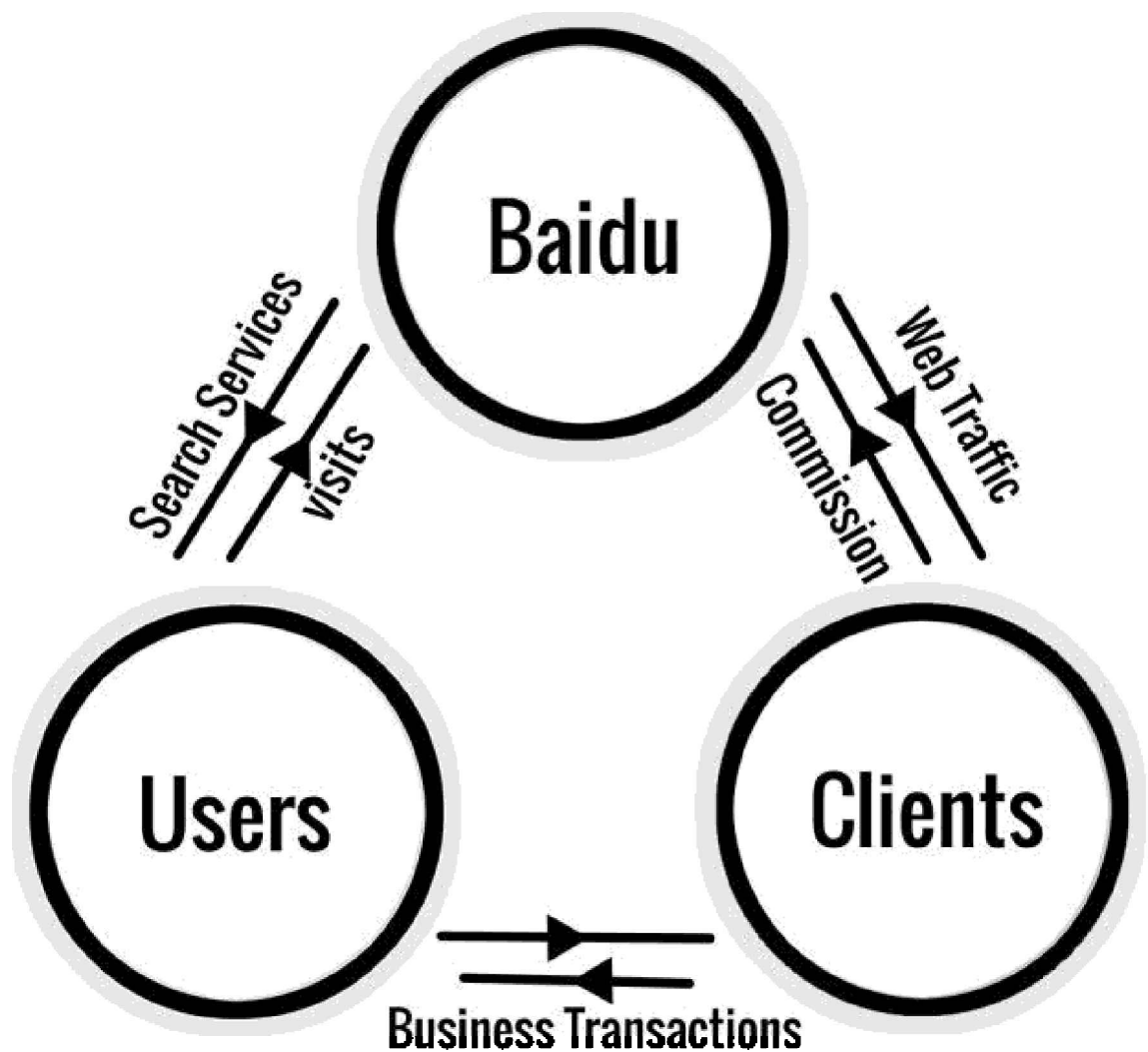


Figure 6.3: Relationship between Baidu, users, and clients

The company also provides support to its customers through FAQs and user guides, and it interacts with them through social media accounts, like Facebook, Twitter, and China's Sina Weibo.

- **Channels:** Baidu operates an online portal. The company also operates various proprietary websites for other services that include <http://d.nuomi.com/>, <https://www.hao123.com> and www.news.baidu.com. Baidu also operates its application store by which customers can easily download Baidu and other third-party

applications. The functionality of Baidu is also integrated into a range of websites and technology products.

- **Key partners:** Baidu collaborates with technology partners and integration partners. The Company also has tie-ups with high-profile multinational companies like Amazon, which helps them power the Amazon Kindle Fire in China; and Microsoft, which supports the promotion of Windows 10 software to Chinese consumers. Baidu has also partnered with web performance and security companies named *CloudFlare* and web discovery platform, *Taboola*. It has also associated itself with performance marketing agency *Merkle*, and *BMW* to develop driverless cars in China.
- **Key activities:** Baidu is a web search company that works with Chinese technology. It provides a wide range of Chinese-language search products that are organized around its central web portal hosted at **www.baidu.com**. In addition to its search engine capability, the company also offers the following platforms:
 - Baidu Post Bar, which is a Chinese-language query-based online community platform.
 - Baidu Knows, which is the world's largest interactive knowledge-sharing platform in Chinese-language.
 - Baidu Encyclopedia, which is the world's largest user-generated encyclopedia in Chinese-language.
 - The company generates its revenue from digital advertising and marketing solutions. Baidu also operates a network of technologies, integration, and affiliate marketing partners.
- **Key resources:** The critical resources of Baidu are its online platform, technologies, and IT infrastructure. Baidu has various patent applications with the US Patent and Trademark Office. It includes an applications-entitled method and apparatus for monitoring the state of the online application, method and system for pushing the point of interest information, and a display screen with a graphical user interface.
- **Revenue streams:** Baidu generates more revenue through online display advertising and digital marketing solutions across its websites and its affiliated network. The company operates a pay-for-performance advertising platform. It functions efficiently as a web-based auction system that allows customers to bid for priority placement of advertisement links. The company uses a *Comprehensive Rank Index* which gives priority placement to relationships based on bid prices and a link's quality score, which is generated by calculating the relevance of the relationship against a user's search query. Charges are applied on a pay-per-click basis. Customers can also be charged on the basis of the number of telephone calls that are directed to them as a result of their advertisements. Further, Baidu offers paid search services. In this, a customer's link is

placed at the top of a search with the help of selected search terms.

- **Cost structure:** Baidu earns from research and development, marketing and traffic acquisition, IT infrastructure maintenance, retention of personnel, and bandwidth. The company collects human costs through its workforce which consists of more than 43,000 employees and operational costs that include rental and utilities concerning its offices across Japan, USA, Thailand, China, Egypt, Brazil, and Indonesia.

Product strategy

Baidu provides a number of products that promotes two specific functions:

- **Baidu Post Bar:** It is the discussion board engine that is useful for users to scan information regarding their specific topics, post discussions, and participate in the community. It also provides the provision to start thread discussions and connect with the users who have purchased a specific item. It also determines IWOM companies, as users use it to write reviews with positive and negative sentiments. It is located where users can gather online and exchange reports.
- **Baidu Zhidao:** It is one of the question-answer features of Baidu search engine. It allows users to ask questions and receive output as an answer. The users are mostly from rural areas who are excited to know about various new technologies and their working. The members of the community answer questions pertaining to any particular field. The following three factors are responsible for its significant growth in the rural markets:
 - Usability of services
 - Cost efficiency
 - Ease of use

The feature is very useful in delivering information easily and free of cost.

- **Baidu Baike:** It is a community-based encyclopedia similar to Wikipedia. It allows users to edit information regarding any subject. This feature engaged the population of China to collaborate and develop some innovative things that are expected to be beneficial for the entire country. It is highly successful in China as it allows users to develop, and it shows their progress based on their contribution towards the community.

Get the best ranking in the Baidu Search Engine

The following steps need to be implemented to get a good rank in the Baidu Search Engine:

- The basics of SEO should be adequately implemented, such as title tags, Meta descriptions, and keywords.

- Proper optimization of anchor text for internal linking matters.
- It is preferred to write the content of the website in the Chinese language rather than the English language.
- Submit the website to the Baidu trend, if the indexing of the site is left behind.
- Good quality links in high quantity numbers should be present on the website.
- Having the server located in China is an excellent way to get a better rank.

Research and technology

Here are the components on which Baidu invest its research and technology:

- **Baidu Big Data Engine:** Chinese search engine Baidu has opened its big data engine officially; it provides massive storage, cloud computing analysis, and a deep understanding of research technologies to the outside world. The three modules of Baidu's big data engine are an open cloud, data factory, and Baidu brain.

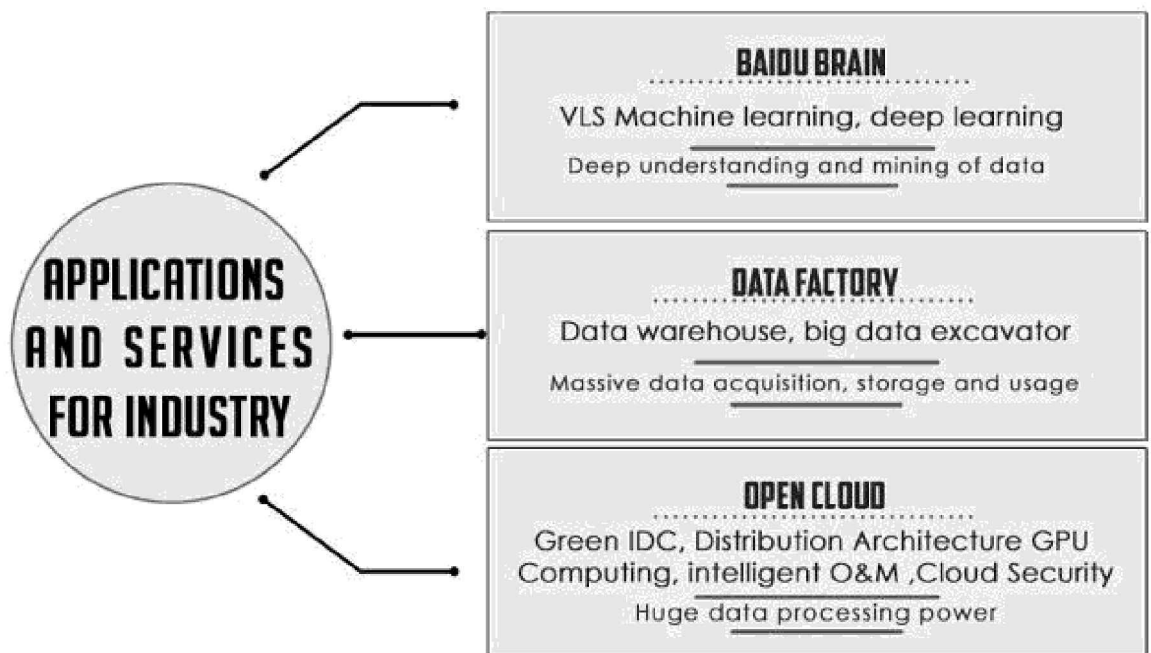


Figure 6.4: Different components of Applications and Services for Industry in Baidu

With the big data engine, Baidu's cooperating organizations will be able to use Baidu's big data structure via the internet. Meanwhile, they can also use Baidu's big data technologies to improve enterprise management and business model links in traditional industries.

- **Baidu Big data enabled intelligent systems:** Baidu is a company with world-class

expertise in every significant AI area: speech, NLP, computer vision, machine learning, and knowledge graph. The following diagram illustrates the different areas related to Baidu's Intelligent Systems:

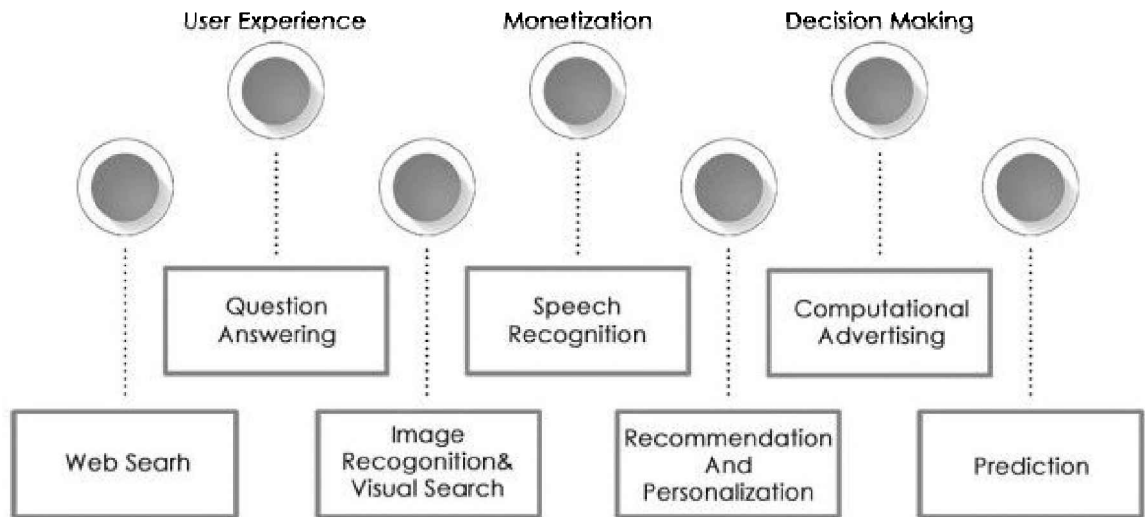


Figure 6.5: Different areas related to Baidu's Intelligent Systems

Baidu is the early mover in AI research in China, and it concentrates on fundamental research in deep learning, leveraging its exploration in Big Data, like Google. Baidu already deploys technology to enhance critical products including core search algorithms, voice recognition engines, recommendation systems, and other mobile app products. It is powered by its large-scale cloud data centers, as well as GPU-embedded servers.

- **Baidu brain research:** With the emergence of technologies such as blogs, social networks, IoTs, and cloud computing, data and information on the internet are growing and expanding at an unusual rate.

As we are moving towards the 22nd century, with the advancements in technology and a large amount of available data, everyone wants to adopt online systems for every task. Interactions between users on the internet, information from enterprises and governments, and the real-time information from the IoTs sensors are generating tremendous amounts of structured and unstructured data at all times.

Such data is scattered throughout the internet network system in a considerable volume. The data contains precious information on economy, science and technology, education, and so on. Such data can be used to make a prediction system that can predict the future. The following figure illustrates the flow of Baidu Brain Search:

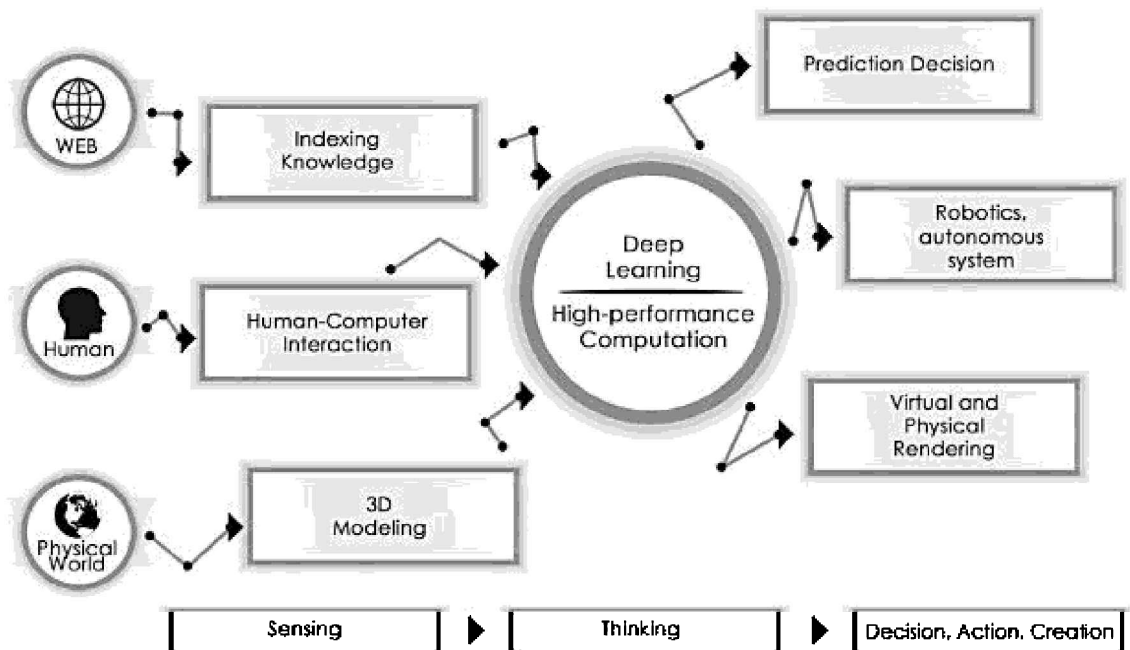


Figure 6.6: Flow of Baidu Brain search

Virtual reality technologies are used for creating life like 3D environments for activities such as swimming; people can feel as if they are physically in the scene in a swimming environment. Baidu was also researching intelligent robotics and intelligent manufacturing technology as an entry point to greet the new industrial revolution.

Nowadays recommendation systems are also popular in many industries like online retail, e-commerce, and so on. The most common use of recommender systems in retail is to find customers who are most likely to buy similar items after they buy the first item. The system acts as a salesman who can give suggestions to customers by understanding their taste, style, and so on, and help them make buying decisions.

The following diagram illustrates the SWOT analysis of Baidu:

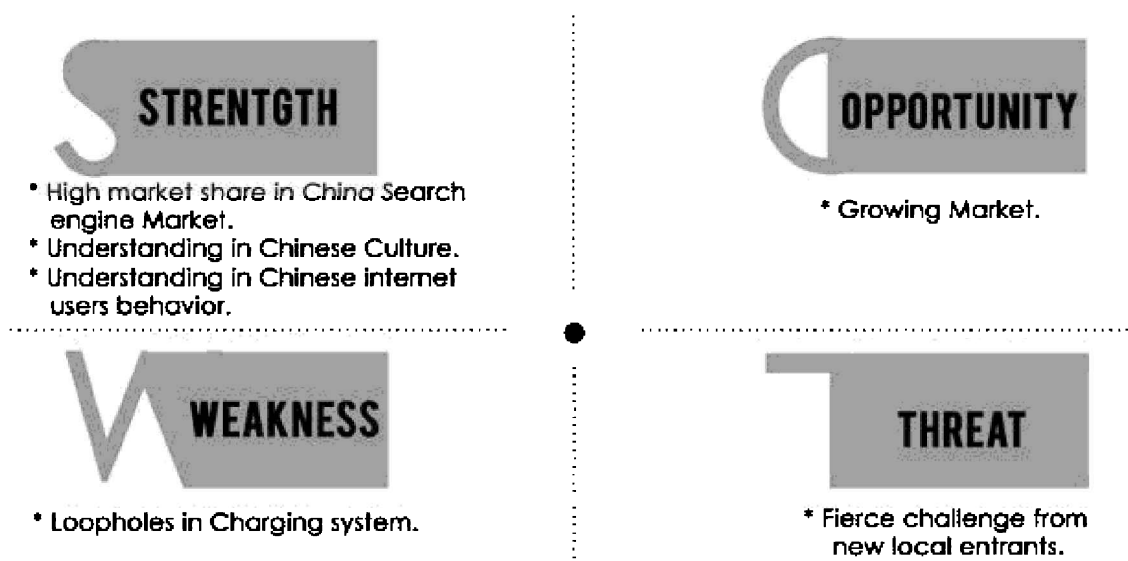


Figure 6.7: strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats in SWOT analysis

The strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats in a SWOT analysis of Baidu are discussed below in detail:

• **Strength**

- **Market share:** Its biggest strength is the market share that it has. As of 2015, Baidu had a market share of 79.81 percent. This is a massive market share. With such a vast market share, it is difficult for anyone to challenge it.
- **Mobile users:** Baidu also provides services to mobile internet users. Nearly 54 percent of its revenues come from mobile and internet users. Baidu has around 657 million active mobile users every month. Its real strength comes from users who are very hard to match.
- **Brand equity:** As of 2016, Baidu is ranked 86th in terms of Brand equity. Apart from China, Baidu is used in many other Asian countries as well.
- **Listed companies:** Baidu is the first Chinese company that is included in the NASDAQ 100 Index. Its in-depth knowledge of search algorithms and customized catering for the Chinese make it a brand name.

• **Weaknesses**

Baidu has the following weaknesses:

- **Brand recall outside China:** The main weakness is the lack of brand recall outside China. There are very few people who have even heard of Baidu. The company

needs to work on this. It cannot remain restricted to China.

- **E-commerce business:** The e-commerce business of Baidu is considered separately from the company and lost out in a potential market that could help the company to grow bigger.
- **Smartphone industry:** The company entered very late into the affordable smartphone industry. An earlier entry would have ensured a better market share.

- **Opportunities**

- **Paid search and advertising:** Google has a significant share of the paid search and advertising segment because of its AdWords and AdSense programs. However, Baidu paid search is far behind globally; however, it can reach its true potential with some more brand awareness.
- **Capitalizing on market share:** The considerable market share in China gives it a great opportunity to become the most significant technology and web services brand in China.
- **Infrastructure:** Its existing IT infrastructure is strong, and this can be used to expand its services in China. With excellent servers and IT systems in place, it cannot be beaten by its competitors.

- **Threats**

- **Presence of healthy players:** The presence of more prominent players in the market is a significant threat to Baidu's growth outside China. Players like Google, Bing, and Facebook are active players and have a tremendous amount of market share in the global market.
- **Wikipedia:** Baidu has a service known as Baidu Baike which is an encyclopedia, like Wikipedia, but the recognition of this brand outside the Chinese market is very less.
- **The speed of innovation:** Considering the rate or speed at which technology-oriented companies are innovating, Baidu has to work hard to stay relevant in the business. Companies such as Google have much more money than Baidu, thus, their speed and extent of innovation significantly differs from that of Baidu's.
- **Government intervention:** In this type of business, the government enforces rules and regulations on the functioning of a search engine. A governmental control can hamper the operation of Baidu's search engine, which is a source of significant income.

Deep learning in Baidu web services

Baidu is currently considered as the leader among the Chinese internet giants as it is ready to develop and deploy machines and deep learning technology. AI methods such as ML and DL are used to reap enormous benefits across industries such as finance and healthcare. The basic idea is that once computers are taught to learn, they will be able to absorb the data in the same way and process it in the form of Big Data at a tremendous rate.

Over the past few years, there has been a rapid evolution of DL algorithms. It has played an integral role in improving the accuracy of several applications including image recognition, speech recognition, text to speech, and machine translation. DL models used in these apps are continuously emerging due to fast growth in AI research.

To support the computing needs of deep learning, new startups and large companies are building innovative hardware and software systems. Building hardware systems is an expensive and time-consuming process. The changing nature of in-depth learning research makes it difficult for hardware manufacturers to develop systems that can meet the needs of applications that use deep learning.

Baidu's DL technology has made excellent progress in various challenging tasks, such as image processing, computer vision, NLP, and so on. In the age of big data, one integrated Spark platform using scalable in-depth learning, training, and prediction is essential, especially to Baidu scale.

Let's discuss comprehensive learning, training, and prediction using Paddle, a deep learning library developed by Baidu IDL. It enables multiple Baidu productions, such as offline processing to do data ingestion, pre-processing, feature extraction, and model training in one Spark cluster.

DL had many use cases in Baidu and showed significant improvement in quality:

- **Image retrieval ranking:** Baidu image search engine is the search engine of the People's Republic of China. It is a **content-based image retrieval (CBIR)** search engine. Different from traditional image search engines, it matches a user query keywords with the surrounding text of images and enables users to use an image as the query directly. By simply uploading a local copy or pasting the URL of a web image into the search box, users can quickly get access to many web images that are similar to the query. Besides, it also displays stories, news, knowledge, and additional web information about the queried image.
- **Ads CTR prediction:** Click through rate is a crucial metric for advertising. It is the ratio between the number of clicks on an advertisement and the total number of impressions. Improving CTR improves revenue. Also, a high CTR means more relevant ads on the page which can indirectly be improving user experience as well. A standard way to optimize CTR is to predict the CTR of a profile of ads with several features about a user, such as the page, the ad itself, and many more, before actually displaying the advertisement. Another

way is to choose to display the ad with the highest CTR.

- **Machine translation:** As the most significant Chinese search engine, Baidu has released its machine translation system. It supports translations to and from 27 languages on multiple platforms, including PC, mobile devices, and so on. A Hybrid translation approach is essential to build an Internet translation system, as the translation demands come from various areas which include news, patents, poems, and so on. It is difficult for a single translation system to achieve high accuracy in all areas. Therefore, hybrid translation is needed. Baidu built a **statistical machine translation (SMT)** system that solves the problem of machine translation. To make people communicate in a foreign language, the Baidu translate application supports various ways of translations, such as speech-to-speech translation, image translation, object translation, full-screen translation, and so on. Object translation helps users to identify objects and translate them into both Chinese and English. For the users who cannot speak and write foreign languages, the app allows images as input.
- **Speech recognition:** Baidu has developed a voice system called Deep Speech 2 that can readily recognize English and Mandarin speech better than humans. AI is prevalent throughout Baidu's business lines. It impacts its significant products, such as search, advertising, translation, and online-to-offline services, which include restaurant recommendations. The company owns a supermassive neural network built upon hundreds of thousands of servers, and it also has the largest GPU group in China. The company focuses on the commercialization of AI technology across its new AI-enabled business initiatives, such as cloud, autonomous driving, financial services, and DuerOS, all of which have the potential to become Baidu's core businesses.

Key assets of Baidu

The key assets of Baidu are as follows:

- **Baidu Intelligent Cloud:** It consists of AI and Big Data, that is, ABC - AI, Big data, cloud computing. The newly launched platforms for Baidu open cloud customers are as follows:
 - **Baidu TianXiang:** It is an intelligent multimedia cloud that offers video, image, and document processing services, such as live streaming and video-on-demand.
 - **Baidu TianSuan:** It is an intelligent Big Data platform that offers data services and cognitive APIs, where users can collect, store, process, and analyze Big Data.

- **Baidu Brain:** It acts as the core engine of Baidu AI and helps in the development of many

Baidu technologies, such as voice and image recognition, natural language processing, and user profiling. The following diagram illustrates the architecture of Baidu Brain and Intelligent Cloud:

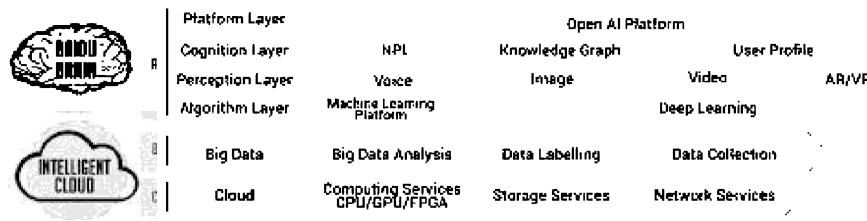


Figure 6.8: Architecture of Baidu Brain and Intelligent Cloud

- DuerOS:** It is a conversational platform that provides the voice interface service in various smart devices both at home and on the go, such as phones, intelligent speakers, TV, cars, robots, and many more. The critical elements of DuerOS are as follows:
 - Accurate listening:** It is one of the first and crucial steps of the interaction. It has the Deep Speech to speech recognition system. The system includes a noise reduction algorithm and has achieved a maximum of 97% accuracy.
 - Understanding:** The goal of DuerOS is to understand the free writing style of user comments. Baidu aims to provide consistent user experiences in which buzz-words and stylish slang can be used in commands along with an interactive system that can only understand pre-defined words. Its skill is supported by its substantial data assets and market-leading technologies, which include NLP and searching.
 - Fulfilling:** It fulfills the needs of customers with the ability to offer complete content and services. Baidu has use cases of interactive conversations, which include entertainment, information inquiry, chat, smart home, travel/transportation, phone instructions, personal assistant, utility tools, and education. The content and services provided by DuerOS overgrow on a daily basis.

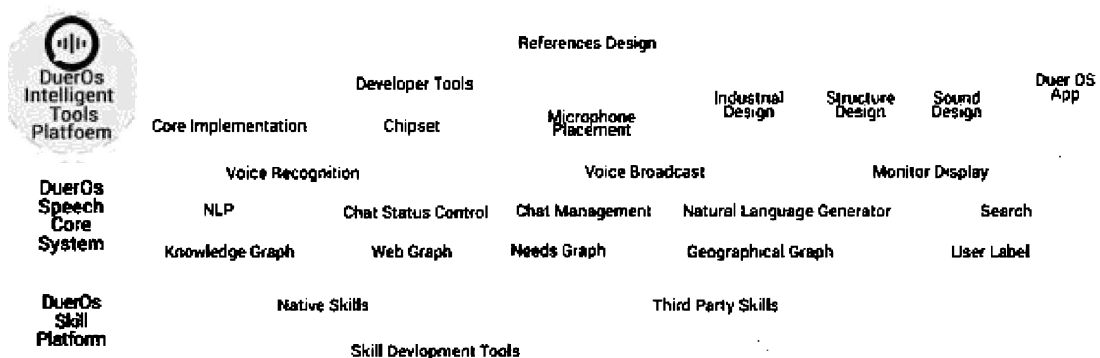


Figure 6.9: Architecture with contents and services provided by DuerOS and their flow

- **Apollo:** Security, reliability, and real-time control: Apollo is open-source software, which provides free self-driving services. With this, Baidu aims to engage users with its open-source AI platform. The following diagram illustrates the architecture of Apollo:

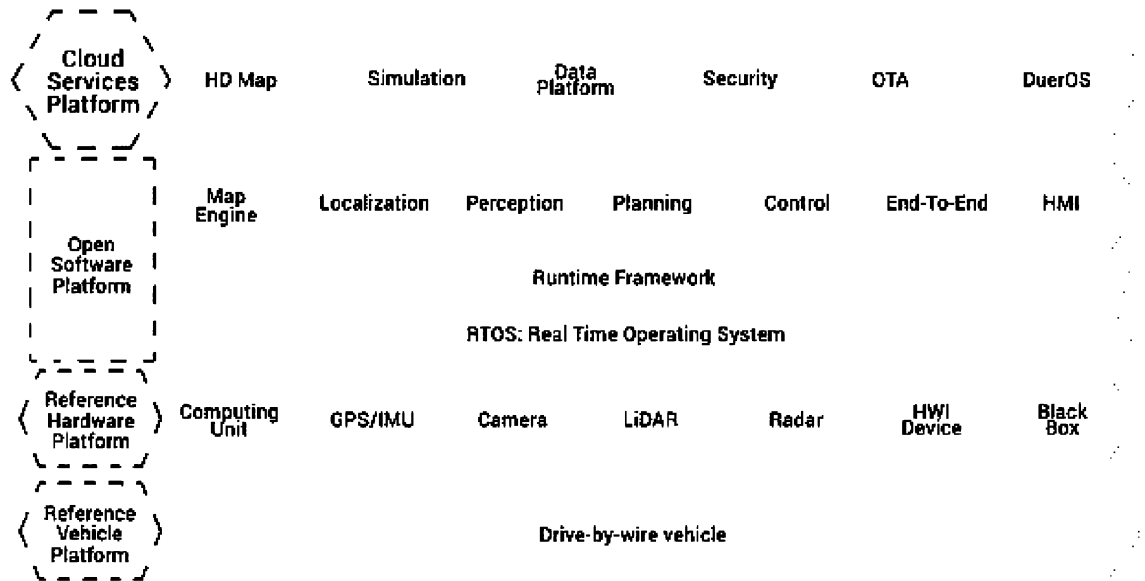


Figure 6.10: Technical architecture of Apollo with its flow

- The complete technical architecture is composed of the following four parts:
 - Cloud Service Platform focuses on security, reliability, and real-time control by Simulation Engine and HD Map.
 - Open software platform consists of the following:
 - The perception, which can help vehicles recognize road conditions with the help of AI technology.
 - Localization, which can correctly locate the position of the car in a low-cost and uninterrupted way with the support of Map Engine.
 - Runtime Framework, which can use chips of both Intel and NVIDIA.
 - Planning and control, which can choose the safest driving strategy with the help of AI and Big Data.
 - Reference Hardware Platform provides support for various hardware, such as CPU, GPU, and a variety of sensors that include GPS, camera, and laser.
 - Reference Vehicle Platform can prevent and investigate accidents by using data from the black box of Apollo.

Uses of Baidu

The following are the uses of Baidu:

- **Core business:** The core business of Baidu is the online advertisement feature in its search engine. The principle behind this service in Baidu is called **Pay for Performance (P4P)**.
- As both Baidu and Google service is based on pay by click, they have different advantages and disadvantages. In Baidu, the paid link is on the left side and mixed with the search result. When customers pay, they will be precisely told where their link will be placed according to the price they pay.
- Another advantage of Baidu which comes from its prosperous localization approach is the personal service. When the customer registers as an advertisement user on Baidu, the local sales team contacts the customer and comes to the portal to offer assistance. For those people who don't want to make an online payment, this is very helpful. This approach brings many SMEs to Baidu.
- **MP3:** The MP3 searching and downloading service is the primary tool for Baidu to get users to click on advertisements. But this has led to a lot of discussion on legal issues and copyright. Consequently, Baidu came up with a solution and offered only those third-party links that are announced by Baidu on its website.
- **Knows:** Baidu Knows is a platform that helps people to interact with each other with questions and answers to each other. The advantage here is that people can find what they want quickly and precisely, instead of wasting time in hundreds of search results.
- **Post bar:** It's an open BBS system. The main difference between these systems and standard BBS is that every user can start a new topic and be an administrator. So, it is commonly used by schools to setup classmates BBS, or clubs for singers or football teams, and so on.
- **Space:** It's a blog system. Users can quickly start their homepage that can include their blogs, photos, and links to their friends' pages.

Major problems of Baidu

The following sections describes are the major problems related to Baidu.

Uncertain quality of search results

With the spread of internet users, many businesses focus on the development of mobile websites. According to a recent study, comparison of keyword searches through mobile advertisement is two-thirds of the overall advertising.

Most users prefer to search for different keywords on mobile devices, and the cost of the mobile

advertisement is less than that of a desktop. The mobile promotion ranks web pages depending on distinct searching habits and the quality of search keywords. The mobile advertising is only suitable for mobile devices and it works on the pay-per-click model.

The display character and form of searched results will be more suited for the cell phone screen. Furthermore, some are concerned about the traffic flow. As the conversion ratio of mobile search is higher, the cost-per-click decreases and the consulting channels such as *Baidu Shangqiao* are available for use.

Problems in Baidu mobile promotion

- **Invalid mobile search:** The delivery of a keyword in Baidu mobile is lower than the minimum display price for its keyword promotion. The low bid causes the inconsistency in mobile search i.e. two different rates and degrees of keyword quality for the same keyword. It may generally lead to invalid promotion, and the keyword gets displayed on Baidu mobile only after an appropriate adjustment.
- **Low click rate on the impressions from mobile devices:** With the popularity of smartphones, the mobile search capacity is also increasing. The search volume from mobile devices is three times that of desktops, but the conversion ratio of searches from portable devices is lower than that of desktops. It may lead to several problems for users, such as user's limitation of the mobile screen size, and usually, only three locations are accessible on the heads of a mobile device, while there are ten of them on desktops. Besides, the clicks and impressions on web pages would increase by considering the online behavioral habits of users, promotion delivery location and time, and whether the titles, descriptions, and pictures are attractive enough, assisted by direct calls and online consultation. Firstly, applications have the highest priority, which may not appear simultaneously with other impressions, and secondly, phone calls have the second most top priority, which may appear simultaneously with other impressions.
- **Malicious clicks from mobile devices:** Everyone who engages in Baidu promotion is facing this problem of malicious clicks, which is used to suppress competitors. Some companies repeatedly click on a webpage to decrease the advertising effect of a competitor. Doing so may waste a competitor's money, reduce their ranking, and affect them in other ways, which in turn will reduce the competition cost. To trace malicious clicks, there is a need to check the increase of daily clicks on a keyword, the rise of daily consumption, or excessive clicks from one IP.
- **Under-performance of mobile promotion:** Since mobile browsing behavior is irregular, the browsing behavior tends to be fragmented. Firstly, the user has no time to analyze the advertising information or to decide whether to buy a particular product or not. Secondly, the screen size of a mobile device is limited, which means that product information may not be fully displayed. Thirdly, user experience in mobile devices is

poor in terms of real-time communication; this may lower the user's interest in consultation and affect the promotion effect. Lastly, many companies use large-size pictures on their sponsored ads. The user chooses to avoid such ads since domestic data usage rates can be expensive.

- **Copyright problem:** Copyright owners have synchronized with the libraries for a long time, but the digital environment has broken this agreement. Copyright owners are doing everything to preserve the authenticity of their products. In the initial stages of internet development, no one believed that regulation of using online products is going to be a problem, but the internet encountered growing efforts as it emerged.

For the digital library, traditional copyright has become an obstacle to further development. It is a critical problem at the time for China's digital library suppliers. Copyright is the central concern of the digital library resource reconstruction. To solve these copyright infringement problems, China's significant digital libraries suppliers are seeking useful and practical solutions.

- **Baidu Wenku: a copyright dividend model:** Baidu Wenku is an open platform built and managed by Baidu for internet users to share online documents. Baidu does not edit or modify the content. The first model is the shared fee model. Baidu allows users to read some chapters of the works for free. In case a user wants to read the full text of the document; they are asked to pay a specific fee through specific internet banking channels. After paying, the user can store a soft copy of the work in the *My Library* section on the platform and read the complete content online. The fee charged by Baidu is shared with the copyright owners. Baidu confirms that a significant proportion of the revenue will be transferred to the copyright owners.

The second model is to share advertisements revenues. Baidu allows users to read the full content for free. Baidu puts corresponding advertising alongside the content users are interested in, in such a way that the user's reading experience is not interrupted. Baidu also provides comprehensive digital copyright security schemes. Firstly, with advanced anti-piracy technology, Baidu erases the residual data from the library thoroughly and restricts the pirated content. Secondly, as long as the designated users report piracy, Baidu agrees to react to it immediately and erases the pirated content instantly.

Next steps of Baidu intelligent web services

Here are the different next steps of Baidu intelligent web services:

- **Make more valid promotion by optimizing the keywords:** Baidu Search has set strict requirements for the degree of keyword quality and the bid for keywords. When the bidding of a keyword is lower than the average price for impressions, the information is not displayed. It also refers to an invalid promotion, which means that the bid of a

keyword should be higher than the average price for impressions. There is a lot of commercial software used to modify the amount of keyword software. For example, adSage is designed for Baidu backstage accounts, which allows for the automatic configuration of the display location of each keyword, impression price, and bid area. After the configuration of keyword location and the effectiveness of a bid, it reconfigures the setting of this keyword.

- **Improve the information impression by regional website optimization:** Mobile promotion is preferably done in local user searches, like when a user searches for a tourist attraction. Baidu Search displays lvmama.com on desktops, in which it shows a list of Wenzhou local tourist attractions on mobile devices.
- **Mobile users tend to search some questions with an immediate solution:** Where is a parking lot nearby? So, in this case, the location of target customers is the critical point; the user can identify the areas during a period of advertising campaigns.
- **Prevent malicious clicks by backstage settings:** As to the malicious clicks in Baidu promotion, the company may select the precise keywords, or set a limit by summing up the average daily consumption for each keyword. The promotion cost is reduced by setting a different limit for each keyword and lowering the rank. Baidu backstage setup program also blocks the IPs that are considered as the source of malicious clicks.
- **Understand the customers, optimize the website, and improve ROI:** Before mobile promotion, there is a need to understand the target customers. The searches cover a wide range of areas; more customers already close the promotion information before they get to know the products or services of a company.

A promotion campaign should take a high rank by price advantage if the impression of a keyword attracts more clicks. The company may raise the bid for that particular keyword. Also, companies should change the delivery time and areas depending on their target customers, through the analysis of their searching behaviors. For the mobile business sites, the company profile on the web page should be precise and intelligible to target customers, so that user experience is enhanced. The number of words on the page should be more readable and creative; some appealing GIFs may be added to attract more customer clicks.

The business communication software of Baidu clearly states that customers are required to leave their mobile number for the convenience of follow-up contact. This is particularly essential for follow-up customer tracking on mobile devices.

Conclusion

This chapter described the strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats of Baidu in the field of web searching. Though it is not used in most countries throughout the world, with the power of AI, Baidu is on the way to becoming a giant in the world of internet searches. Till 2017,

the number of Baidu users stood at 731 million. Baidu is still exploring AI and its applications, and it is on the way to provide some exciting new internet searching services, which we discussed in this chapter. The day is not far when it will become an open challenge to Google and other search engines of the world.

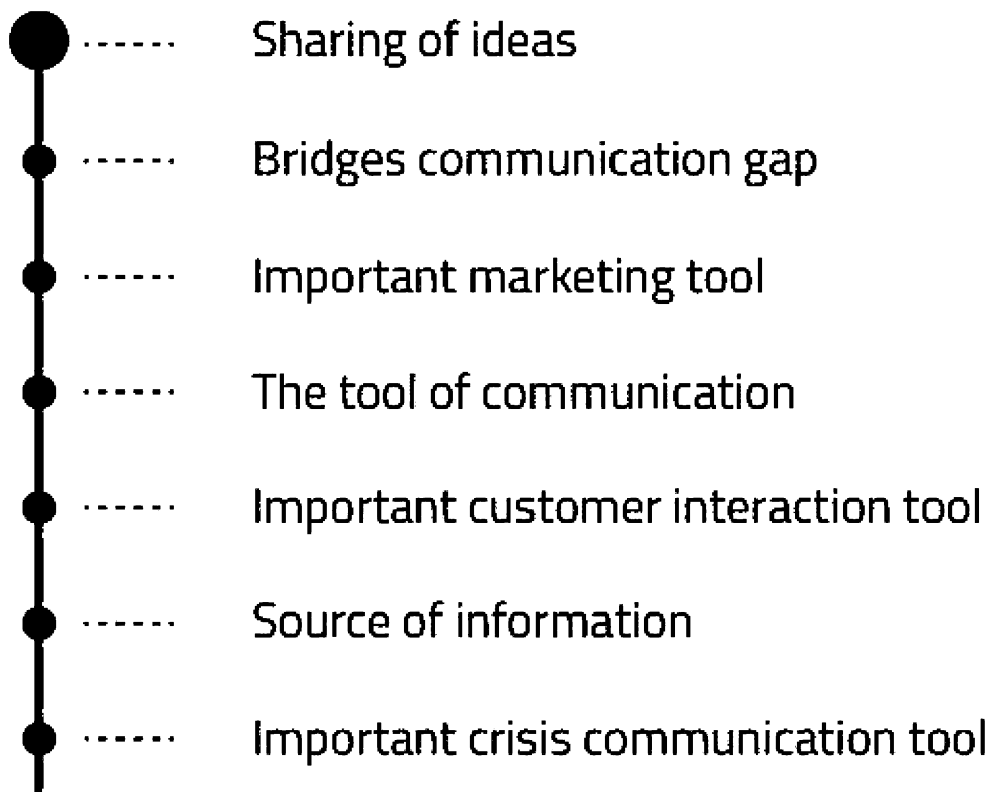


Figure 7.1: Main advantages of social media

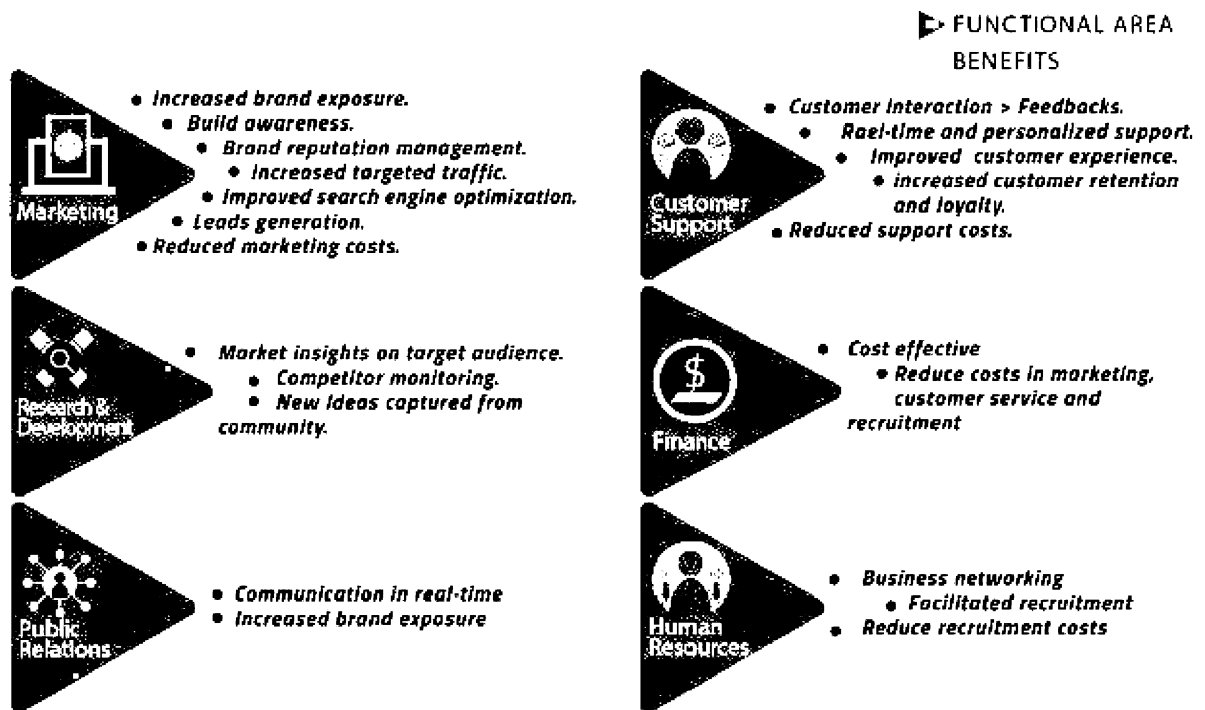


Figure 7.2: Functional areas and benefits of public relations and human resources

The current progress of FAIR for advancing socialmedia

This topic emphasizes the effort of the company in focusing on the research and development by establishing **Facebook Artificial Intelligence Research (FAIR)** that is responsible in making the networks of users more efficient to be used and utilized.

Facebook manages its business by getting knowledge about its clients and retrieving their information for advertisers. It then reinvests this money into offering new, useful

functionality, for example, it is investing in videos and shopping, which can be used to personalized knowledge about a customer. As millions of individuals were uploading photographs and updating their status at every moment, up to this point Facebook would like to get an incentive from this unstructured information.

Deep learning techniques enable machines to figure out how to classify information independent of anyone else. This is the fundamental principle behind the primary use of DL in Facebook, and as DL algorithms turn out to be more advanced, they can be easily connected to more information that users share such as content, pictures, and videos. 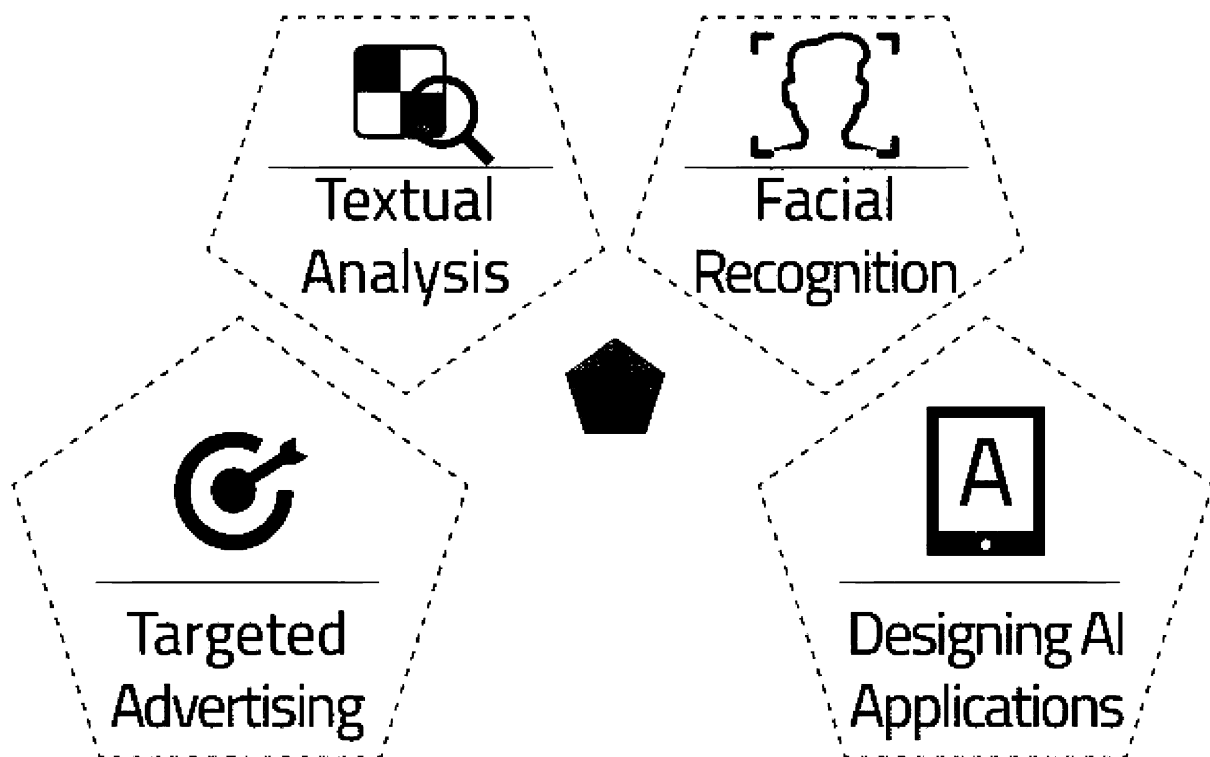


Figure 7.3: Different areas and in which FAIR is employing its current research

Here are some use cases where DL is used to help Facebook achieve its goals in knowing more about its users:

- **Textual analysis:** The text is a popular form of communication on Facebook. A large proportion of the data shared on Facebook is still text. Video may involve larger data volumes. A picture may paint 1,000 words, but if someone wants to answer a simple question, then there is no need of 1,000 words. Every bit of data that is

irrelevant to solve, the problem is just a noisy data, and a waste of resources to store and analyze. Following the various ways of content, writing is used on Facebook that can help to improve people's experiences with the different products. Understanding the various ways of content writing is used on Facebook that can help to improve people's experiences with the different products. With this goal in mind, Facebook uses the concept to build **DeepText**. It is a deep learning-based text understanding engine. It can understand the textual content, learn and analyze several thousand posts per second, spanning more than 20 languages with near-human accuracy. DeepText leverages deep neural network architectures that include convolutional and recurrent neural nets. It can perform learning based on word-level and character-level. Neural networks examine the association between words to understand how their meaning changes, depending on the other words around them. To train a model, they used **FbLearner Flow** and **Torch**. Trained models are served with a click of a button through the FbLearner predictor platform that provides a scalable and reliable infrastructure for model distribution. Facebook engineers can quickly build new DeepText models through the self-serve architecture that DeepText delivers.

- **Facial recognition:** Facebook AI research team builds **DeepFace**. It is a facial recognition system that is capable of matching faces in images with nearly the same accuracy as humans. It identifies human faces in digital images. It is trained with four million photos from Facebook. It is able to recognize the image of a person with an accuracy of around 97 percent. The DeepFace system uses a 3D modeling technique that can detect faces, crop, and warp them. It can scan millions of photos, virtually rotate and correct the images, and find all matching fronts. The DeepFace algorithm works by following four significant steps that include detecting, align, represent, and classify:

1. **Face detection:** Face detection identifies human faces in digital image. The detected face is cropped and used as input for the next, that is, the alignment step. For face detection, the DeepFace algorithm used already developed Face Detection algorithm.

2. **Face alignment:**

- **2D alignment:** First, detect six fiducial points to scale, rotate, and translate the picture. The fiducial points are identified using Support Vector Regressor.
- **3D alignment:** First, detection of 67 fiducial points using Support Vector Regressor is completed, then we compare them with a fixed 3D model of

a general face. Re-construct the 3D model of the detected face and generate the 3D-aligned version of the crop. The final image is given to the deep neural networks.

3. **Representation:** Three types of networks are used for representation, that is, convolutional networks, locally connected networks and fully connected networks.

- Convolutional networks extract low-level features.
- Locally connected networks extract high-level features.
- Fully connected networks capture correlation between features located in scattered parts of the face image.

4. **Classification:** Images are recognized and classified by identification.

- **Targeted advertising:** Facebook uses deep neural networks to decide which advertisements to show to which users. This is done by machines themselves to find out and cluster users together in the most insightful ways to give advertisements.
- **Designing AI applications:** Facebook decides that the task of determining the processes that can be improved by AI, and machines can handle DL. The system called Flow has been implemented, which uses the concept of DL analysis to run simulations of around 300,000 ML models every month that allows engineers to test ideas and pinpoint opportunities for efficiency.

Application of AI in the field at Facebook scale

Social media stimulates innovation, drives cost additions, and empowers brands through mass collaboration. Contrariwise every industry, companies are using social media platforms for marketing and hype up their services and products, along with observing the views of the audience about their brand. The merging of social media and big data gives birth to a new level of technology. Every day, users feed Facebook with a lot of data. At every 60 seconds, upload around 136,000 photos, post around 510,000 comments and update 293,000 statuses. That is a LOT of data.

At first sight, this data may not seem useful. But with the detailed analysis of this type of data, Facebook can be able to recognize who our friends are, where we are, what we look like, what we are doing, about likes, dislikes, and much more.

Facebook is the company that maintains this high level of detailed customer information.

Apart from analyzing user data, Facebook has other ways of determining user behavior, which are as follows:

- **Tracking cookies:** Facebook track users beyond the Web by monitoring cookies. If a user is logging into Facebook and concurrently browses other websites, Facebook can follow the sites they are visiting.
- **Tag suggestions:** Facebook suggests the user to tag a person in photos by image processing and facial recognition.
- **Facial recognition:** Facial recognition and image processing capabilities are the latest investments of Facebook. Facebook can easily track its users beyond the internet and other Facebook profiles with image data provided by user sharing.
- **Analyzing the likes:** Facebook can predict data accurately on a range of highly sensitive personal attributes by examining a Facebook Likes by users. The patterns of Facebook likes can accurately predict the sexual orientation, intelligence, religion, emotional stability, alcohol use and drug use, relationship status, race, age, gender, and political views, satisfaction with life.

Social media analytics

Social media analytics is the science of extracting valuable hidden business insights from social media data. Social media analytics are of various types among like descriptive analytics, diagnostic analytics, predictive and forecast analytics. Let's see them one by one:

- **Descriptive analytics:** Descriptive social media analytics answers the question of what happened and what is happening? Descriptive analytics aggregate and describe social media data in the form of reports, visualizations, and make clusters to understand well-defined business problems. Social media user comments are analyzed that comes under the descriptive analytics category. Comment analysis can be used to understand the sentiments of users' or identification of emerging trends by clustering topics.

The following diagram illustrates the use cases of social media analytics divided into different domains:

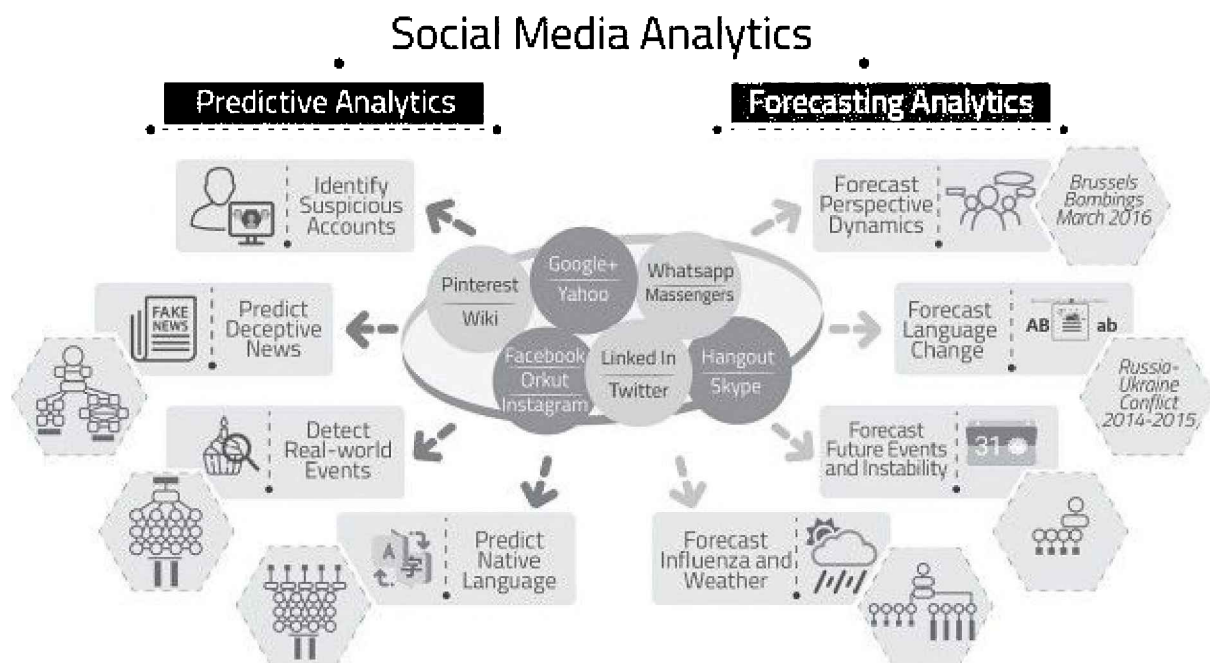


Figure 7.4: Use cases of social media analytics divided into different domains.

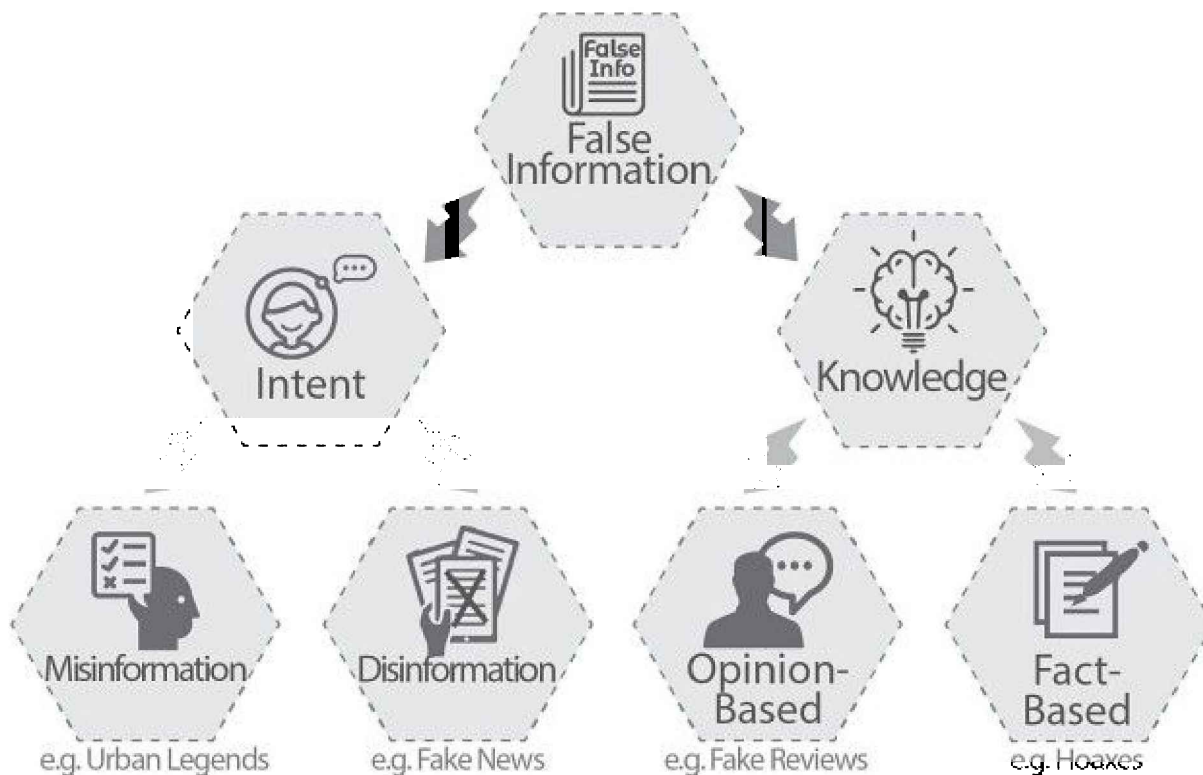


Figure 7.5: Hierarchy of False Information

The audience leads most web disinformation campaigns to concentrate on influencing public opinion or directing online traffic to websites to earn money through advertisements.

- **Detect real-world events:** On social media sites, vast amounts of user-generated content are created every day. Real-World event detection has become a vital trend in the field of user-generated content analysis, the difficulty being to summarize and categorize uncoordinated communications from various users. Message posting to friends or forwarding received ones, connecting to new friends, and provide near real-time prediction of new events. Political events, accidents, festivals, and natural disasters represent that real-world events were happening at a particular location and time. Hence, event discovery and analysis from social media can be of vital importance, for example, for emergency response. In an earlier time, most works in the field of event detection focused on the analysis of text as well as meta-tags such as geolocation, timestamps, and so on. But now, it is possible to analyze real-world events in a given geographic region by using various deep learning algorithms.
- **Predict native language:** Based on user-generated content from a social media platform, it is also possible to fetch user profiles and predicts their gender, age, and geographic location.

DL can be used in various learning scenarios such as supervised, unsupervised and hybrid networks and for various other problems such as classification, regression, and vision.

With the current advances in DL, the capacity of algorithms to analyze the text has enhanced considerably. Inventive use of advanced AI techniques can be a useful tool for doing in-depth analysis. It is essential to classify incoming buyer conversation about a particular brand based on the following points:

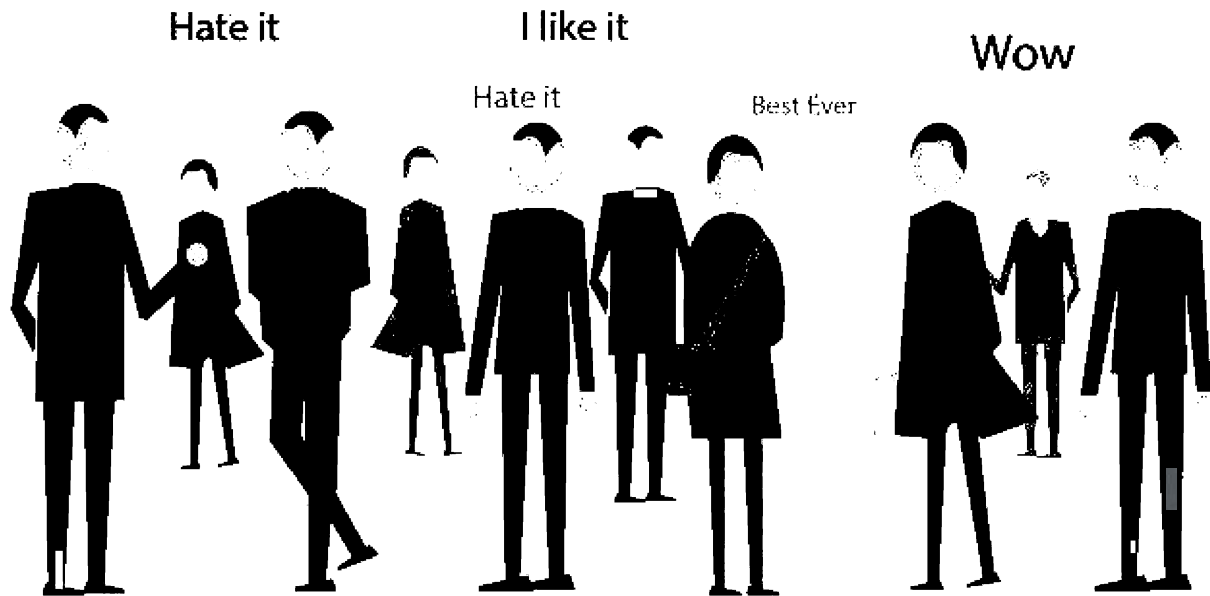


Figure 7.6: Representation of the different sentiments in a crowd.

Nowadays, if someone wants to buy a product, it is no longer needed to get reviews from friends and family because there are many reviews by users and discussions in public forums about the product on the web. For businesses, there may no longer be necessary to conduct surveys, opinion polls, and focus groups to gather public opinions because such information is abundant publicly available. Sentiment analysis is useful in consumer market to get reviews related to products, marketing to know attitudes and trends of consumers, social media to find the opinion about recent hot events in town, movie to see whether a recently released movie is a hit.

The applications are classified into the following categories:

- **Applications to review-websites:** Event review, movie reviews, product reviews, and so on.

- **Uses as a subcomponent technology:** Detecting hostile, lousy language in emails, spam detection, context-sensitive information detection, and so on.
- **Applications in business and government intelligence:** To know about consumer attitudes and trends.
- **Applications across different domains:** To get information about public opinions for political leaders or about rules and regulations and so on.

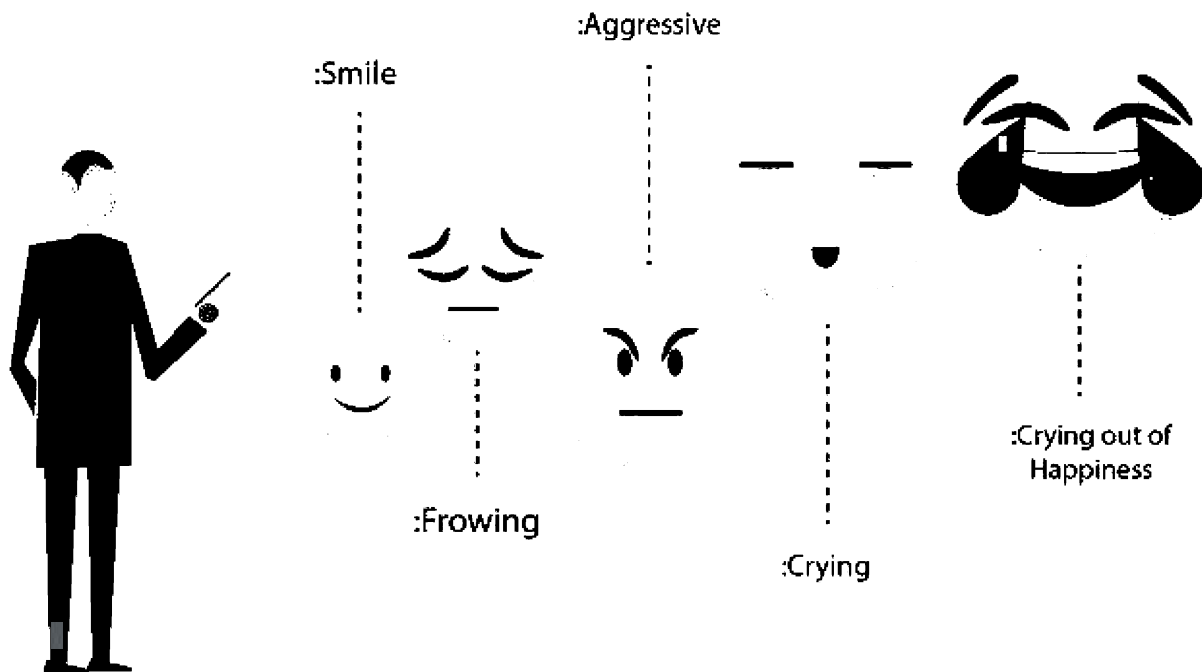


Figure 7.7: Representation of different emoji with their key emotions.

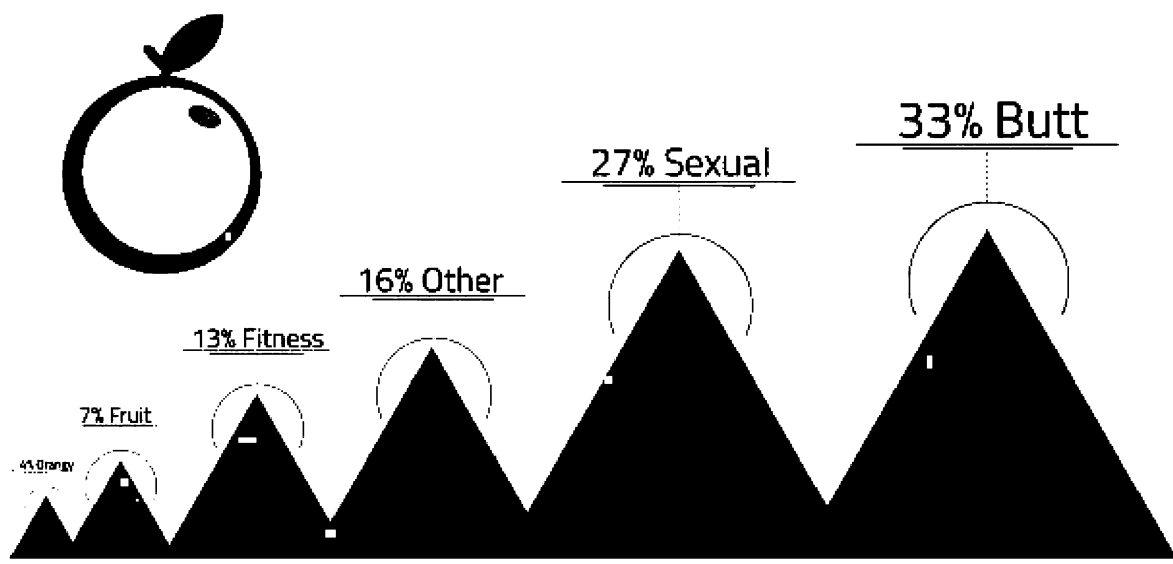


Figure 7.8: Analysis of the use of a symbol on twitter

- **Intent analysis:** Deep learning algorithms can analyze a string of text and indicate the intention underlying it. Sentiment analysis is an NLP technique which gives whether the nature of a particular text is positive, negative or neutral. Though the intent analysis goes a level deeper and gives an idea of whether a string of text is a complaint, a suggestion or a query. Valuing the intent of messages on social media opens a lot of new possibilities.

Now, if someone runs sentiment analysis on tweets, it returns a positive or negative sentiment only but we run the intent analysis, it can analyze and judge whether the tweet is a suggestion or a query. Some of the most important use cases of intent analysis are discussed as follows:

- **Targeting ads:** Intent analysis can help in determining the placement of ads. Once we extract intention of text from the social media posts, it becomes simpler to recognize the pattern. Companies can target the ads to the audience by getting the information from the intent analysis results. For example, let someone post on social media about recent product experience, and it has many other comments tagged along with that post. It becomes easy to extract the intent from the text on the page. If the intended results are

questioning about the services of the mentioned brand, companies can display advertisements and provide better offers.

- **Customer handling:** One of the most realistic applications of intent analysis is the management of customer services. If the intention of the existing customer in the posts is detected and managed, becomes a lot easier to resolve the issue. - **Contextual Semantic Search (CSS):** CSS is an intelligent search algorithm that is specially designed for the classification of textual data based on the related concept. CSS takes thousands of messages as input and filters all the messages that closely match with the given concept. CSS is an advanced text classifier powered by DL. An intelligent AI technique is used to convert every single word into a specific point, and the distance between these points is used to classify messages, where the context is similar to the concept that users are exploring. A conventional strategy for filtering all cost-related messages is to do a keyword search on cost and other closely associated words such as pricing, costing, charge, \$, and paid. This method is not very practical as it is impossible to think of all the associated keywords and their variants that represent a distinct concept. On the other hand, CSS takes the name of the idea (which is cost here) as input and filters all the words having similar context even if variants of the concept keyword are not mentioned.

Apple **segmentation, targeting, and positioning(STP)** represent the focus of its marketing efforts, as shown in the following diagram:

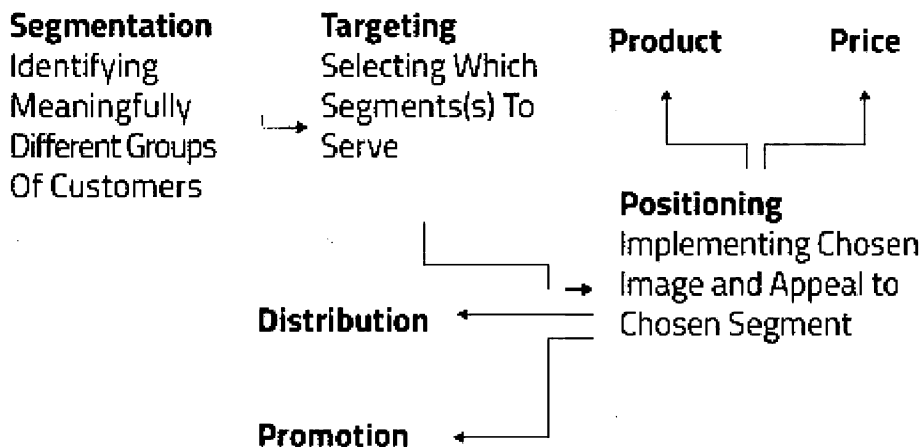


Figure 8.1: STP representation

- One supplier with one product targets all segments. Refer to the following diagram:

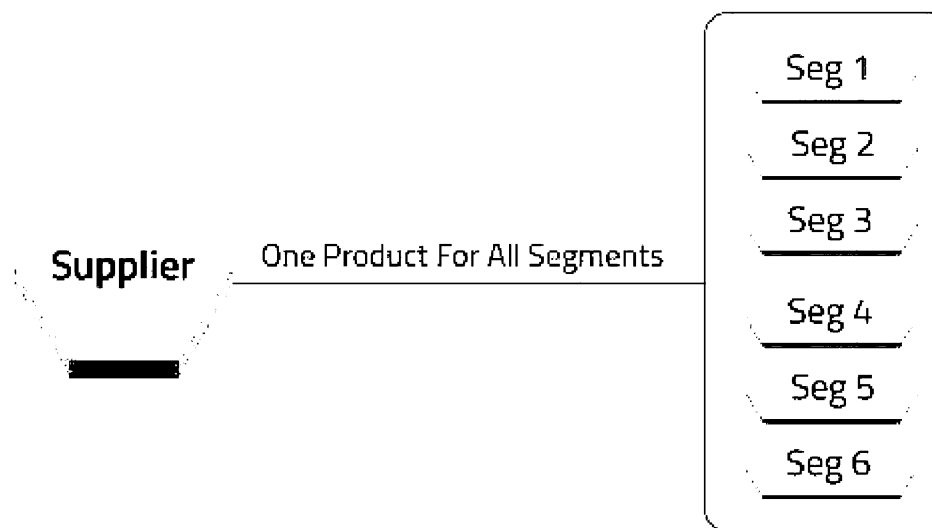


Figure 8.3: Representation of One supplier with one product for all segments system

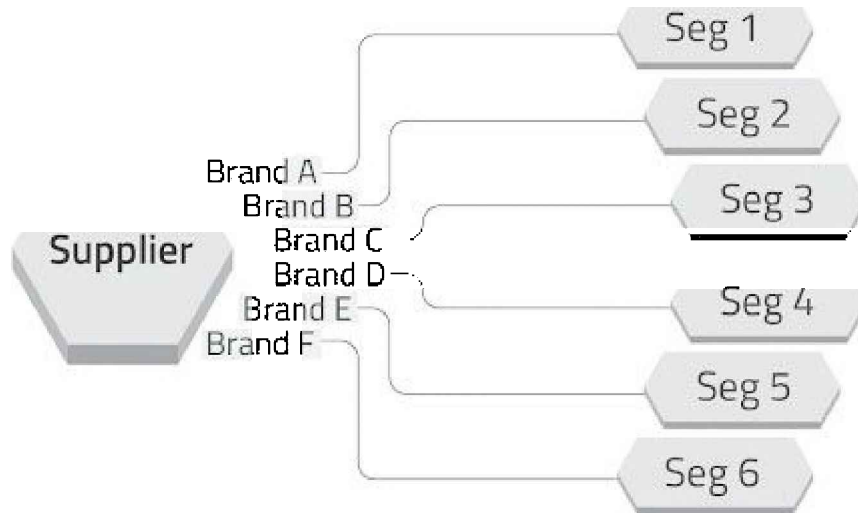


Figure 8.4: Representation of One supplier with different products for all segments system

- **Positioning:** Positioning is one of the most straightforward and useful tools for marketers. After segmenting a market and targeting a consumer, there is a need to locate a product within that market. Positioning is all about judgment, and it may vary from one person to another. Customers perceive Apple as a premium brand, and that is the reason it can demand a premium price. Therefore, Apple targets less price-conscious customers and differentiates itself from competitors by meeting the requirements of their targeted customers.

Siri technology

Siri is made of three technical components, which include a conversational interface, personal context awareness, and service delegation. Let's look at them in detail:

- **Conversational interface:** Siri's interface makes it possible to have a conversation with it. Whether it's task fulfillment or seeking a solution, Siri does it well. It is strengthened with language understanding components that are quite effective.
- **Personal context awareness:** Siri recognizes conversational intent that comprises location, time, task, and dialog contexts. Siri also knows about the friends of the user and additional information that is accessible to them.

- **Service delegation:** Siri is capable to merge vertical and horizontal searches across various information sources and edit them based on dynamic criteria that allow it to get tasks completed.

AI in Apple: From Siri to the image processing

Apple started the entire virtual assistant craze with Siri on the iPhone, many years ago. Siri is a personal assistant with a voice-controlled natural language interface. It was introduced in iOS 8 on iPhone 6. It uses sequential inference and contextual awareness to perform tasks for iOS users. On iPhone 6, the Hey Siri feature could only be used when the phone was charging. However, the ability of the iPhone was enhanced in subsequent generations, that is, 6S onwards and iPad. These generations used a low-power and always-on processor so that Siri could listen constantly. Thus, the *Hey Siri* feature became available for use at all times.

Siri is an AI program that consists of ML, NLP, and a web search algorithm. It empowers users of Apple iPhone 4S or later and latest iPad and iPod Touch devices to operate their mobile device and its applications by giving commands in simple language. Users can give commands (to send messages, calls, set reminders, manage iTunes) and receive confirmation audibly from Siri. To use Siri, there is no need to change the way one speaks; it is a natural language interface that understands regular speech. For example, when a user wants to create some reminder like *Remind me to go for a walk at 6:00 AM*, it responds with messages like *Ok, I added “go for a walk” to your reminders for tomorrow at 6 AM*.

Siri can work beyond multiple iPhone and iPad apps to achieve its tasks. It also supports extensive dictation that enables users to dictate to Siri. Users' speech is changed into text, and it is used in email, text messages, note-taking, web searching, Facebook status updates, and related operations.

- **Deep learning in Siri:** There are two types of speech synthesis techniques used in the business — unit selection and parametric synthesis. These techniques are explained below:
 - **Unit selection synthesis** produces high-quality speech recordings; therefore, it is the most extensively used speech synthesis technique in business products.
 - **Parametric synthesis** provides highly intelligible and fluent speech but suffers from lower quality. Therefore, parametric synthesis is used when a

small footprint is required.

Modern selection systems merge some of the benefits of the two approaches and are known as hybrid systems. Hybrid unit selection uses the parametric approach to predict the units that are to be selected. DL has gained significant impulse in the field of speech technology, and parametric synthesis has benefited dramatically from deep learning technology. DL has additionally empowered a new approach for speech synthesis, known as direct waveform modeling, for example, using WaveNet, which can provide the flexibility of parametric integration and high quality of unit selection synthesis. However, given its extremely high computational cost, using it is not yet feasible on a production system.

Siri has powered the usage of a speech popularity unit present in smartphones, which runs within the heritage of the device all the time. This speech recognizer makes use of a **Deep Neural network (DNN)** that corresponds to the voice patterns that are, in addition, generated as a probability distribution for those voice sounds. A method known as Temporal Integration is used to compute a confidence score to check whether or not a command contains the phrase *good day Siri*. If the command is anywhere near the phrase Siri gets activated.

Apple uses DNN for face detection

Apple started using deep learning for face detection in iOS 10. With the arrival of deep learning and its various applications in computer vision problems, face detection accuracy increased significantly. Compared to conventional computer vision, the models in DL require more memory, more disk storage, and numerous computational resources.

The typical high-end devices were not suitable for the implementation of deep-learning vision models. Thus, cloud-based solutions came to the rescue. Images are sent to a server for analysis and detection of faces using DL inference. Apple's iCloud Photo Library provides a cloud-based solution to store photos and videos. Before sending any pictures and videos to the cloud storage, they are encrypted on the device and can be decrypted by methods that are registered with the iCloud account.

How face ID detection system works

As camera consists of various features like infrared camera, ambient light sensor, proximity sensor, flood illuminator, Dot projector, and more.

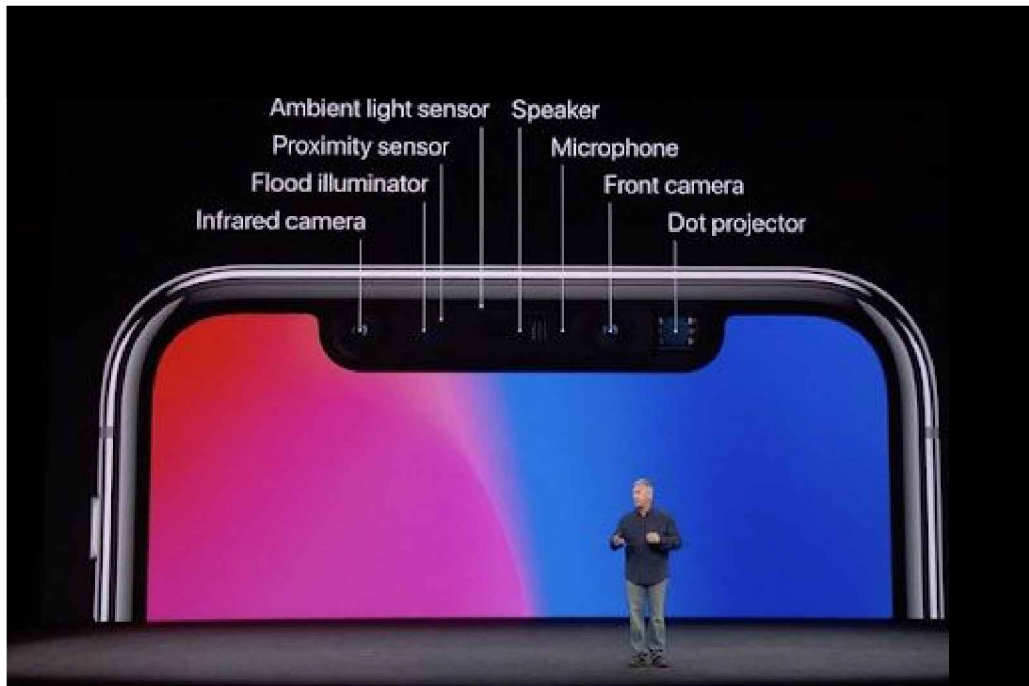


Figure 8.5: Showing different sensors used for face detection

True depth camera system

Every time a user looks at iPhone X, whether to unlock a screen or to authenticate to see an incoming notification, the right depth camera system detects the face with the flood illuminator even in dark conditions. When the face of the user is identified, Face ID authenticates and unlocks the device by checking that eyes are open and focused on the device.

Once it confirms the presence of an authorized face, the dot projector projects and reads over 30,000 infrared dots to form a map of the face, along with an infrared image. This data is further used to generate a sequence of 2D models and depth maps, which are electronically signed and forwarded to the Secure Enclave. The actual depth camera randomizes the series of 2D images and a depth map, and projects a device-specific random pattern.

Thus, the system uses the infrared image and the infrared dots, which are then pushed into neural networks to create a mathematical model of the users' faces.

Neural networks

Facial matching is performed using trained neural networks in real-time. Apple took a

billion images, including IR and depth images. With that, it developed multiple facial matching neural networks and created Face ID technology with high accuracy for a diverse range of users. Face ID is built to work even if the subject is wearing hats, glasses, scarves, contact lenses, or sunglasses. Moreover, it is also designed to work indoors, outdoors, and in the dark. An added neural network is used in it that's trained to recognize and resist spoofing guards used to unlock the phone with photos or masks.

It's analyzed by the *Apple A11 Bionic chipset* and matched against data in the Secure Enclave on the iPhone.

Anti-spoofing mechanism in Face ID recognition

A spoofing attack is an attempt to access a device by using a photo, video, or any other proxy of an authorized person's face. Some significant examples of such attacks are as follows:

- **Video attack:** This is a more complicated way to trick the system, which usually requires a video of the victim's face. This approach replicates the facial movements of the victim to look more natural as compared to holding someone's photo in front of the device.
- **Print attack:** Attackers use someone's photo. The image can be printed or displayed on a digital device.
- **3D mask attack:** During this type of attack, a mask is used as the medium for spoofing. It's an even more complex attack compared to attacks using video. Besides natural facial movements, it facilitates ways to beat some extra layers of protection like depth sensors.

In the latest hardware repetition, Apple has added excellent depth-mapping and 3D-sensing techniques that enable spoofing detection with high accuracy.

Other benefits of AI on smartphones

The following are the other benefits of AI on smartphones:

- **Camera benefits:** This is one of the critical areas on which iPhone makers are working. Using AI, the phone's camera interface can detect objects, such as a broom, landscape, food, fireworks, and so on, in the camera frame and adjust the settings accordingly to get the best possible image. AI can also identify facial

features and enhance them automatically for an excellent portrait.

- **Language translator:** There are various translation apps available that allow users to take an image and get the text in it translated from one language to another. This is done with internet access; however, with AI, iPhone will be proficient at translating words in real-time without an internet connection.
- **User behavior:** An AI system is intended to learn and adapt as it is used over a period of time. On smart-phones, the AI can determine the usage pattern of users and learn from it on a day to day basis. When a user switches to silent mode after reaching work, turns on Bluetooth after reaching home, and closes the background-running applications after some time, AI recognizes these patterns and automates these daily tasks over time.
- **Improved security:** Apple iPhone X uses an AI-based algorithm as a Face ID to unlock the system. AI system works to recognize the user's face for protection. Using AI processing, iPhone X can locate look with changes like spectacles or beard over time.
- **Voice assistants:** Voice personal assistants have been around for some time now. Siri, Cortana, Google Assistant, and Alexa are various voice assistants that use AI to recognize speech and respond accordingly. Now, voice assistants have improved with improved AI integration. Instead of only replying to simple queries, they also perform other tasks, such as placing an online order, typing and sending a message, searching for particular songs, and more.

Innovation on intelligent product development

Apple is one of the companies that thrive in the market through its designs and innovative products. For several years, Apple products have attracted users by winning the empathic design challenge. Regularly, each year, Apple introduces new innovative products on the market that are usually better compared to other computer and mobile companies in the market.

Emergence of Apple products year by year

- **In 1998 iMac debuted:** The first iMac was introduced in May 1998 with codename Columbus. It consisted of 256 MB RAM and a hard drive of 4 GB. It had macOS, which was introduced in 1997. This version of the iMac consisted of a 4 Mbps IrDA port and 56Kbps modem. It also had two 12 Mbps Universal Serial Ports (USB) as it's only means of external expansion, and it also included a newly-designed USB keyboard and mouse.
- **In 2001, the iPod was introduced:** The iPod was launched in October 2001 with codename Dulcimer. With this, Apple marked its appearance in the digital music market. It could give competition with both hard-disk based and flash-based players. It consisted of 32 MB of RAM
- **In 2001, iTunes Store was introduced:** It was just less than a year ahead of iPod. iPod was a hardware medium for the iTune, which turned the fortune of Apple around.
- **In 2007, iPhone was released:** It was announced in January 2007 and released in June in the same year; with iPhone, Apple marked its entry into the phone market. Steve Jobs defined it as a wide-screen iPod with hand controls and said that it is a revolutionary mobile phone and a breakthrough internet communications device. The iPhone was considered the first Apple-branded consumer device to run on OS X.
- **In 2008, the MacBook Air was released:** It was announced in October 2008, and

it was released late 2008. The MacBook (Aluminum, 13-inch) was powered by several features of the higher-end MacBook Pro (15-inch, Late 2008). In addition to the stunning new aluminum Unibody enclosure, the MacBook (13-inch, Aluminum, Late 2008) included a faster bus, faster graphics chipset, and a clickable Touch trackpad, which supported two, three, and four-finger gestures.

- **In 2010 the iPad was introduced:** Apple introduced the iPad as the first device in a thoroughly new market segment, with the claim that it will be better for many processes compared to traditional laptops or smartphones. The iPad imported specially redesigned adaptations of the standard suite of iPhone applications and redeveloped them from scratch to take advantage of the increased processing power and screen real estate.

They focus on examining the foundational principles of intelligence that include efforts to resolve the mysteries of human intelligence and use this knowledge to form a more general, flexible AI. Microsoft Research AI pursues the use of machine

intelligence in different ways to enable people, organizations, and systems that deliver new expertise, with capacities that help them to be more efficient, occupied, and productive.

At Microsoft, researchers think of AI as a set of technologies that allow computers to understand, learn, design, and support in decision-making to resolve problems in ways similar to humans. With these abilities, computers are now more responsive compared to the past, when they could only follow pre-programmed instructions.

Long ago, Microsoft Researchers interacted with computers through a command-line interface. Moreover, while the graphical user interface was a significant step forward, they started interacting with computers just by talking to them. 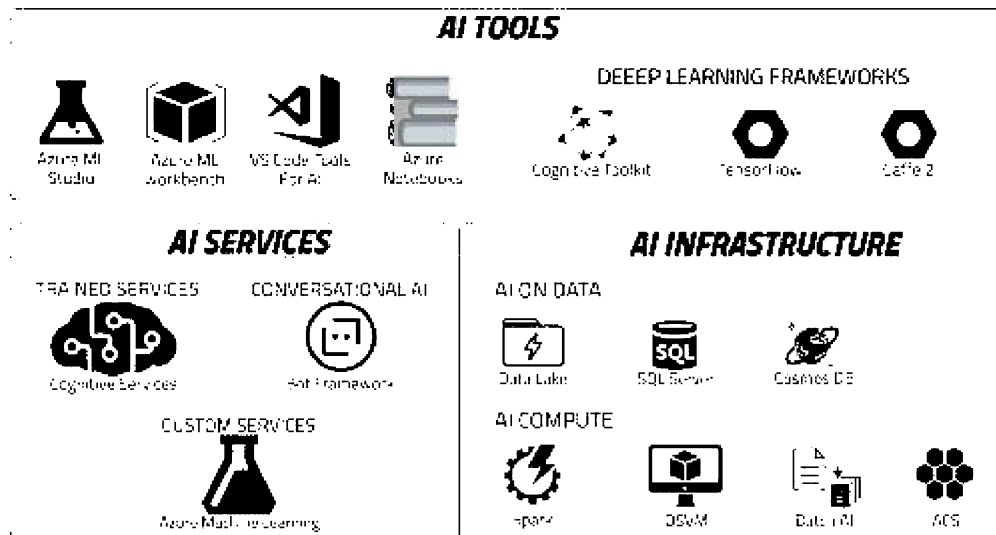


Figure 9.1: Microsoft AI platform stack

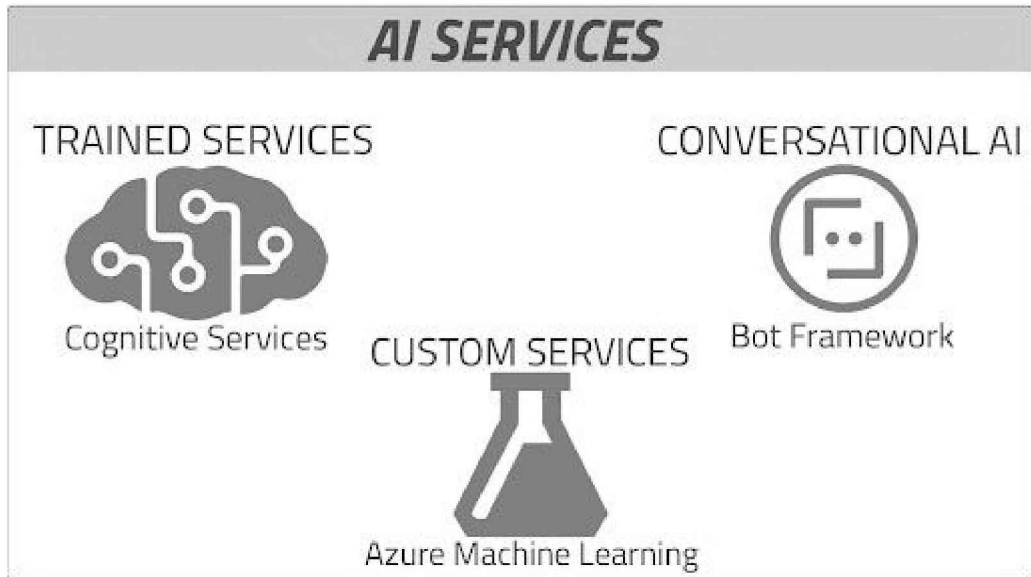


Figure 9.2: Different AI Services

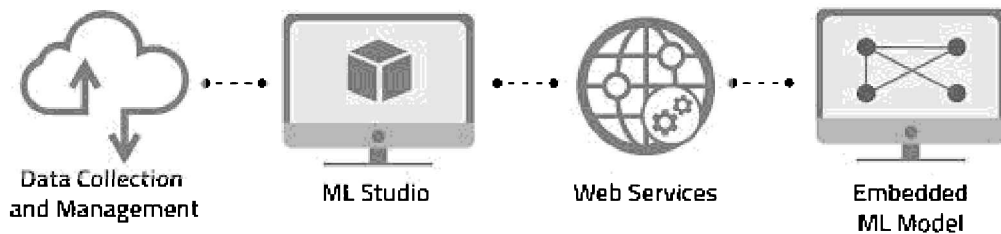


Figure 9.3: Steps in Azure machine learning services

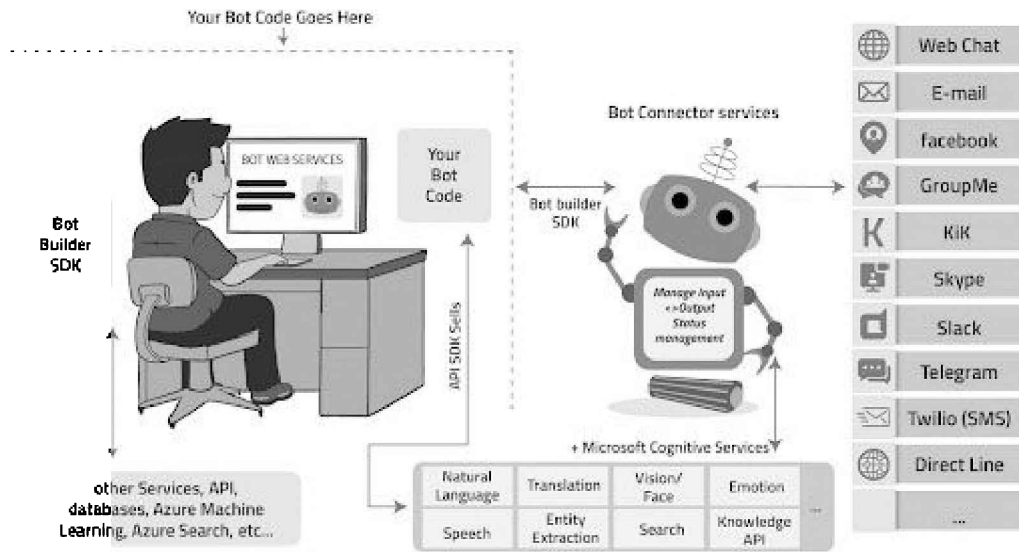


Figure 9.4: Complete architecture of Bot Framework

AI infrastructure

Microsoft supports the power of virtually constant scale AI infrastructure along with integrated AI services. The following diagram shows the subcomponents of AI infrastructure:

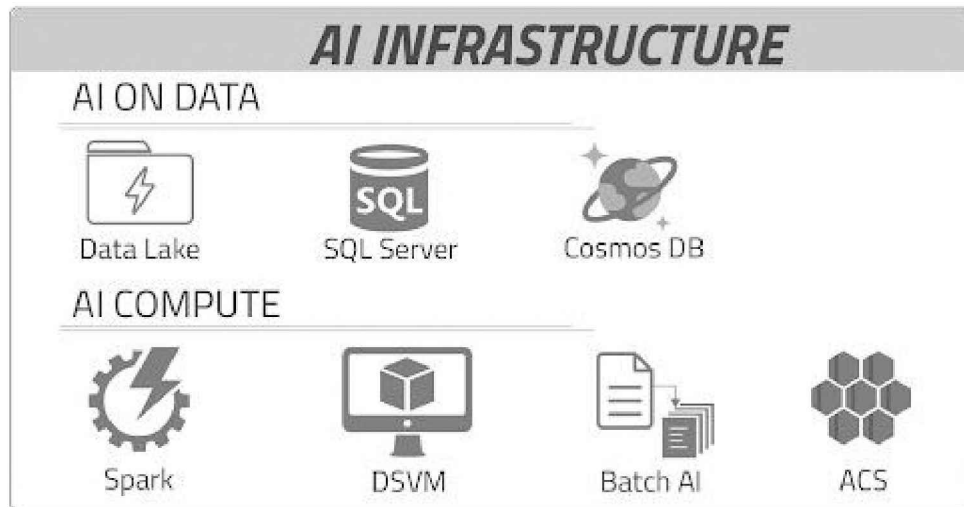


Figure 9.5: AI Infrastructure and its subcomponents

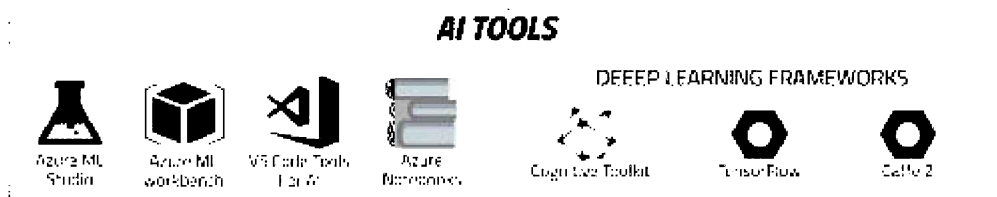


Figure 9.6: Different AI tools under Azure

Deep learning framework

AI platform stack maintains a vast array of deep learning frameworks that include MxNet, Cognitive Toolkit, Caffe2, TensorFlow, Chainer, Torch, Scikit-learn, and so on.

DL is affecting everything from healthcare, manufacturing to transportation. Businesses are using deep learning to solve difficult problems, such as image classification, machine translation, object recognition, and speech recognition.

Over the last five years, DNNs are AI models that have achieved widespread use. These neural networks surpass in feature creation automatically and process complex data types like text, images, audio, and videos. Common business use cases for DNNs are as follows:

- Determining whether uploaded audio, video, or text file contains some improper content
- Understanding a user's intent from their expressed or typed input
- Recognizing objects or people in a still image
- Translating speech or text from one language to another

Unfortunately, DNNs are considered among the most time and resource-intensive machine learning models. Applying a DNN to a single file may take thousands of milliseconds, and this processing rate is insufficient for some business needs. They provide a cloud machine learning (ML) platform and AI based cloud services like powerful text analysis, original language, computer vision, robust speech recognition, fast dynamic translation, smart search, and in-depth knowledge. AI is one of the powers of the new cloud computing generation. In this section, we will discuss AI capabilities in cloud computing, in the form of cloud ML platforms and AI cloud services:

- Google cloud machine learning platform is a fast, large-scale, and straightforward to use machine learning service. It provides advanced ML services, with pre-trained models and services to generate models.
- Google Cloud Vision API empowers developers to integrate vision detection features within applications easily. Features include image labeling, face detection, optical character recognition, and tagging of content.
- Amazon machine learning is a service that makes it easy for developers to use ML technology. Amazon machine learning provides visualization tools that help in the process of creating ML models without learning complex ML algorithms and technology.
- Microsoft Azure machine learning is a fully managed cloud service that lets developers build, deploy and share predictive analytics solutions. At Microsoft, the primary aim is to develop AI systems that will enable people to address local and global challenges.

Nowadays, AI enables faster and more significant progress in every field of human effort, and it is essential to allow the digital transformation. Every goal of a business or organization like engaging with customers, transforming products, optimizing operations, and empowering employees can benefit due to this digital transformation.

Providing adequate healthcare at a reasonable cost is one of society's most constraining challenges. AI can help in analyzing extensive amounts of patient data, identifying hidden patterns that can help toward better treatments, identifying new drugs or vaccines, and unfastening the potential of personalized medicine based on in-depth genetic analysis.

AI can transform how physicians diagnose diseases and improve health care. Machine

reading can help physicians find relevant information in thousands of documents quickly. With this capability, it can help medical professionals spend more time on more significant work.

Providing safe and cost-effective transportation is another crucial challenge where AI can play an outstanding role. AI-controlled driverless vehicles can prevent accidents, improving traffic flow, and reducing carbon radiations, thereby saving thousands of lives and money every year. Here are examples of deep learning and AI:

- **Deep learning improves medical image analysis for clinicians:** AI systems help people to tackle significant problems. An excellent example is **InnerEye**, an AI based project developed by researchers at Microsoft that can treat cancer more effectively. InnerEye uses AI technology to analyze CT scans and MRI and helps physicians to treat cancer more quickly. Scans allow physicians to look deep inside a patient's body in 3D and study anomalies, such as tumors. For cancer patients who are undergoing radiation therapy, physicians use scans to tell tumors from the surrounding healthy tissues, bones, and organs. So, this technology helps to focus radiation on the tumor while avoiding the surrounding healthy parts as much as possible. To build Inner Eyes automatic segmentation, researchers used hundreds of CT and MRI scans. The reports were fed into an AI system and trained to recognize tumors. With further advances in the future, InnerEye may be helpful for mapping and tracking tumor that changes over time, and also able to assess whether a treatment is working.
- **AI helping researchers prevent disease outbreaks:** Another impressive example is Project Premonition. In recent years, we have seen the tragic stories of lives lost due to dangerous diseases like dengue that are transmitted from animals and insects to humans. At times, Epidemiologists are not even able to detect the emergence of these pathogens. Scientists and engineers at Microsoft researchers are exploring ways to detect pathogens in the environment, enabling health officials to prevent transmission even before an outbreak begins. Researchers use autonomous drones that are capable of operating through complicated environments to identify areas where mosquitoes breed. Further, they use robotic traps that differentiate between pathogen carrying mosquitoes and other insects, by analyzing wing-movement patterns. Once the samples are collected, advanced AI-based systems recognize the pathogens carried by mosquitoes. In the past, this kind of analysis took several months, but now with the AI capabilities of Project Premonition, this takes about 12 hours.

- **AI helps people with low vision:** Another domain where AI has the potential to have a substantial positive impact is in serving more than a billion people in the world with disabilities. A Microsoft platform called Seeing AI that is available in the iOS app store can support people struggling with blindness and low vision. The platform was developed by an engineer who lost his eyesight at seven years of age. This powerful app shows the potential of AI; it can help people with disabilities by capturing images from the user's surroundings and immediately describing the happenings around them. For instance, it can read menus and signs, identify products through barcodes, interpret handwriting, count currency, depict scenes, and identify objects. This application can be helpful during a meeting; it can tell the user that there is a man or a woman sitting across the table along with the sentiments of that person, that is, whether the person is smiling, sad, or paying close attention.
- **AI helps farmers to be more productive and increase their crop yield:** As the population of the world is expected to grow by nearly 2.5 billion over the next century, sufficient availability of food has become a matter of concern. AI offers essential opportunities to farmers that help them increase food production by improving agricultural yield and reducing waste. For instance, the **FarmBeats** project uses advanced AI technology and the power of the cloud to empower data-driven farming facilities at a low cost. This helps farmers with easily interpretable insights that help them improve crop yield by lowering overall costs and reducing the environmental impact of farming.

Microsoft business model

Microsoft generates revenue by developing, improving, licensing, and supporting a broad range of software products. They offer various services that include cloud-based services to businesses and consumers. They design and manufacture devices that integrate with its cloud-based services and deliver appropriate online advertising to a global audience.

Microsoft customers mostly include individual consumers, organizations, and application developers. Individual consumers make their own decisions to buy the devices they use. They obtain Microsoft products through distributors and resellers. Revenue is generated from individual consumers, office consumers, devices, gaming, and licensing of the Windows operating system.

Microsoft serves organizations of several sizes, including small and medium-sized

organizations, large global enterprises, public sector enterprises, internet service providers, and various academic institutions. The company offers license programs, consulting services, enterprise-wide support, and several other specialized services to the organizations.

Microsoft generates revenues from organizations by voluminous licensing of the Windows operating system, dynamics business solutions, enterprise services, server products and services, and advertising. The company also makes revenues from application developers, developer tools, and by training and certifications on various Microsoft products. Creating an active developer community is an essential goal of the Microsoft business model. This helps them to build platform-based ecosystems that are beneficial for network effects among application developers and users. The network effects benefit from accelerating growth and creating a substantial competitive advantage.

The following diagram shows the elements of the Microsoft business model. It shows how the money flows in and out from the different customer segments:

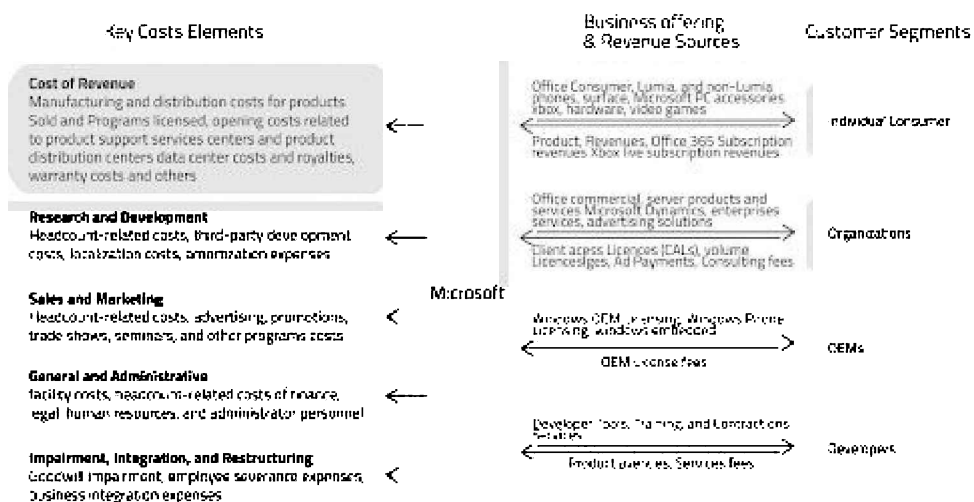


Figure 9.7: Microsoft business model

Microsoft's most significant expenses include employee remuneration, designing, building, retailing, and selling various products and services, data center costs in support of cloud-based services, and income taxes. The details of the critical cost elements are as follows:

- **Cost of revenue include the following:**
 - Manufacturing and distribution costs for goods sold and businesses

licensed.

- Operating expenses associated with product support service centers and distribution centers.
- Costs incurred to incorporate software on PCs and drive traffic to its websites.
- Expenditures incurred to give support and maintain internet-based products and services that include data center costs and royalties.
- Inventory valuation adjustments.
- Warranty costs.
- Expenses associated with the delivery of consulting services.
- **Research and development expenses include the following:**
 - Payroll, stock-based bonus expense, employee benefits, and other expenses associated with product development.
 - Localization costs incurred to translate software for international markets.
 - Third-party development and programming costs.
 - The reimbursement of purchased software code.
- **Sales and marketing (S&M) expenses include the following:**
 - Costs of advertisements, trade shows, promotions, seminars, and other relevant programs.
 - Payroll, stock-based bonus expense, employee benefits, and other expenses associated with sales and marketing personnel.
- **General and administrative expenses include the following:**
 - Legal, facilities, specific human resources, and other administrative personnel.
 - Individual taxes, legal, and other administrative fees.
 - Payroll, stock-based bonus expense, employee benefits, and other expenses associated with general and administrative personnel.
- **Impairment, restructuring and integration expenses include the following:**
 - Costs associated with the deterioration of goodwill and hypothetical assets linked to Microsoft's phone hardware business.

- Systems incorporation and business integration expenses related to Microsoft's takeover of Nokia's devices and services business.
- Employee division expenses.
- Expenses associated with the incorporation of facilities and building operations related to restructuring exercises.

Microsoft business segments

Microsoft operated the business in five segments: Online Services Division, Windows Division, Microsoft Business Division, Server and Tools, and Entertainment and Devices division. These segments provide management with a complete financial view of the business.

The segments enable the arrangement of strategies and objectives beyond the regular division of development, sales, marketing, and services organizations. They also provide a framework for appropriate and balanced allocation of development, marketing, sales and services resources in businesses. These business segments are discussed in the following diagram:

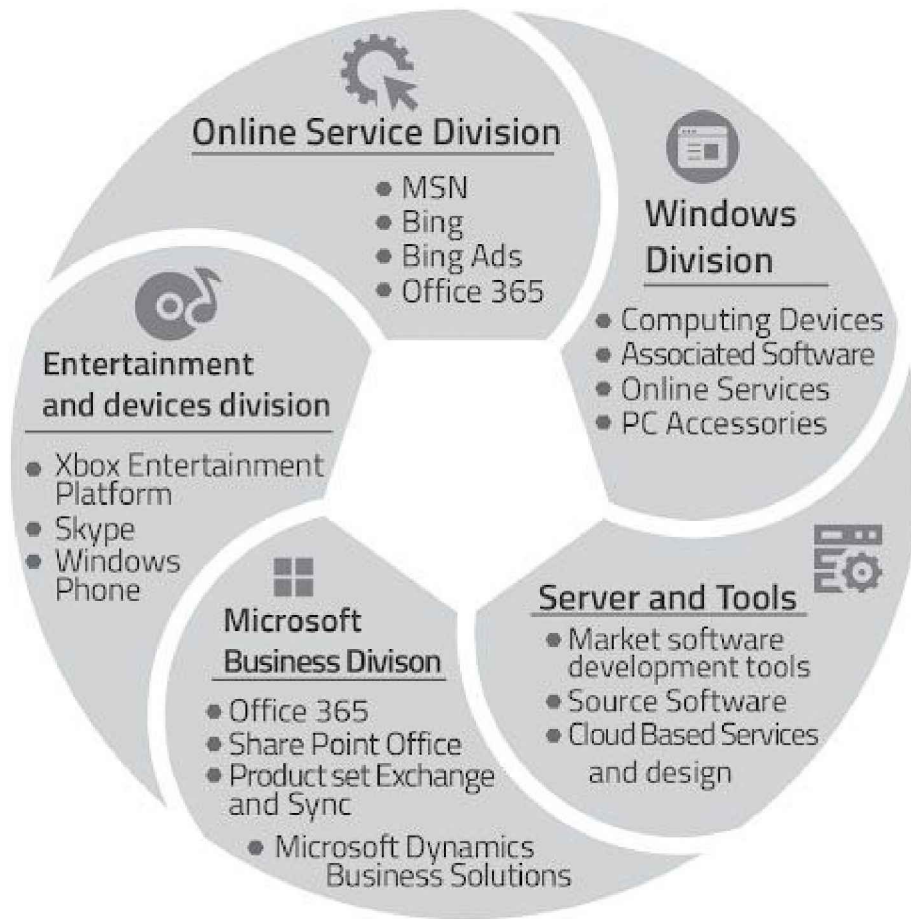


Figure 9.8: Microsoft business segments

Let's discuss them one-by-one:

- **Online service:** The Online services division develops content and markets information to help people simplify tasks and make well-informed online decisions. It also allows advertisers to connect with audiences. Online services division offers include MSN, Bing, and Bing Ads. Microsoft also provides an independent algorithmic and funded search platform for websites worldwide. Bing and MSN make revenue through the sale of exploration and display advertising. Microsoft Bing is more than a standalone search engine now, and it has been integrated with new Microsoft products, such as Windows 8, the new Office, Xbox 360, and Windows Phone to intensify those offerings. They also plan to incorporate Bing into the product and service portfolio.
- **Window:** The Windows segment produces and markets **operating systems (OS)** for computing devices, associated software, online services, and PC accessories.

This group of software, hardware, and services is intended to authorize individuals, businesses, and associations to explain everyday tasks in regards of the hardware and software. The revenue growth of the Windows segment was proportional to the growth of computing devices in the global market. Currently, around 65% of the total Windows segment revenue originates from Windows OS. Windows OS is purchased by original machine manufacturers who pre-install the OS on their devices. Apart from the market volume of computing devices, Windows revenue is influenced by the following:

- The generation of different computing devices that emphasize mainly on the functionality of touch and mobility.
 - Attachment of Windows with the devices that are shipped.
 - Device market changes inspired by transformations between developed markets and developing markets along with consumer devices and business devices.
 - Variations in inventory levels within the original equipment manufacturers channel.
 - Changes in price and promotions that happen when the manufactured devices transfer from local system builders to large, multinational **original equipment manufacturers (OEMs)**.
 - Sales of packaged software.
 - The demand of industrial customers for voluminous licensing and software support.
- **Server and tools:** This includes market software developer tools, server software, cloud-based services, and solutions that are designed primarily to make software developers, IT professionals, and their systems more productive and useful. Microsoft provides on premise software and cloud-based offers to bring together the advantages of traditional on-site offerings with cloud-based services. Server software is a combined server infrastructure and middleware that is designed to support software apps developed on the Windows Server operating system. This server software includes the server platform, business intelligence, database, storage, virtualization, management and operations, security, service-oriented architecture platform, and identity software. Server and Tools also make standalone and software development lifecycle tools for software architects, testers, developers, and project managers. Services can be

run onsite at a partner-hosted environment or a Microsoft-hosted environment. Cloud-based services of Microsoft consist of a scalable OS with computing, database, storage, and management, along with complete cloud solutions, from which customers can build, deploy, and manage business workloads and web apps. These services also constitute a platform that helps developers create and connect applications and services on premise or in the cloud. The primary goal of Microsoft is to empower customers to give more resources for the development and usage of applications that profit their businesses, instead of managing on-premises hardware and software. Almost 80% of server and tool's income comes from product revenue, which includes purchases by licenses sold to OEMs, volume licensing programs, and retail packaged products.

- **Microsoft business:** Microsoft business segment contributions consist of the Microsoft Office systems like Office 365, SharePoint Office product set, Exchange, Lync, and Microsoft Dynamics business solutions, which may be delivered on premise or as a cloud-based service. Microsoft office is designed to increase organization productivity through a variety of programs, software solutions, services. It contributes over 90% of Microsoft business division's revenue. Growth of Microsoft Office depends on the capacity to add value to the Office product set and to continue to increase product enrichment in many other areas like enterprise search, content management, unified communications, collaboration, and business intelligence. Microsoft Dynamics products offer business solutions for supply chain management, financial management, customer relationship management, and analytics applications for start-ups, mid-size businesses, large organizations, and divisions of global companies. Around 85% of MBD revenue is produced from sales to businesses which include Office revenue created through volume licensing agreements subscriptions and Microsoft Dynamics revenue. Income from businesses commonly depends upon the number of licenses instead of the number of PCs sold in a given year. Almost 15% of MBD revenue is obtained from subscription sales, retail packaged products, and OEMs. This revenue is affected by the volume of PC purchases, the transformation in subscription-based licensing, and product launches.
- **Entertainment and devices:** The Entertainment and Devices division develops and exchanges products and services intended to cherish, entertain and connect people. The Xbox entertainment platform includes Kinect that is designed to give a unique range of entertainment options with the use of devices, content, peripherals, and online services. Skype is designed by Microsoft to connect

family, friends, clients, and colleagues. The Windows Phone is designed to take users closer to the applications, people, and the content they need by providing unique abilities like Microsoft Office and Xbox LIVE. Through strategic collaboration, Windows Phone and Nokia are simultaneously creating innovative mobile products and services and spreading them to distinct markets. Entertainment and devices division revenue also include revenues from licensed mobile-related patents.

Conclusion

With Windows, Microsoft raised itself to the next level in the late 90s and early 2000s, but after the emergence of AI, the next challenge was to provide different products and services with empowered with AI. Microsoft is also catching up in the race of AI with products such as XBOX and services like Office 365. Also, they are using more AI in computational devices and software services offered to customers. It is pretty clear now that Microsoft is reviving itself using AI.
