

ABSTRACT

Interpersonal communication in the relationship between parents and children has a very important role, as it is well known the function of interpersonal communication is to understand yourself and someone and the message conveyed can be received well and have feedback, therefore it is important in a working mother's relationship with her children to know how interpersonal communication that is built between mother and child can run well or not. Know what obstacles occur in the continuity of interpersonal communication in the relationship of working mothers with their children. This study uses qualitative methods with a paradigm carried out by researchers using an interpretative paradigm with Five Interpersonal Communication Attitudes according to DeVito. Data collection techniques are carried out by observation, interviews and documentation results. The data analysis technique used by the author is the Sugiyono model with data reduction activities, presentation, and drawing conclusions. Based on research data shows that interpersonal communication that occurs in the relationship of working mothers with their children runs well including five positive attitudes in interpersonal communication such as, openness, supportive attitude, empathy, positive attitude and equality. The barriers that occur in interpersonal communication between working mothers and their children are more technical barriers where mothers and children when long distances often occur unwanted connections, and time obstacles that often occur.
