

REDESIGN OF INTERIOR OFFICE OF BPK REPRESENTATIVE OF PROVINCE NORTH SULAWESI USING CONNECTIVITY, SPACE PLANNING, AND HIERARCHY APPROACH

ABSTRACT

The Office of the Audit Board of Indonesia (BPK) as a state financial supervisory institution requires a working environment that is not only efficient and ergonomic but also reflects the values of integrity and institutional identity. The BPK Representative Office of North Sulawesi faces several issues, including limited space due to increasing staff numbers, resulting in not all employees having their own work desks; furniture layout and design that do not fully support employee comfort; inefficient circulation in public areas; VIP guest transition paths that still pass through the Head of Representative's workspace; and the absence of clear boundaries between public and private zones. This study aims to redesign the office layout with a design approach that prioritizes connectivity between spaces, clear application of spatial hierarchy, and optimization of unused space and adequate storage provision. Methods used include observation, interviews, documentation, literature review, comparative study, and precedent study. The results of the analysis serve as the basis for an interior design that supports employee comfort and productivity while strengthening the institution's identity and professional image. Recommendations emphasize clear zoning, use of modular furniture, improved accessibility and guest circulation, and addition of facilities supporting employee welfare. With this approach, the redesigned BPK office is expected to create a functional, representative, and institutionally aligned working environment.
