The results indicate that married couples in LDM can maintain relationship harmony through goal alignment, open communication, emotional management, and creativity in their interactions. Although distance poses a significant challenge, informants interpret it as an opportunity for self-reflection and personal and relational growth. The success of an LDM relationship depends on both parties' awareness and commitment to consistently maintaining emotional closeness.
