Through this redesign, the museum is re-presented as a space that can not only be seen, but felt and experienced. Elements such as thematic lighting, background sound, material texture, and circulation rhythm are combined to create an atmosphere that establishes a connection between visitors and the historical narrative. By doing so, the museum becomes more than just a place to store artifacts, it becomes a space that evokes a personal experience of Jakarta's journey.
